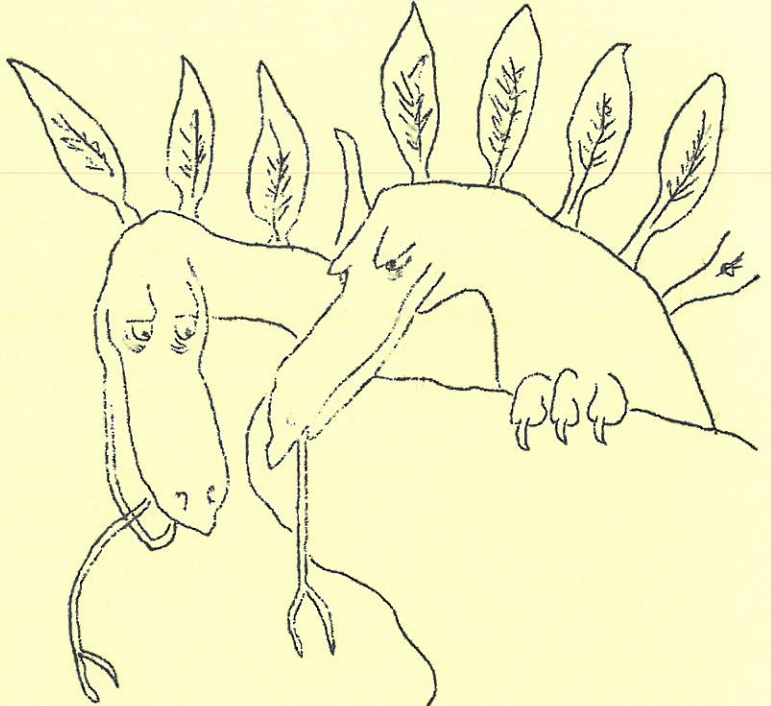
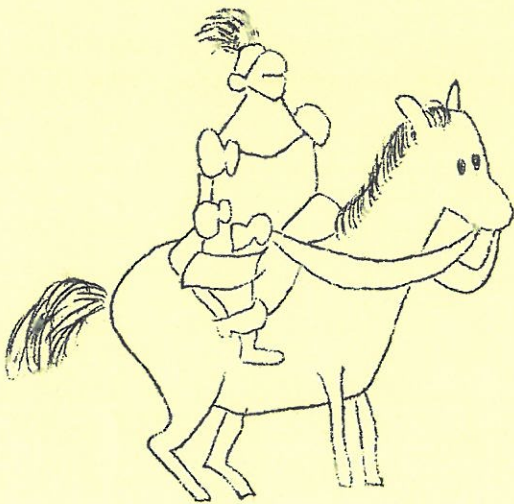

PARIS: The city of light exploded into demonstrations of a sort unseen for years as the King, Eduard I, made his first public appearance in sixteen months. King Eduard had forsaken the robes of state, and was uniformed as a Field Marshall of the Army. It is expected he will journey to the Marseilles front to direct operations against the Italians.

BORDEAUX: Citizens of this port city were treated to the awesome spectacle of the entire First Fleet moving to the South. It was rumored that Lisbon was not the intended port for the fleet, in spite of the numerous insults recently received from the Portugese.

MADRID: Reports are now rife in the city that the government of King Philip has begun to burn all official records, and has ordered the destruction of the plates for the currency. "Those damned Frenchmen may take the country, but that is all," said an unidentified official.

VIENNA: The French Ambassador was received at the Hofburg Palace with all due courtesy, carrying a request from King Eduard for an alliance and campaign against the Italians. It has been rumored that the ambassador was warmly greeted and the contents of his note are being closely studied.

BREST: With the sailing of the First Fleet, the city has gone on an eight day orgy to celebrate the record breaking modernization of the fleet. The galley slaves were replaced, not with sail as previously ordered, but with the newest diesel engines available from Germany. "Naturally, they kept the best for themselves," said the local officials, "but we are now more than a match for the Italians. Our armor plate is classified, of course, but I can tell you it surpasses anything turned out by the Kruppwerk."

LONDON: M.P. David V. Everett commenting on the military mobilization on the continent said: "It's about time the British people took an active part in European affairs." When asked whether he was influenced by his father-in-law, Prime Minister G. Roger Olmes, he answered: "No, but all Englishmen must take a stand these days and I am backing the Prime Minister and the crown." Hopes are high that England will once again rise to the task and punish the aggressor wherever he may lie.

PRESS RELEASES:

PRAGUE (July 18, 1919): King Louis XXI today conferred the Order of the Double Cross upon Ech-Pi'El, Master of the Ancient and Fraternal Order of Yog-Sothoth. The Order is credited with the undermining and swift collapse of the Dual Monarchy.

"Seldom in the annals of mankind," said His Most Christian Majesty, "has such faith, tenacity, and courage been shown, as by the members of this reviled and persecuted faith. Man will long remember their services in destroying the Hapsburg despotism. Now in the religious freedom of the French Imperium, the Church of the Elder Gods shall see a new and glorious flowering."

SWITZERLAND--The 1st Moscow International Bank reported a very slow Spring business this year.

BASEL, SWITZERLAND: At this pivotal hour in the history of the world workers' movement it seems fitting to release a history of that great struggle, with its ups and downs, peaks and pitfalls, triumphs and tragedies. Therefore, from the exiled joint headquarters of the GCP and the WSU, comes this word to all occupied Europe and the whole world:

Events followed rapidly. Capitalist and feudalistic states warring amongst themselves in Eastern Europe continued to gain power. Then came a new peoples' revolt--this time in France. An initially questionable revolution was soon taken over by radicals and democracy was also established in France. By this time, in peripheral actions, the people had also taken over in Belgium and Denmark.

Meanwhile the tottering capitalist and feudalistic empires continued their age-old folly. Italy attacked France, but was driven back by brave defenders. Austria attacked Russia in association with other reactionary states and overthrew the Russian government. Austria also invaded Germany, home of Democracy, and drove that open land's defenders underground.

But during this time England, greatest of imperialists, was not idle. Rapaciously devouring Scandinavia, she plunged south into Central Europe. Treacherously betraying Denmark, a democratic country, she mauled and raped that fair land, and northern Germany also. Meanwhile popular armies from France returned to southern Germany and were welcomed as liberators. Hundreds of thousands of German workers enlisted in "Freedom Regiments" which then went on to liberate other parts of Germany shoulder to shoulder with the French.

Gentlemen: Capitalists: Workers; Princes: Peasants: Humans all: **ARISE!!** Throw off this system! Overthrow the capitalist and feudal-ist enslavers! Destroy the remaining hangovers of another age--the England that is wavering, the Austria that is disintegrating, the Turkey that is stagnating, and all the rest. Push on, and on, and even further on. The dark ages of slavery, feudalism, and capitalism are ending. The Golden Age of mankind is beginning. Join the triumphant throng. Play your just part in victory!

The German Revolution is over. The French Revolution is won. What will the European Revolution come? With all their support behind the French--and any other force for freedom--the GCP and WSU return to the exile from whence, three short years ago, they came.

Onward democracy!!

LETTERS

NORMAN MCLEOD (assorted places in Maine and Virginia):

"I write concerning your 'Re the Diplomacy Board' article; you don't get 'the big cookie' either, and I have an atlas printed in 1901 to prove it. 1) While the Belgians were (as you mentioned) arbitrarily ceded a strip of France by Games Research, the Belgium-Netherlands boundary is completely accurate. //11// 2) THE BIG ERROR: Look at the Balkans. In 1901 there was no Albania, a Greece only about half the size shown, and smaller Serbia, and a smaller Bulgaria. As compensation, there was a much larger Turkey. In 1901, the northern border of Turkey ran from the northern tip of 1914-Albania on nearly a straight line to where 1914-Bulgaria and Turkey meet the Black Sea. The Southern border clipped Macedonia off of Greece.

d "While I am aware that, for a 1914 map, your corrections and those of John McCallum are sufficient, this map is 1901. If they meant 1914, they should have started the game in '14, or at any rate after the Balkan War (1911-1912) which clipped off Turkey's Balkan possessions.

//Although I disagree with respect to Holland (there is a mistake there, dammit. I just know it....), you are absolutely correct with regard to Europe in 1901. This question has been discussed at length in the past, and the upshot of the discussion seems to be that 1901 is just a more convenient date than 1914 to start the game at, even tho the political boundaries are Europe in 1914 and the geographical ones Europe in about 1940. The same convenience argument takes care of, I guess, the Belgium business, the Montenegro business, and anything else we wish to include.//

ON PODERKAGG: (excerpts from "Adrift in a Boneyard", by Robert L. Taylor, Avon, 1947.)

"Poderkagg (Pop. 13, 812) was formed in 1361 by the partition of Western Bohunkia and that region of Herzegobosnia lying below the Tuberculus River, following the Seventh War of the Hohenzollerns. Of exceedingly mountainous topography, it covers an area of 6,600 kiloroods, and the principle occupations are the raising of goats, sheep, and cattle, although the herds were grievously decimated in 1914 by the untimely leakage of a gas which the Army was developing and which, except for the treatment of certain respiratory ailments, proved ineffective for humans. The population are largely descendent from the fierce and warlike Semigoths, through the strain was augmented by the infiltration of Mosques, Kurds, Wheys, Doors, Franks, and Schillings during the Wars of the Frontiers, and Twenty Years, war, the Revolution, The Twenty-three Years War, the Second Revolution, the Cattle Raisers War, the Third Revolution, the Sheep Raisers War, the Twenty-six Years War,

the Fourth Revolution, the Goat Raisers War, and the thirty-two subsequent revolutions and wars.

"Politically, the country has always been turbulent, with a form of limited democracy prevailing since the establishment of The Peoples Republic in 1889. Prior to that date, Poderkagg had been indifferently ruled by a southern European branch of the Sepoy-Clapsburgs, but the line reached an end when Lugubrious IX succumbed to haemophilia after scratching his right thumb on a corkscrew. He had succeeded to the throne only a year previously, when his father, Pandemonium IV, had taken a nasty tumble down the chambermaids' staircase. The first president, elected after an eight-day siege of the palace hothouse, wherein the Pretender, Italian-born Prince Glucose, had taken a stand, was General Smellovitch. His administration lasted until the following week-end, when the general was waylaid and decapitated while collecting 'tributes' in the night clubs of Gastritis, the capital city.

"Smellovitch was succeeded by Andrekei Rathous, the candidate of the Somewhat Left of Center but not Communist Party. Rathous was given a ceremonial burial, with full military honors, four days later, and his Privy Counselor, Ernesto Loophole, was forcibly persuaded to assume the reins of government. Loophole's administration proved to be the longest in Poderkagg's history to date, lasting until the subsequent April. Since that time there have been one hundred and forty-three Presidents, two of whom died in bed. The country enjoys the distinctions of having started nearly three times as many wars as its next Balkan competitor.

"The principal interests of the people are politics and government. The only national sport of note is the strenuous 'Untergrund Spyhawk,' which was recently banned by several other European nations. Around the turn of the last century there was an upsurge of interest in basket-weaving and tribal dancing, but it died early, the women going into politics."

"Where is Poderkagg?" asked Mrs. Robinson. "I never quite got it in school."

"Well," said Mr. Robinson, "it's kind of north of France and Switzerland, but it's fairly close to Spain, and you couldn't really call it far from Germany and Jugoslavia and Russia and Greece and some of those places."

"Oh," said Mrs. Robinson, "it's in there. I'm ashamed I didn't know before."
