GM-PLAYERS: Proposed new rule (10.H) has not been unanimously accepted, therefore it is defeated.

Question: If I want to convoy a plane, can the plane fly out to a ship already in a sea zone (& basically land on a fleet, etc.)? What is the proper procedure?

GM: Planes are convoyed just like armies. See 6.5. Neither planes nor armies can stay at sea. The order sequence to convoy a plane is the same as for an army, however, remember that a plane cannot land in any province except a previously controlled, friendly province. (Ex. Orders to convoy a plane from NEW YORK to ENGLAND requires two fleets: p NEW-ENG, f NWA c p NEW-ENG, f NEA c p NEW-ENG.) There are no carrier fleets. Planes may neither take off nor land at sea, however, they can support fleets moving into or holding in a sea zone if they can reach it (within two provinces).

USA-AUS: Does Upa-Uaso foresee any nukes flying your way?

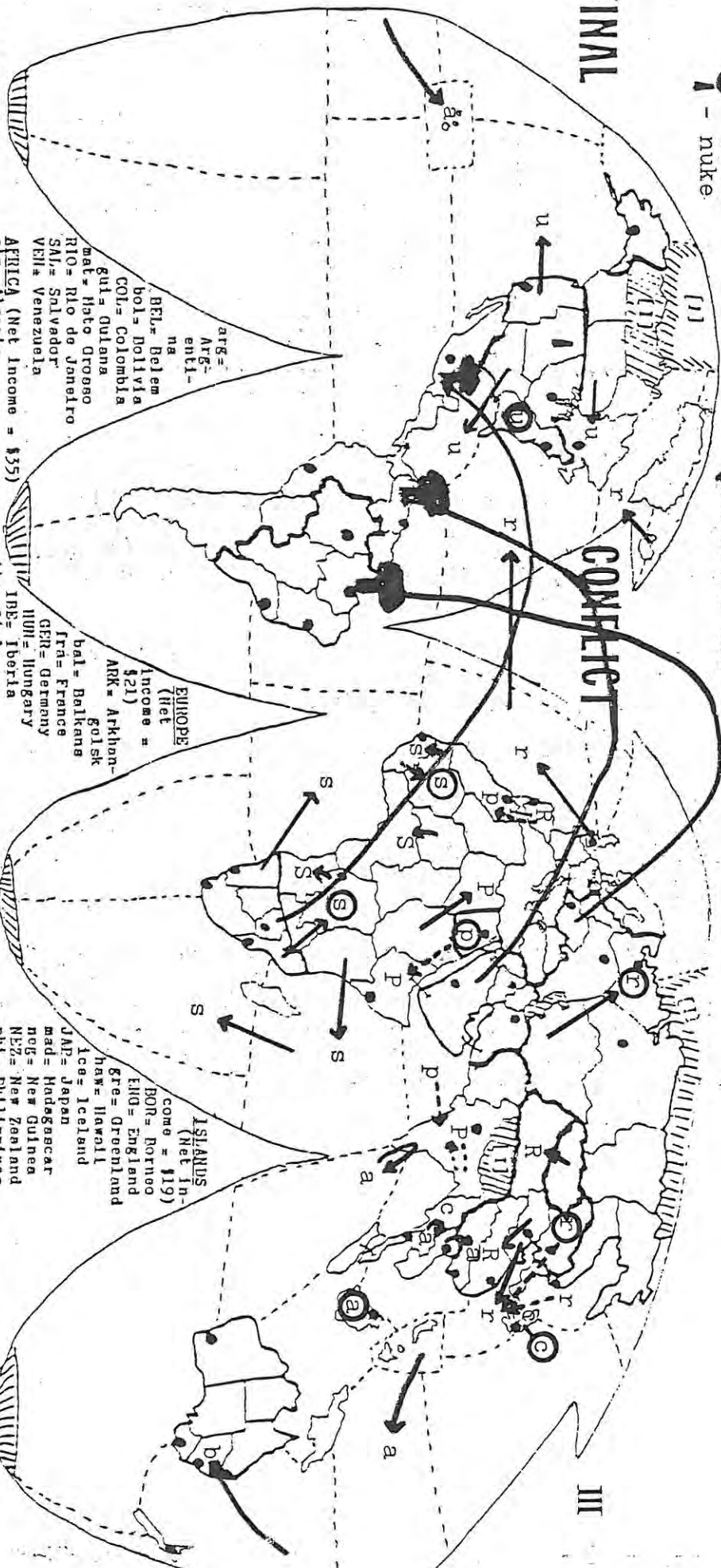

MORGAN PRIVY COUNCIL APPOINTMENT SPARKS FEUD WITH BISHOP - HENDON NAMES ARMY QUARTERMASTER - TURNER SLAIN IN POLISH FIGHTING - INDIAN FLEET SAILS - HIGHWAYMAN ARRESTED "JUST IN TIME" ON DOVER ROAD

The political star of royal physician Dr. Sir Llewellyn ap Morgan continues to rise, with his June appointment to the Privy Council. Rumour has it the Welsh Hippocrates will also be offered a peerage. But no sooner did Morgan become the first professed non-conformist P.C. in eleven years than he was heard loudly comparing the Bishop of London with Archbishop Tybalt, who was beheaded by rebellious Kentish Lollards in the Fourteenth Century.

Bishop Laud responded by denouncing Morgan from his pulpit at Lambeth as "a blood-thirsty atheist who has no business teaching at a Christian university, let alone advising the head of the Church of England." Shortly thereafter, Morgan took a leave from his teaching position at Cambridge. Cynics in court circles are said to be making book on whether Morgan will emigrate to Holland or the Plymouth Colony.

On a more prosaic note, Quartermaster Lt Gen Arlington Hathaway has stepped down to take a well-earned holiday in the south of France. His replacement, Brig. Miles Hendon, has just returned from an extended honeymoon in Paris. Apparently, the theory is that a job which drives a man to France can safely be given to one who has just been there. (Incidentally, Hendon was reported to have contemplated traveling to Rome for an audience with the Pope until his scandalized wife threatened to return to London alone.)

NAVAL NOTES: An abashed Harry Burke finally returned Mrs. Parksbrow's wedding ring, claiming to have been on a five-week bender. Burke has since transferred to the man o'war HMS St David, where the sea air on a cruise to India may sober him up... Cmdr. Horatio Hornblower, serving in the Ottoman Navy, has reportedly been reprimanded for illegally importing alcohol from Russia... Naval Surgeon Mark Addlebury has been named in a paternity suit, following the birth of a distaff son to Lady Rhonda Rhiannon.

OBITUARY: CAPTAIN F. JACKSON TURNER (1613-1632)

The Russians have lost yet another army on the plains of Poland and with it, British artillery officer Capt. F.J. Turner, who was killed during the rout at Smrb (rhymes with "cornflakes"). Polish dispatches report a "mad English giant" who killed the better part of two squadrons of curaiissiers before being overcome by sheer weight of numbers. True to the traditions of the Honourable Artillery, Turner stood by his guns to the last.

New PC Llew Morgan's call for a ban on the London Stage has been blunted by the revelation that the Fleet Theatre's June presentation of a seditious Irish play was, in fact, a trap set by the Justiciar's office for the notorious Paddy McBurkes. While sources in the constabulary report that only "small fry" were taken, some £1200 in gate receipts were confiscated as "evidence".

Immediately following the June meeting of the East India Company's Board of Directors, a fleet was dispatched to deal with the continuing problem of rebellious natives in the Bombay area. The fleet was placed under command of VAdm Richard Roe and consisted of men o'war HMS St David, HMS Royal Cook, HMS Golden Lion and HMS Fairy Prince; frigates HMS Furor, HMS Rogue, HMS Barracuda and HMS Frenzy; and corvettes HMS Galahad and HMS Conqueror. On board were two regiments of Irish infantry under command of Bombay Gouvernor Gen Sir Desmond Fitzgerald O'Connor.

Dragoons officer Justin Tyme was apprehended by Kentish militiamen lurking near the route of the mail coach on the Dover Road. Tyme, who was masked and armed, could give no coherent explanation for his presence. After a week in the Fleet Street Gaol, Tyme will face a trial before Judge Grouch, who may well sentence him to some heavy jail time. As the mail caache passed by unmolested, one arresting officer was heard to quip "we caught this fellow just in time."

LE GOSSIPE PARISIENNE

FALL 1620: CARDINAL RETURNS TO PARIS IN TRIUMPH...ANOTHER NEW FACE JOINS THE CARDINAL'S GUARD AND IS PROMOTED IMMEDIATELY...DANTON KNIGHTED AS STATUS SOARS...LE MOYNE APPOINTED TO CABINET IN VERY PRODUCTIVE SEASON...UNSPECTACULAR RESULTS FOR ARMY IN FIELD.

PARIS (GP): The Cardinal has returned to Paris and apparently to the King's good graces this season as in October the Cardinal's Guard was dispatched to Avignon to escort His Eminence back to the city where a battalion from the Gascon Regiment was deployed to make sure that no unfriendly elements were on the street to mar his return. It is reported that among those detained in the Bastille were the bishops who were instrumental in turning the King away from the Cardinal some months ago as well as a small contingent of visitors from the Balkans who appeared suspicious. The latter turned out to have been simple tourists and have been returned to their homeland but there has been no word on the fate of the bishops. Olivia meanwhile has given her heart to a new suitor, the enigmatic M. de Fer.

THE SOAPBOX: The King's popularity was re-established this month as the King's party regained dominance and gained two new members in M. Calais and M. Danton. The King celebrated his joy by announcing again plans for great Mardi Gras celebrations at the end of February. He will accept toadies of sufficient Social importance at the Moulin Rouge and directs all those who do not meet those requirements to Bothwell's where the Crown Prince will be entertaining. The usual contests will also take place that same week, the third of February. The following week, the last of that month, will include the great masked ball at the palace. Remember there will be prizes for the best costumes.

THE SALONS: Speaking of parties, the bash held by M. Lafayette last season was quite a hit. It is rumored that the Crown Prince lost his boots at the party and one wag said, "No doubt M. Lafayette is trying them on for size." Among those attending were Messrs. Calais, Danton, Lapin and Le Moyne. Shortly thereafter M. Lapin went on to join the Cardinal's Guard as a captain and was promoted to major while on campaign at the end of the season. "Ah me," sighed the new major, "it appears that I shall have to purchase two more horses to go with my valient M. Edmond."

M. Calais was able to get time off from his studies to attend the party. When asked why he wasn't out with his unit on campaign he replied, "they told me not to come back to the barracks until I'd learned how to fight. Why I was ready to show everyone how well I can use my blade at the Luxembourg at the beginning of the season but that coward St Robes spent his time hiding at his club behind a glass of brandy."

- IN EUROPE

The Boton Rouge Import Collective announced that the Reverend Rufus Bearueg Firefly would be dispatched to Africa. The retired Col., Louisiana State Guard has been h to open trade of, er...with the natives of Africa. The Col. believes that it is his duty to spread the doctrine of manifest destiny to unbelievers of the world. The Boton Rouge Import Coll... has arranged for passage of the Col. to Zannzibar. They have also provided the Col. with \$1000.00 to form an expedition. After a few days, the Col. found his way to one of the collective's ships and sailed from Boton Rouge under the cover of darkness.

- IN AFRICA

ALFRED H. MCGUFFIN returns to Africa. The Church of the Water(Unblended)... e. col.

me a moment while I go get a drink.. of Life decides to take the offer of the London Times, \$1000.00 and a ticket to Khartoum, after a near tragic incident at a lecture McGuffin was conducting to raise money. McGuffin became so carried away with his description of the Great White Ape, that he jumped down into the audience and started to attack people. No one was seriously hurt, but the Church decided that to have Alfred continue his lecture tour was not a good idea. McGuffin arrives in Khartoum this turn.

ROBERT ROBERT's army moves up the Rufiji river, hex 453 to hex 452. Hex 452 is a published veldt hex. Robert uses his swiss army watch to find the cache which he believes was left in this area by Humbert Humbert(may his soul rest in peace). The watch proves to be reliable, but it takes him several attempts to pinpoint the exact location of the cache. he discovers 20 gifts, and a small bag full of strange looking pieces of rock. He is elated at his discovery, but the elation is short lived. his expedition is attacked by a group of 16 scouts from a slaving party. In a fierce battle, Robert is victorious and takes on the main party of 12 men leading captives to Kilwa. He agains win the day, after a pitched battle, he frees the captives and is hailed as a hero, 12 victory points are his, if he returns to publish the account. his hunters each provide the expedition with 1 ration each.

FENISQUE C. PERCEIVAL moves into hex 137. He is again disconcerted because he can not find anything of interest to shoot.

GUIDO VITTORIO SCONZINESE must trade his 14 gifts for a canoe and 55 rations before moving on. He must also dismiss 8 bearers and 3 Askaris to continue on. He will do anything to do God's will, he explains to the men as he thanks them and moves on. He follows the river downstream into hex 272, dir 3, which is a desert hex. Before he can decide what to do, his canoe is swept over a 27 ft high cataract. Fate saves Guido and his men this time, as the canoe survives with all intact. His expedition is swept into hex 295, which is a veldt hex. As he pulls the canoe on shore to set up camp, a man clad in dark robes, backed by 53 warriors points at Guido and shouts something. (to be continued)

LADY CAROLINE NELSON leaves hex 575 travelling in direction 2 into hex 576, which is a mountain hex with peaks of 25,000 ft. A river flows out of the hex in direction 2 into hex 577. Her hunters provide the expedition with 3 rations each.

DR. NOTS G. NIVIL convinced that there are many natives to tell about his discovery of Europe decides to return to Europe. Therefore he follows the river farther downstream into hex 357, which is a lake hex. Fearing that this hex is impassible, he decides to attempt to cross it anyway, but gets lost and finds himself back in hex 377, where he began the turn.

DR. HYPO GUY CEMIA dismisses 10 bearers, before moving on. The Good Doctor is now beginning to believe that even Bon-Bons do not last forever. His expedition moves into hex 112, which he discovers is a swamp hex. Finding no natives, he is forced to retreat to hex 111. His hunters obtain 1 ration each, but no one starves. he still believes that he will breakout into the great African Desert soon and prove to the world that Africa is one large desert.

ORTE'GO DE DAGO gets lucky this turn. See Roxy Larue.

MADemoiselle ROXY LARUE lays all her worldly goods, including her clothes at ORTE'GO DE DAGO's feet. She says she will follow him anyplace in the world. Orte'go and Roxy head north, traveling in direction 1 into hex 564. Hex 564 is a jungle-mountain hex with the highest peaks being 18,000 ft. They discover no natives. Orte'go does not find any rivers into which to put his canoe. He must be satisfied spending his time with Roxy. His hunters provide the expedition with 3 rations each.
