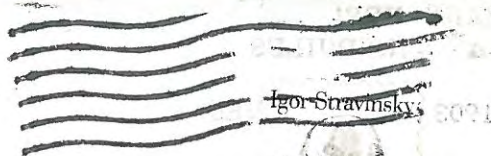

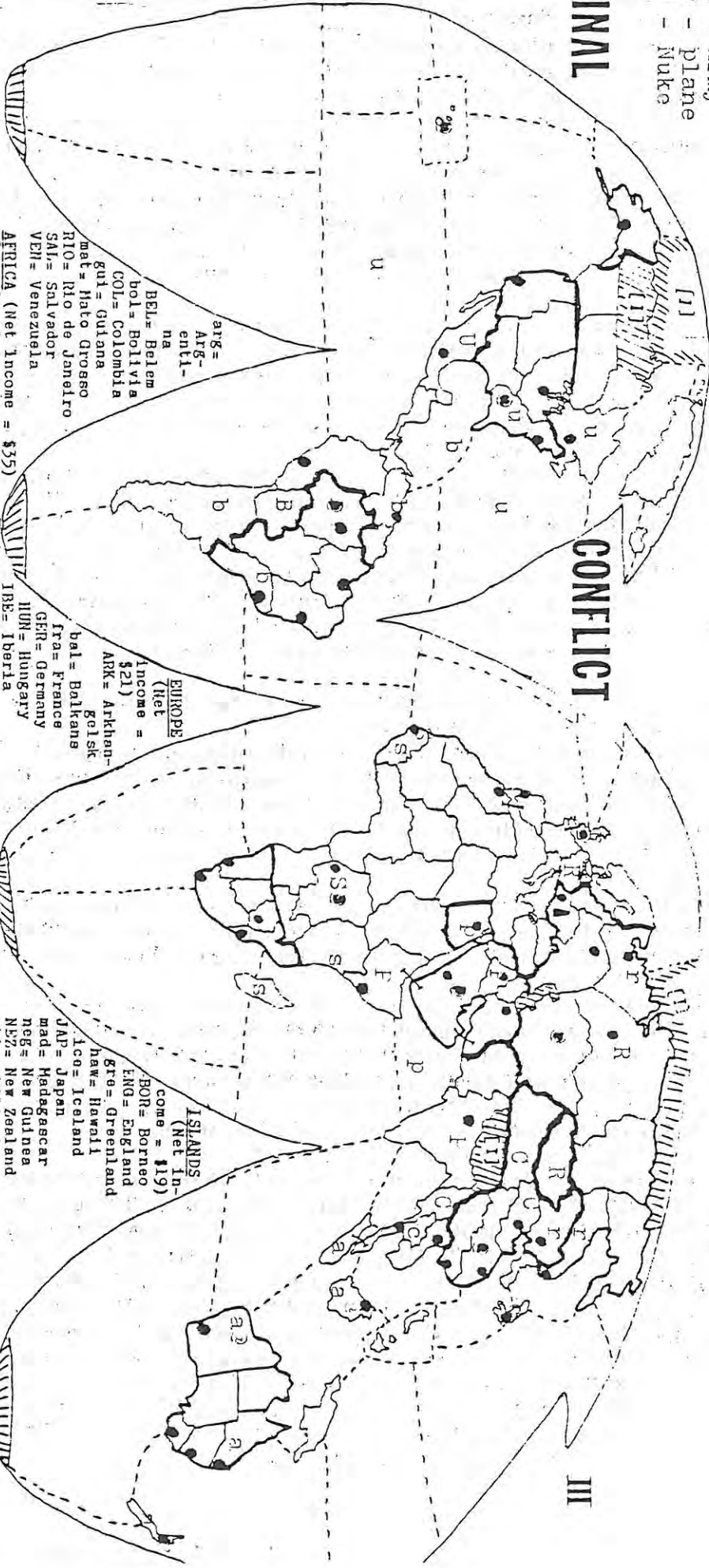

LE GOSSIFE PARISIENNE

BIC RETIRES...STRAVINSKY KILLED IN ACTION...ST ROBES JOINS INDEPENDENTS...ARMY LOOKS BAD IN THE FIELD BUT BEZUKHOV SHINES PARIS(GP) General Bic has decided to retire to the country saying, "The army has proven my loyalty and abilities with their fine efforts over the last year and I feel that I may step down from my positions with pride in a job well done and live the life of a simple French farmer among my grapes". The general generously donated half of his fortune to the King in the country's time of need. It appears that General Bicis already missed in the ranks as the Frontier and Royal North Highland Border Regiments under the leadership of such worthy commanders as Lt. General LeMoyne and Lafayette respectively had very poor luck in the field. The one bright spot was the performance of a battalion of the Royal Foot Guards under the command of the usually unfortunate Major Bezukhov which saved the Frontier Regiment from great embarrassment with a brilliant charge to breach the wall of the town under seige. When the battalion finally returned to their own lines M. Bezukhov appeared burdened with many large sacks which, he assured his commander, contained potatoes for his basttion's supper. One sad note from the front concerns the passing of new recruit Alexi Strvinsky who, in attempting to reprimand a horse upon who he had apparently bet heavily in an impromptu horse race and lost, was stomped to death by the eqine in question.

Meanwhile back in Paris the fortunes of the Independent Party took a decidedly upward turn when the young firebrand St Robes joined their ranks. It is said that upon signing his name to the register he declared "I intend to be director of this party!", to which the current Director responded, "well young man we shall see how the majority vote in January" to which, M. St Robes was heard to declare, "Hang the majority, let the best man rule!". Earlier in the season The aforementioned St Robes had marched in the office of the Division Commander demanding to be named adjutant and upon learning that an adjutant had already been appointed for the year stomped out shouting, "Ability will win out over privilege, influence and the other trappings of this decadent feudal society which shall be swept into the rubbish heap of history!". M. St Robes then joined Bothwell's and spent the rest of the season drinking himself silly at that club.

Also denied positions this season were Messrs. LeMoyne, who was told that to gain a government position it was necessary to return from the field for a change and spent a week sitting on the doorstep of whoever appoints one to the desired position before it can be procured, and Bezukhov, who was simply told he could not have the job. At one point, when he was well in his cups he was heard to declare "Will someone please hold that wallpaper still while I make a toast to the provider of tonight's festivities. Why a man such as that would wish me to murder a fellow General, I have no idea, nor have I any intention of doing that, or any other treasonous act...but his mood is good."

This publication has been and continues to be an endeavor of THE CONNECTICUT GAME CLUB, published by its members as a hobby to promote gaming everywhere.

Fenisque C. Perceival's expedition meets with a setback during his first turn in Africa. He discovers that 20 rations sold to him by an outfitter were bad. Eager to prove his hunting skills, he proceeds to track game after making camp in hex 161, which is a jungle hex. He manages to find an elephant herd. His hunters provide the expedition with one ration each.

LADY CAROLINE NELSON decides to remain in hex 574 before moving on. Her hunters provide the expedition with 2 rations each.

ALFRED H. MCGUFFIN remains imprisoned in Launda. Portuguese officials are demanding that a \$1000 fine be paid for the release of McGuffin.

DR. NOTS G. NIVIL follows the river down stream in hex 396, which is a veldt hex. The river flows in direction 6 into hex 378. He discovers nothing of value, not even a native.

DR. HYPO GUY CEMIA's BON-BON break is cut short by the attack of 40 cannibals in search of something sweet. The cannibals discover the good doctor not to be very friendly. In the battle the cannibals are driven off by but two Askaris. The good doctor was heard to yell "make my day!" The expedition moves into hex 110, which is a veldt hex. The good doctor believes that the desert will fill the terrain soon. His hunters provide the expedition with 2 rations each.

ORTEGO DE DAGO moves northeast into hex 590, which is a veldt hex. He discovers nothing of value. His hunders are unable to provide the expedition with any rations.

AUSTRIAN SPY ESCAPES ARMY DRAGNET - BRIGADIER, LEFT FOR DEAD, REVIVES AS SWEDES REPULSE IMPERIAL ARMY ASSAULT - TAFFYWACKER'S RIDE - MUSCOVITES SAY "NYET" TO ALLIANCE - NEW CHAP IN TOWN

A strange tale has reached this journal from the Continent. Col Miles Hendon, the Army Adjutant, is said to have laid an elaborate trap for Austrian master-spy, Count Pointercount, in an obscure Saxon wayside tavern. Hendon reportedly used bogus troop deployment reports to lure the Count to a meeting at the tavern. But as Scots troopers in mufti descended on the table where the two men were sitting, the spy emptied a large sack of golden double thalers on the floor. Hendon got off one futile pistol shot at

the fleeing Austrian before being engulfed in the melee over the gold, in which action, he was somewhat more successful. Cavalry patrols were unable to find the elusive Count, who is said to be slippery as a fox and sly as an eel.

Socialite Percy Taffywacker came out of the Blue's practice room the end of July and asked, "Isn't the regiment going on campaign this year?" On being told that the Expeditionary Force had left in April, Taffywacker shrugged and said, "Better late than never. Europe is just a boat ride away." Upon arriving at Grönningen, some 250 miles from the seat of war, Taffywacker was heard to ask his stallion, "Do you know what a gelding is?" He reached the Swedish camp three days later. Unfortunately, when Taffywacker suggested that his steed follow this feat with a "lustly charge upon the enemy" the poor beast collapsed and died, leaving the Colonel to watch the Scots Horse charge into action. (Later, Taffywacker was given the loan of a horse and A Troop of the Drummandrochit Dragoons.)

The battle, which Col Taffywacker watched from a convenient nearby dungheap, blew up in a vicious little squabble around the town of Webern, which some Hungarian Hussars approached the place in the mistaken belief the place was undefended. In fact, it was well defended by entrenched elements of the Irish Brigade. Before the day was over, both armies would pour reinforcements into the fight until the back of the assault was broken. Tilly's army is said to be falling back in good order upon Leipzig, and HM army will likely not see home before the end of October.

When the Irish Brigade rose up out of the trenches to counter-attack it was without its commander, "Fighting Fitz" O'Connor, who was left for dead with severe head wounds. But during preparations for the brigadier's funeral, one of the undertakers chanced to remark that Lieutenant General's honors were to be accorded, and even as the pipers were tuning up to play "Buchawn's Lament", O'Connor opened his remaining eye and said, "If it's to be Lieutenant General, I think I'll live." It is not known whether O'Connor, who is still in a badly wounded condition, will continue to lead the brigade. He may have to be carried into battle on a litter, and a friendly Jesuit has offered to arrange for the general to spend the Autumn at a Ligurian health spa.

NAVAL NOTES: The "dog days" are no time to find an admiral at the Admiralty, but it was an immaculate Lt Hornblower, clad in dress whites, who came by looking for one the end of July. Apparently, the lieutenant has some interest in being sent to Constantinople. A sympathetic Commander suggested he try the Foreign Office...Midshipman "Harry" Burke is said to have been put on report for doing acrobatics from the rigging with a cutlass in his teeth. "Just not done aboard the R.S., old boy," said the lieutenant who applied the discipline. (Observers gave Burke an 8.85.)

Diplomatic overtures to the Czar of Moskua have come to naught over the issue of Allied aid to the Turks. When one over-excited boyar began pounding on the table with his show, HM representatives decided it was time to return home. The ships carrying the delegation are expected back the end of September.

Dr. Llewellyn A Morgan's treatise "Recent Developments in the Treatment of Typhoid" has been published by a small Dutch press...Ens Mark Addlebury has been unable to find a publisher for "Bicuspid: the Sailor's Friend", although one printer offered to put up a run of 100 copies for a modest sum.

In addition to his research, Dr. Morgan spent a summer busy with professional and personal activities. The Welsh physician's waiting room was filled with patients, among whom was Lt Gen Crittenden, who experienced relief from a strange bone disorder. The Cambridge professor has also received permission from the Lord Mayor to build a sanatorium covering an entire block of Harley Street.

ROMANCE DEPT: "Mother told me not to fall in love with a sailor!" wailed faithful Nell on learning her beau Horatio Hornblower was seen escorting Lady Violet about town...Lady Sarah, meanwhile, was seen wearing an expensive ring, the putative gift of eccentric Cambridge professor Llew Morgan. No date has been set for the wedding, as the couple have been unable to agree on a location. The Lady wishes it to be at St Paul's Cathedral, while the doctor would prefer something a little more Anabaptist.

It appears the Paddy McBurkes do not allow their members to be hanged so easily. Five Deputy Sherriffs were hit by sniper fire during the executions. Two mutineers were also hit, but the Coroner managed to patch them together enough to allow them to be hanged properly. None of the assailants were captured.

UPCOMING EVENTS: The annual Blues and Buffs football match will take place the third week in October at Batsford Common...in an unheard of event, the Earl of Clyde will be buying all the Scotch Whiskey anyone could want for officers in HM armed forces above the rank of captain at the Cavendish Club, the first week in September. I reserve the right to tabulate or ignore ballots which do not follow the format outlined above.

THE EIGHTH ANNUAL NORTH AMERICAN GAMESMASTER POLL: You may rate any GM in whose postal game or games you were a player during the year beginning April 1, 1984, and under whom you played for long enough to gain an objective assessment of his or her competence as a GM. CHANGES AND OTHER NOTES PERTAINING TO THIS YEAR'S ANNOUNCEMENT:

Due to the turmoil surrounding the change of pollsters this year, I have attempted to keep procedural changes to a minimum. Nonetheless, we do have a few:

There is no "official" proclamation against grudge votes this year. As a voter, you may vote using any criteria that you deem fair and reasonable. Some people tend to ignore such a restriction anyway, as Randolph Smyth mournfully pointed out after last year's poll. So the restriction was unenforceable -- and in my opinion, unrealistic as well. That is, I believe that the quality of a zine (or the voters' opinions thereof, which is after all what the poll is supposed to measure) CAN be affected by the publisher's ethics or his stance regarding feuds -- the basis of most grudge votes, if you will. Vote as you see fit.

Anyone who has participated in the Diplomacy hobby since April 1, 1984 is eligible to vote.

I will be discounting the top and bottom 10% (as opposed to last year's 8%) of the votes cast for any given zine, subzine, or GM. This figure will be rounded down, so that zines (etc.) receiving fewer than ten votes will not be subject to this provision. I believe that Randolph applied this lopping-off procedure only to the zines last year; I'll be applying it to the subzines and GMs as well -- but only in determining the "averaging" scores, NOT in forming the preference matrix. Which brings me to...

The preference matrix. Randolph had initially planned to come up with a preference matrix for the zines last year, and generate two lists. This ended up not working out; this year I plan to draw up a preference matrix for zines only, and generate a score for each zine. The preference matrix scores will then be averaged with the zines' "averaging" scores to produce a single final list.

In addition to providing a second list of scores to be combined with the zines' mean scores, the preference matrix should prove to add interest to the poll results by itself, as it will be portrayed in graphic form. I have devised a formula which will translate a zine's raw score from the matrix to a number ranging from 0 to 10, so that the combining of the lists will be practical.

There may be other embellishments to the presentation of the results, depending on what I can dream up to make the final product more interesting to the readers. We'll see.

A few clarifications regarding specific publications and GMs: as mentioned in the GM poll announcement, be sure to distinguish between the two Ron Browns if you vote for either or both. Treat Whitestonia as a zine, Kathy's Korner as a subzine (to keep the status quo from years past.) The editor of Bad Doggie treats that product as a subzine even though it sometimes appears separately from the parent zine; therefore the poll will tabulate BD as a subzine. Ditto for Orphan City; treat it as a subzine.

The cutoffs for inclusion in the main lists will be the same as last year's: ten votes for zines, five for subzines and GMs. Zines which do not make the main list will not be included in the preference matrix.

A clarification to the rule that you must have seen more than two issues of a zine in order to vote for it: if you were supposed to see more than two issues of a zine but did not (i.e. because the publisher has not published regularly), then you may still vote for that zine. I can think of one or two "active" publications that fall into this category: sorry, guys, but being grossly irregular ain't gonna get you off the hook around here if the voters wish to send you a message...

The Conlon Arrangement: Voters who for any reason do not wish to send their ballots to me (Bruce Linsey) may send them instead to Pat Conlon, whose address appears with the announcement above. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE DEADLINE FOR BALLOTS GOING TO PAT IS A WEEK BEFORE MY DEADLINE. This is so that Pat will have time to transcribe the ballots and send them to me by the poll deadline. I will not know who voted how among those ballots received by Pat -- he will be copying them onto blank, unsigned ballots which will then be sent on to me. However, he will be providing me with a list of names so that I can 1) check to make sure no one voted twice, and 2) publish a list of all people who voted.

After the poll results are tabulated, I will be sending all of the ballots (or copies thereof) to Pat, who will verify the results if necessary.

For ease in voting, I suggest that voters use the official ballots which will accompany this mailing (and I'll be very grateful to those publishers who choose to print the ballots); but of course this is not required.

Any questions on the voting procedure should be directed to me.

The Runestone Poll is the oldest and most highly regarded of the Diplomacy hobby's polls. It is my intention to maintain this status by publishing the results accurately, impartially, promptly, and in a (hopefully) interesting manner. I ask each and every member of the hobby to do his or her part by getting out there and voting. May the best publications -- and GMs -- win!
