FRENCH WIN IN FIRST CLASH WITH TURKS

Following the "Spring" moves, Austria-Hungary refused to retreat its fleet in the Ionian Sea. The fleet was accordingly annihilated.

PALACE OF THE GOLDEN HORN (September 1904): The Grand Vizier announced that due to continued German assistance to the English in the battle of Moscow, the Yeni Cheri Fourth Army has been ordered to take Warsaw and destroy the base of German operations there. He stated that the Government is still in hopes of avoiding war with Germany, but prospects for this are doubtful.

TIRANA, OCCUPIED ALBANIA: The newly-proclaimed Austrian Emperor-in-exile, Zog McZig XIII $\frac{1}{2}$, this week outlined for the press his plans for political and other activity in the immediate future. "With the discontinuation of Austrian military activities imminent," he burped over a large goblet of unwatered Scotch, "we shall restrict our sponsorship to subversion and moral intimidation. For example, we have already sent the Sultan a Trojan Horse gift; sixty-four young, lascivious Austrian maidens, completely ready for - ah - use. The one drawback is, they all have advanced cases of gonorrhoea."

Beyond this and certain less printable utterances, the new Emperor confined his remarks to a lament on the loss of 50,000 thalers in bets on the Dodgers. "However," the monarch brightened, "one of our brilliant ministers absconded with a large sum

LONDON (DWE): The British Government today announced the declaration of war against the German Empire. This was occasioned, the government spokesmen said, by the German attack on Austria-Hungary, placing England in a position where she can keep her non-aggression pact with Germany only by breaking her somewhat older mutual defense pact with Austria-Hungary. The British declaration, it is rumored, contained a clause assuring Germany that England's intentions were not hostile, and that her troops would withdraw as soon as Germany was obliterated from the face of Europe.

LISECM: The French Republic, with regret, recognizes its futile role in this insane war and announces its willingness to come to peace terms with Germany. Naturally we wish to avoid the position of making extravagant claims, and will only ask

for the restoration of our homeland in this mutual peace-pact.

CONSTANTINOPLE: After hearing the Kaiser's unkind remarks, linking Turkey with Austria as enemies of Germany, we are tempted to reply in kind. However, we will never cease to regard Germany and England as our friends, even should we be forced to entertain them in the royal palace itself! However, we are sure that an accommodation can be worked out with one of them, seeing the tempting situation in the North Sea area...all replies will be held in confidence.

CONSTANTINOPLE to VIENNA: As you have shown no interest in defending your Russian territories, we are forced to occupy Sevastopol. We will not intrude, of course, in areas where you are equipped to defend your possessions.
