London-Vienna: Have your calls of "Hello" been answered? I trust not in the case of the Italian. After all, how can a guy named Vern Parker play a country as demanding as Italy, and expect to survive without writing. Too bad you're tied up with Turkey, because this looks like a clear case of having to take over another country in the interest of National Security. Ah, the joys of imperialism.

Serge-Vern: I think you should try another game, one which isn't so demanding as having to send in a set of moves and maybe write once in a while. How about Hopscotch?

George-Stan: Enjoy your assignment to the Middle East.

London-Ankara: Never let it be said, that I told you so. Greed, greed and greed, gets you into trouble every time.

George-GM: Just a question about the NMR insurance. Where does it go after these folks NMR out? And, maybe you ought to consider raising the ante.

GM-George: The NMR fees are used as an inducement to encourage players to submit all moves on a timely basis, and, if necessary to leave a game, to resign in an orderly fashion in accordance with HR19. Originally, I charged \$4 for a game fee, without any NMR fee, but some time ago, changed to a \$2 game fee and a \$2 NMR fee. This is, in my opinion, a form of a giveback for good sportsmanship. As such, any player who NMRs forfeits \$1 of the NMR fee with each NMR. I keep the money to offset the cost of the zine. Since I now have a new policy of having standbys play without cost to them (free issues, no game fee for a standby), perhaps I should raise the NMR fee in future games to help offset the costs of operating games with standby players.

George-GM: I would also like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank you for being so punctual, I really find that the most important aspect of a zine. Thanks.

GM-George: As a player as well as a GM, I agree that punctuality of publication is very important. That is why I endeavor to meet my publication deadline on a regular basis, above all else.

London-Moscow: Has the Pony-express between our two peace loving nations gone out of business? Or as you considering an attack? silence has a way of spawning that fear.

GM-PLAYERS: In accordance with HR13, a player who NMR's because his/her orders are received after the deadline, but whose orders are postmarked prior to the deadline may be granted one additional extension, provided all other players in the game agree. Accordingly, Vern Parker's orders, last season were received after the deadline, by which time he had been charged for an NMR, but the postmark was prior to the deadline (postmarked 5/16, due 5/18 ...an optimist, eh Vern?). Therefore, if all other players agree by voting yes to the question, "Should Vern Parker be given one NMR extension?", such an extension will be given. NVR will be counted as a YES vote. The purpose of this HR is to avoid removing a player who inadvertently NMR's because of late delivery of orders. This extension may only be granted once to a player during a game. Players are referred to HR10 to see recommended methods of avoiding NMR problems.

WINTER 1902 ADJUSTMENTS AND SPRING 1903 MOVES ARE DUE NO LATER THAN JULY 20, 1985. BECAUSE OF THE COMPLEXITY OF ADJUSTMENTS POSSIBLE, CONTINGENCY SPRING ORDERS BASED ON BUILDS AND DISBANDS ARE RECOMMENDED. GM-PLAYERS: Insufficient response has been received to my recent proposal to add a new rule (10.H). The vote will be carried over till next issue.

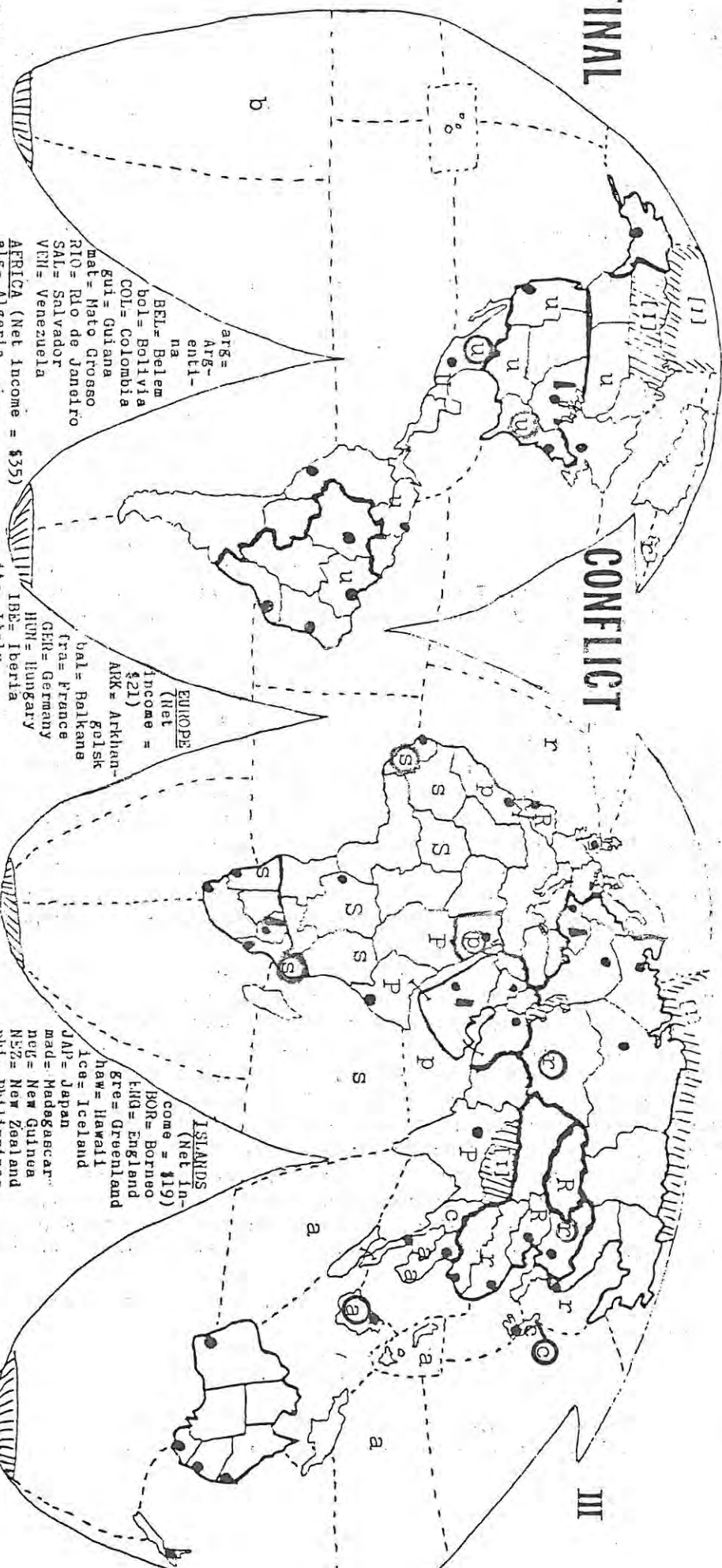

LONDON TATLER "ALL THE NEWS THAT FITS" SPRING 1632

WELSH PHYSICIAN'S STAR RISES IN COURT CIRCLES - INDIAN EXPEDITION RUMOURED - HENDON, PARKSBROW MARRY - SAN GIOVANNI BEATS VILLANUEVA

Dr Llewellyn ap Morgan, eccentric professor and noted Harley Street practitioner, was named Physician in Ordinary to the King in early April. The Welsh doctor was seen frequently at Whitehall successfully treating His Majesty for gout and a throat infection. Morgan was reportedly offered a baronecty, fueling speculation he would be offered a seat on the P.C. Strong opposition is expected, and Bishop Laud is said to have urged the Archbishop of Canterbury to "keep that (deleted) Puritan off the King's Council". A professional colleague said, "Gad! The fellow isn't even a member of the R.C.P.S.!"

LE GOSSIFE PARISIENNE

SUMMER 1620. ARMY OVERWHELMED BY AUSTRIANS...UNREST IN PROVENCES RUTHLESSLY SUPPRESSED...ARMS FACTORY DOES BOOMING BUSINESS...POLITICAL POWER SWINGS TO RICH MAN'S PARTY...MANY NEW FACES IN TOWN.

PARIS (GO): General Lafayette, the Minister of State, was prominent in both the clubs and political rallies this season. Seen frequently carousing and winning at the gaming tables of the Moulin Rouge and at the opera with the fair Elise, the Duke cut quite a fancy figure with his entourage of armed men which included, for the first two months of the season, Le Chevalier Poisson. The Rich Man's Party has regained it's advantage over the Independants whose fiery leader was away at the front, and M. Lafayette has taken full advantage of the situation by addressing crowds from his portable soapbox wherever he goes. It appears that he has attracted quite a faction who support his contentions that drastic changes need to be made at the highest levels of government. The fortunate Lafayette realized a tidy little profit from his recent purchase of the La Kaboom Arms Factory which supplied arms to all of the army this season. Although M. LeMoyne attempted to buy into the deal he saw no money from the venture as the army was being outfitted and the Arms factory was receiving payment even as his cheque arrived. General Lafayette capped an exciting season by announcing plans for an open party, to be held at his elegant quarters, in the second week of September. The Duke said, "Anyone who is anyone is sure to be there."

Three dashing adventurers arrived in Paris this season. M. Etienne Reynard, son of le Comte de Vulpes and another whose name remains a mystery immediately enlisted in the Royal Foot Guards and Cardinal's Guard respectively and went off to the front. The other arrival, M. Pierre Lapin, remained in Paris, winning the heart of Mlle. Isabelle with his fond attention and generally spreading money around generously. He was seen in church every week and is making it widely known that his heart is set on the religious life when his services are no longer required elsewhere.

AVIGNON (GP): Also concerning religious life, the Pope has not yet responded to the Bishops' request that he appoint a new Religious leader in Paris. The Cardinal continues to remain in seclusion at Avignon although a steady stream of visitors has been seen coming and going from his residence. M. Poisson, who has been under some suspicion from his party and his regiment, made his position clear at the beginning of the season by issuing a scathing denunciation of the Cardinal's Guard in general and M. de Fer, Colonel of that regiment, in particular saying, "If de Fer doesn't stop making ridiculous statements about me, I will be forced to pay him a 'social' visit." He continued saying, "The only sensible thing that has been done by that pack of jackels is convincing the King to send the Cardinal packing."

THE FRONT (GP): Despite the fact that the entire army but one Frontier Regiment went on campaign this season, they were scattered in total confusion by unexpectedly strong resistance from the Austrians. Were it not for a strong defense put up by the Horse Guards Brigade to cover the army's retreat the entire force might have been cut to ribbons. As it was there were many

casualties, including the Colonel of the King's Musketeers, the Lt. Colonel of the Cardinal's Guard and the Colonel of the Gascon Regiment. Several promotions and appointments were made to fill vacancies in many top military positions. M. Poisson was promoted to the Colonelcy of the King's Musketeers and appointed Army Adjutant of the First Army and M. Calais, who had recently joined the King's Musketeers was promoted to major and immediately purchased the open Lt. Colonelcy of that regiment. He will be attending L'Ecole de la Guerre this term. In the Cardinal's Guard, M. de Fer, Colonel of that regiment, has been promoted to Bvt. Brigadier General and named Brigadier of the Guards Brigade while an unnamed major has been promoted to Lt. Colonel of the Cardinal's Guard and been named Division Adjutant of the Cavalry Division. Another Adjutant appointed to the Frontier Division was Lt. Colonel St Robes of the Gascon Regiment. General Lafayette has been appointed Commander of the First Army and the newly promoted Bvt. General Le Moyne has been made Commander of the Second Army. Majors Bezukhov and Reynard of the Royal Foot Guards have been appointed Aide to General and Brigade Major of the Guards Brigade respectively. Col. Poisson, in addition, was wounded in action.

THE PROVENCES (GP): General Le Moyne, former Provincial Governor, led a Frontier Regiment against a band of farmers, merchants and peasants who were protesting what they felt to be unfair taxes, in a rather too robust manner. The General completely crushed all resistance and the mob returned to their farms and businesses and meekly complied with the tax levy adding a few extra crowns for the trouble they had caused the Governor.

And to top it off, you are the head of a treasonous political party which preaches rebellion and counsels cowardly appeasement of His Majesty's enemies. Before leaving Kilwa, Robert was seen purchasing a fancy pocket watch from a strange man in a back alley. Robert was heard to have said "you never know where you are going to find the best swiss watches." Next time, Robert Roberts begins his assault on the Rufiji.

FENISQUE C. PERCEIVAL moves in direction 1 into hex 110, which is a veldt hex. He is very upset because he can not find anything of interest to shoot. His hunters found only 1 rabbit each.

GUIDO VITTORIO SCONZINESE continues down stream into hex 248, which is a swamp

hex. In an act of extreme faith he walks out on the swamp to confront the chief of the Mauiti tribe and 75 warriors. The chief, surprised by the gaul of a white man in hugging him, gives the good Father 14 gifts in exchange for all SCONZINESE's worldly possessions. The natives listen respectfully as the good Father preaches the sermon in the swamp. He may buy canoes for 3 gifts each. One gift will purchase 5 rations, Askaris want 5 gifts to hire on, bearers want 4 gifts and guides want 5 gifts.

LADY CAROLINE NELSON walks into hex 575, which is a desert hex. She discovers a river flowing in direction 3 into hex 589. Unable to provide the expedition with any rations, she sits on the river pondering what to do next.

DR. NOTS G. NIVIL keeps following his river into hex 377, which is a veldt hex. The river flows into hex 357 (in direction 6). But before he is able to do anything, he is attacked by 12 warriors of the Tembo tribe. By some strange miracle, he is able to escape alone and continue to wander across Africa.

DR. HYPO GUY CEMIA pauses for a BON-BON break and remains in hex 111 this turn.

ORTE'GO DE DAGO gets lucky this turn. Before moving on he discovers a cache by the river with a canoe, 10 gifts and a musket. He decides to have his bearers pick up the canoe, gifts and musket and carry them with the expedition. He follows the river in direction 2 into 576, which is a mountain hex. Before I answer, I'd like to note that EXCELSIOR, issue #4, May, 1985, is a sharp looking new digest format zine, 24 pages, news, contests, and just lots and lots of interesting tidbits. Definitely one of the best new zines out recently.

Now, as I have previously published, I have been working on and off for some time, developing a series of DIPLOMACY adjudication programs, actually a "system" to assist me in running my own games. The language is BASIC, written for my TRS-80, Model III, 48K, 1-disk machine. As such, I am sure that it could be translated to C-64 BASIC, by anyone who is reasonably familiar with the language. Yes, I do use an algorithm, but it is not a single formula, as the term sometimes implies, but a series of complex logical constructs which review all of the orders, the positions of the pieces and applying the rules of the game, decide the results and record them for reference. In other words, the programs themselves are algorithms. As previously promised, I will once again publish the complete listings of these programs over the next few - er, many issues. There are four programs to my system, containing several thousand lines of code. A brief explanation of the four programs was given in the last issue and I won't bore you again with that, but beginning with next issue, I will begin the publication of these programs.

Let me mention one other new zine I have just received, IT'S A TRAP!, by Steve Knight, 11905 Winterhur Ln, #103, Reston, VA 22091. Issue #1, dated May 25, 1985, an amateur publication devoted to postal games and anything else the editor feels like. Subs are 50c+ postage per issue. Trades are not sought. By the way, Steve, I claim my one free issue under item 11. (How did you get my address, Steve?).

And one other mention. THE GAMER'S 'ZINE trades with a number of other publications, seeks trades on an all for all basis and will mention these trades from time to time.
