MISSING DESPATCHES FOUND!

About five minutes after GRAUSTARK #108 went into the mail, I discovered two todegrams and a special delivery air mail post card which had arrived last Friday, and which my wife had neglected to put on my desk. The moves ordered on those communications change the ricture somewhat in 1966B, as follows:

ENGLAND (McCallum, vice Davidson): A St. F holds; F Swe S GEFMAN F Den-Bal; F North Sea S GEFMAN A Hol-Bel; F wes-Lyo; F Mid-Wes; F Eng-Mid.

FRANCE (Tygert); A Rel-Pur; A Pic-Bre; F Pre-Mid: F Por 2 F Bre-Mid; A Ruh-Kie; "F Spa-Gibraltar". The fleet in Spain's southern coast holds.

GEFMANY (Turner, vice Swenson): A War holds; A Man-Bur; A Bur-Par; A Hol-Bel;
A Ber-Kie; F Don-Bal,

TTALY (Ward): A Tyr S A Ven; A Ven S A Tyr; F Sin-Ion; F Tyr S F Tun-Ion; A Pie-Mar.

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY (Oline): F Tri-Alb; A Bud-Tri; A Sor & A Vie S A Bud-Tri,

RUSSIA (von Metzke): F Bal S CERMAN F Den-Mie.

TJEKEY (Pournelle): A Ser-Mos; A Gal-War; A Ukr S A Gal-War; F Ion-Gre; F Eas-Ion; F Adr S F Eas-Ion;

Underlined moves are not possible. The French army in Belgium must retreat to Picardy, The German army in Warsaw must retreat to Livonia, Prussia, or Silesia. The direction of this retreat should be submitted with the "Winter 1904" moves, and the builds or removals of other players may be made contingent upon it. The High Combatant Powers now control the : llowing supply centers:

Turkey may build three new units, and Germany may build one. France must remove three units. The Russian fleet dislodged from the Baltic is removed, as Russia has lost all its supply centers. The deadline for these "Winter 1904" moves remains NCON, SATURDAY 5 NOVEMBER 1956.

If most Diplomary players are suddenly asked: "Who is playing in the most postal Diplomacy games?", they will reply, "Jemes Latimer". And yet a check shows that Latimer is at best tied for third with this dubious distinction. Chief among those who are using postal Diplomacy as a means for correcting the chronic deficits of the Post Office is Conrad von Motzke, who is not only playing 17 postal Diplomacy games, but is renting a post office box to accompant them.

Next to von Metzke is Charles Reinsel with 13; this, however, is tenuous distinction, as he is likely at any time to fly off the handle about a gamesmacter's editorial policy and resign. This leaves Jemes Letimer and Charles Brannan in this large with 12 games each. Following them are:
