AUSTRIA FAILS TO DEFEND AGAINST
TURKISH INVASION
LEMBERG TO TURKEY, MUNICH TO FRA.

Having heard no objections, strenuous or otherwise, I am allowing the Russian player the use of Switzerland as a branch office to his Moscow International Bank.

Also, Charles Wells has been forced to resign as Turkey, due to an overly full schedule. He would also like to have more time to work on Parlement, his game of Legislative maneuvering. This does leave me without a player for Turkey, and at the moment I do not have a replacement available.

I have recently received a letter from Harry Brunsch, 6771 Tyrone Avenue, Apt. 1, Van Nuys, Calif. 91405. He has expressed interest in this variant, and thus might be persuaded to take over Turkey. Good alliance offers would help. Actually this is only a surmise, and he might not be at all interested.

As the house-rules go, if I cannot get a player by Fall, 1919, I will be forced to have Turkey stand in Civil Disorder.

A few miscellaneous orders, such as join Tartary with Turkey, seem to have been pretty obvious from the months action. Since Tartary never had any credits really, this is trivial. The Turkish balance just grows as shown above. Spain, Portugal, Crete, Rumania, Greece, and Holland are still neutral.

Propaganda follows:

LONDON: The recent destruction of England's entire fishing fleet by the Italians has been an outright act of war against the Empire. It had been hoped that war could be avoided with Italy, even though they did invade the sovereignty of our close ally, France. But now, with this outrageous and unprovoked attack we must commit ourselves wholeheartedly to the destruction of the present Italian Empire. This act is inexcusable, thus we declare war on Italy! May the French armies prevail until English fleets may help destroy our common foe.

STOCKHOLM: In a recent border clash it was learned that Lithuania had made plans to raid several ~~xxxxxx~~ cities inside the borders of St. Petersburg. A combined reprisal attack by English and Scandian forces will have already taken place by the time of this news release. It is hoped that this will be taken as a warning against further attacks against this country.

PARIS: Whereas the armed forces of the Empire of Austria, the Kingdom of Hungary, and the Principality of Lithuania have engaged in an unprovoked attack upon the Peoples' Republic of Germany;

And Whereas the said forces have engaged in an unwarranted concentration along the borders of France;

And whereas the said agressor states have given aid and comfort to the Kingdom of Italy in that Kingdom's aggression against the realm of France;

Therefore, we the Estates of France, in Congress assembled, declare that a state of War exists between the Kingdom of France on the one part, and the Empire of Austria, the Kingdom of Hungary, and the Principality of Lithuania on the other part;

And that no trade to or from any of the said states shall be allowed to pass through the territory of the French realm, or any territories or waters controlled by the armies and fleets of France.

In witness thereto I set my hand and seal this tenth day of January in the year of the Incarnation of the Redeemer, 1918.
