Since the total of Agricultural credit units used was greater than the total of industrial credit units used, those who credit unit invested in A credits gained.

MISCELLANEOUS ORDERS*

England-Hekla: England will pay all Heklan trade costs until further notice.

Russia-Finland: Permit Russia to build a Fleet and a navy yard in the province of Finland.

Both the Finnish and the Beatniki players attempted to write orders which would involve the use of credits that those powers to not have. When you declare an area independent, its yields still belong to you until the next season--thus the yields from Finland and Beatnik went to Russia and Austria in Fall, 1915. The first yield the new countries will get is the one for this season, Spring, 1916.

On the matter of bids. Several of you write your orders under the apparent assumption that bids take effect the season they are ordered. This is not true. Bids, Net Bids, are added to the credits you receive, during what might be called Summer and Winter. Thus, if you bid for Bulgaria, as Beatnik did, the fact that you have not got any credits does not matter, because you get the yields at the same time you pay for them.

As to the unsuccessful Italian build in Tuscany: There was an error in the report of the Italian balance in Fall, 1915. The Austrian Net Neutral trade was added to the Italian balance, which should have read 58 I, 88 A. The Italian player built on that assumption. Remember that the tabulation in the chart is not official. It is only supposed to be a check on your own. If you find apparent mistakes in any players balance, it may just mean that he has built a submarine, but it's worth your while to check with me anyway. Other tabulation errors in the last issue were: Hekla should have the yields for Clyde, not England. The French balance should be 27 I, 224 A, as several neutral yields were neglected in the tabulation. Russia's neutral yields were forgotten, and should have given a balance of 115 I, 111 A/ Austria's neutral yield should have been -3 I, 21 A, for a balance of 57 I, 132 A. These errors have all been corrected in the table for this season.

Now for some questions. Can a power build in conquered territory? Yes, but only after it has begun to yield, and under the same sort of conditions as for regular builds. Does a power retain a trade agreement if he does not specifically repeat his bid the following season? Yes, but only if no one else bids for that neutral, or if all bids are stand-offs. What happens if a player's capital is captured? Nothing.

Below is the credit chart for this season. It appears we can have about three more puppet states before this thing will overflow the page. Notice that the top half of the chart is the same as the lower half of the chart for the last season. The corrections noted on page three are included.

Note that France has the option of either retreating the dislodged CC Munich to the Ruhr, or of removing it from the board. Fall, 1916 moves may be made conditional upon this choice.

DEADLINE FOR FALL, 1916 MOVES (and "SUMMER, 1916" RETREAT IS MARCH 22)

There is a possibility that issue #17 will not be published until after I return from vacation on April 1. I will extend the deadline, notifying all players of this if it does turn out to be what happens. If it does occur, the deadline will be extended two weeks until April 5, 1968. I will try to avoid this eventuality, however, as I would like to keep the tight three-week schedule.

LONDON: Italy. It is feared that the building of fleets in the Mediterranean may threaten the security of the island people. We would like some assurance from you that these fleets won't venture to any province adjoining the Mid-Atlantic.

REYKJAVIK: Russia! It is desired that we may continue our peaceful and lucrative partnership. England only wants Norway. Please concede it and I'm sure trade may continue between your two countries. Meanwhile our nation will continue to send what it can afford in foreign trade.

REYKJAVIK: England! Your great ally in the north, Russia, wishes only peace with you. We're sure they will grant your claim to Norway. When they do we have been assured you will continue your trade.

PARIS (Jan. 22, 1916) -- Today Louis XXI was crowned in hallowed Rheims Cathedral. The coronation formed the climax of the revolt against the corrupt government of the pseudo-republic which broke out almost instantly upon word of the German revolution. Within three weeks President Muhlhauser had fled the country (luckily, he was frustrated in his attempt to abscond with what he left of the treasury) and the House of Orleans had been restored to the throne.

In his coronation address the King excoriated the imperialist policy and reckless spending in support of it which had brought on France's present plight. "Henceforth France will be governed on the principles of Liberty, Equality, and Economy for all."

The King also praised English generosity which had kept the country financially afloat, and called for peace negotiations with Germany and Austria. "However," he said, "the struggle against the Italian invader will not be slackened in the least."

"In conclusion, I predict that the next twelve months will see France's darkest hour. But if she survives, we need have no further fears for her future."

FRANCE: To Germany: France cannot afford to sacrifice the Ruhr during the present crisis.

RUSSIA: To England: I did not receive any sort of communication from you as I requested. I hope that this doesn't mean war. I can not successfully attack you while you cannot successfully attack me. So it is to our advantage that we let Finland have Sweden. I hope this sounds favorable to you.

RUSSIA: To Germany: Communism? Waszat?

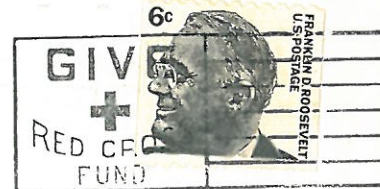
