GM(SPECIAL NOTE:) THE FOLLOWING LETTER ALERTED ME TO A PROBLEM WITH THE PREVIOUS ISSUE:

(FROM GEORGE GRAESSLE)

I think you have a bug in your computer program! An error was made in "The Salamis" for last season, fall 1904.

I, Italy, should have two builds, while Russia should be plus one or plus two depending on A GAL retreat. I annihilated Russian Army Budapest with my move A Tri-Bud (A Ser S). You showed it successfully moving to Trieste and gaining a center. That as we all know can not be since I moved from Trieste to take Budapest. So, somewhere their(sp) lies(sp?) a little bug in your program...(signed) George

GM: Unfortunately, and most embarrassingly true! Not only a very LARGE bug, a very obvious error, but one which I did not even catch when I scanned the printed results. That is why I have reprinted the results above(Corrected, after correcting the program, of course), and also that is why I am only showing the Winter builds this turn. Spring moves for 1905 will continue with the next issue, with moves due AUGUST 23, 1986.

Thank you, GEORGE, for pointing out this error. It so happens, that I introduced the program bug when I changed some code two months ago to eliminated the MERRY-GO-ROUP problem, and to handle any combination of moves. However, it one situation, where two units

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go head-to-head, and the first unit adjudicated succeeds, the second unit was allowed to then move into the (now vacant) province. The error occurred only if the sequence in which the orders was resolved happened to be in a specific sequence, which, of course, did NOT happen during my testing. This was the first occurrence of this error, and it took about a 1/2 hour to find the logic error, which, once found, was corrected with one additional line of code, and retested OK.

By the way, I have added some additional capabilities, so now, retreats are also printed for each unit which must retreat, removing the necessity of my manually adding them to the printout as I had to do previously (vive-la-computer!)

Players orders on hand for SPRING 1905 will be used next time, unless you send me a set of changed or corrected orders.

This is the first of what I hope will be a permanent part of The Gamer's Zine. Each issue I will give some insight into new releases, do in-depth reviews, and provide hobby news and information.

This month I will highlight three new releases by Quarterdeck Games. These games are so new that I cannot give an in-depth review, but I can provide more information than is on the box cover.

The first game is Yamato. Yamato is a game of tactical fleet combat in the Pacific. It is printed in Japanese, with English translations. The box cover is a stunning view from a battleship that must be truly seen to be appreciated. The game retails for \$50.00, but the graphics typical of Japanese productions make it well worth it. It includes 608 counters and 6 mounted 21 1/2" x 8" mapsheets, as well as logsheets and data cards for each ship class. Jack Greene, head of Quarterdeck, reports playing a scenario (fictional) involving the Nagato and Yamato versus the New Jersey and Alabama. It lasted about an hour and a half with the only survivor being the Yamato with one hull box left out of seventy! A very bloody and playable game which should not sit on the shelf. Complexity is somewhat less that Iron Bottom Sound, another Quarterdeck game with which many are familiar.

Malaya and Burma (\$60.00 Ouch!) is another new Japanese import once again with top notch graphics. The price does not seem so formidable once you find out that there are three separate games inside: March on Burma, Race to Singapore and Fall of Singapore, each having their own mounted maps, 2 for Burma, 1 each for the Singapore games. There are 600 counters representing such diverse elements as anti-aircraft, engineers, anti-tank and airborne. The ground combat systems allows up to 3 attacks per phase. There is definitely a lot of game here!

Last but not least is Leopard II (\$60.00), which is modern tactical tank combat. There are data cards for each type of tank or weapon, and the rules cover different ammo types, turret rotation, penetration power, anti-tank devices and crew ability. The cover art is like those of MRC-Tamiya tank model boxes, simply great.

Here is a list of a few just released items that I will attempt to cover in following issues: Terrible Swift Sword and Barbarossa from TSR/SPI; Federation and Empire, the long awaited campaign game for Star Fleet Battles and Delta Force, a commando Role-Playing game, both from Task Force; GURPS (Generic Universal Role-Playing System) and Duel Track (Car Wars), both from Stev Jackson.

In the news, a note of congratulations to Brandon Musler, one of our CGC bretnien, one of whose letters has been published (again) in FIRE and MOVEMENT. I urge all to read it as it deals with over-complexity in games, misleading reviews and fustrated novices in the hobby, in short, stuff almost all of us can relate to.

While this first effort does not include much in the way of in-depth game reviews onews, I will try to do at least one in-depth review per month and I will endeavor to include some more news each issue from here on out. 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#### "ALL THE NEWS THAT FITS" SUMMER 1635

TIGHT SECURITY FOR NEW PRIVY COUNCILLOR, LOOSE CLOTHING FOR ANOTHER - HENDON RESIGNS IRISH POST - O'TYME STILL AT LARGE - NON-CONFORMIST TRACT GUTRAGES CLERGY - "BANANA NOSE" GETS 30 YEARS

Justiciar Sir Horatio hornblower, RN was the unanimous choice of the Privy Council to become its newest member in June. Fearful of attack by Irish fugitive "Nick" O'Tyme, Hornblower spent the months of June and July living in the BOO at Ramsgate Arsenal, under protection of the Royal Marines. When the feared attack failed to materialise, Hornblower cut loose in August with a riot of carousing, conspicuous consumption and theatre going.

Honblower's patron, Lord Actonstrange, missed the June PC meeting, confined to bed with a nasty outbreak of hives. His Lordship's cries of pain were mingled with cries of outrage when a servant brought word the Privy Council had put his coveted Lord Treasurer's position into commission. Lord Actorstrange may be mollified to learn he is considered a leading candidate for membership on said commission, should he care to resign as Secretary of State.

NAVAL NOTES: Lord Harrison "13 knot" Burke, following a stay in "dry dock" -- greenwich Naval Hospital -- has been given command of the man o'war HMS St. David...Admiralty sources report a mutiny aboard the Dutch Republic off Darien. The mutineers purportedly made Capt. Van Norstrand walk the plank.

BOOK REVIEW: The Great Patriotic Motherland War Against the Heathen Infidel Turks by C.F. Azov, Europi jian Militaaren Press, Rotterdam, 50 pounds. Azov's otherwise uninspired account of fighting in the East includes this remarkable statement: "Agents of the Czar were able to penetrate the highest levels of the Turkish Admiralty. One agent was able to purchase an entire galleas from a corrupt European officer. Christened the Gorboblaschevsk, after Alexander Nevsky's great victory of 1243, she took fourteen merchantmen, two galleases, a barque and a man o'war prizes, before being heroically sunk of Novorossisk.

LEGAL NOTES: Attourney P. Fogger is reported close to victory in two large civil judgments, including Tobacconists Guild v. the Crown. Fogger has also published "Torts and Tarts", an examination of the implications of civil law for the oldest profession, in the British Law Journal. Fogger has been elevated to senior barrister... MR. RA MBO challenges the chief of the Banza tribe to a manly duel. Machine Guns not being available, they fight with bare hands. Ra instructs his bearers to sing "Eye of the Tiger" to provide a musical background for the fight. He says "I fight better when there is a music in the background."
