SALONA (15 September 1904): The Imperial Chancery today issued a statement denying a vicious rumour which has recently appeared in the British press. In part, the release said, "It has been noised abroad of late that one Sextus Tarquinius, allegedly the British Ambassador, was allowed by Her Imperial Majesty, Empress Lucrezia of the Balkanian Empire, to enter into an improper relationship with Her Imperial person. Inasmuch as this office has not processed any papers on any such ambassador, since the Imperial Post and Customs Ministry has no record of his entry into Balkania, and since no British ambassador, of whatever name, has been accredited to the Imperial Government since late 1903, it is obvious that this rumor is nothing more than a malicious lie spread by certain interests anxious to undermine the authority of the Imperial Government." Her Imperial Majesty, in a note to the Imperial Ministry of Information, further noted that the story avers that the alleged British ambassador was sent to Vienna, whereas Her Majesty has resided in Salona since 1902. Her Majesty also suggested that, although the story originated in the British press, it must have been placed there by agents of Kaiser Wormtongue of Germany.

VENICE (18 November 1904): After a harifought battle, in which the cowardly German troops were completely routed, His Imperial Highness, Prince Caesare Bordsha returned to the land of his birth, cheered by great crowds of wellwishers; admirers, and people. His Highness, fresh from the Russian campaign, fought for the preservation of the Imperial Russian State against the perfidy of her neighbors, told the assembled crowds that Italy would soon be liberated from foreign invaders and His

RUSSIANS MARCH ON LIECHTENSTEIN

GRANDE CASINO, BEAUCOULLON (28 November 1908): Rumors reaching here from the confused situation in central Europe indicate that the Third Army of the Russian Technocratic Republic may be disbanded by the Russian government "-if there is one," added Count Avino, the power behind the throne of this tiny Grand Duchy. Some doubts on this last point have been voiced by the odds-makers of the Grand Ducal Bourse.

The most recent despatches to have reached Beaucouillon indicate that the Third Army, far from having advanced triumphantly across Austrian Poland and Silo- sia to Breslau, was decisively defeated last May by a superior Turkish force, and fled westward under the able leadership of its commander, General Count Obloff. Obloff, who issued his "victory" proclamation upon entering Breslau, has since announced his intention of marching on Liechtenstein.

VADUZ, LIECHTENSTEIN (30 November 1908): The Hon. Josef Szigoti-Quakenbruck, formerly Prime Minister of Liechtenstein and now Bouncer-in-Chief of the military brothel established in that country, denied rumors that Liechten- stein is unprepared for the anticipated Russian invasion. "Thanks to the astuteness of the Hon. Jasper Pike, Liechtenstein's now pro- priator," the Bouncer-in-Chief told the press, "Liechtenstein will be prepared to meet everything Obloff and his Russians have to offer. Mr. Pike brings to Liechtenstein his years of experience in this busi- ness in New York - a business which brought him such financial success that he was appointed Ambassador to Beaucouillon. The Chief Mademo, Countess Rurilovsky, has recruited a staff of unparalleled energy and capacity."

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GRANDE CASINO, BEAUCOULLON (1 December 1908): Turkish odds fell slightly today in moderate trading, closing at 2-1. England failed to keep pace, owing to the more dispersed fleets, and closed at 11-5. France remained the favorite at 8-5. Italy was off fractionally in light trading, closing at 15-1 after a brief rally sparked by rumors of an agreement with Liechtenstein whereby the Duchesses of Pizzina and Toscanelli would enter Liechtenstein's employ. Trading in Russia was sluggish, and was finally ordered stopped by the Chief Croupier while an investigation is conducted into whether there actually is a Russian government.

In other activity on the Bourse, Jasper Pike's Liechtenstein Pleasureland Cor- poration was hit by a flurry of "Sell" orders about 11 AM when Sir Oliver Mottke- Wrench, the English Ambassador, informed traders that Obloff's army had no cash other than the inflation-ridden paper rubles of the Technocratic Republic. The prospect of no financial advantage being gained from the Russian onslaught caused Pleasureland stock to drop 16 1/2 points. The run was ended when Henry Pike, the nephew of Liechtenstein's owner, presented conclusive evidence that Count Obloff had looted the Russian gold reserves before leaving his homeland, and was bringing them to Liechtenstein. The evidence was in the form of a bag of gold rubles collec- ted by Baroness Czorny, wife of the Russian Ambassador to Beaucouillon, in the course of a secret journey made by her and her sister, Lady Arletta, to the Russian on- campment in Sillesia. The slump in Pleasureland stock was wiped out by a series of purchase orders, and Pleasureland closed 9 3/4 points up.

GRANDE CASINO, BEAUCOULLON (5 December 1908): The Grand Duke Cosimo XIII made a rare personal appearance at the Grand Ducal Bourse to express his pleasure over the flourishing financial condition of the Grand Duchy as the war neared the end of its eighth year. (His cynical friend Count Avino was heard to remark that there were also some new female dealers at the Bourse which the Grand Duke had not yet in- spected.) The Chief Croupier's report was most gratifying. Estimated gross income for 1908 is estimated at 1, 400,000 ducats from the Bourse alone, not counting the sale of commemorative postage stamps, titles of nobility, medals, or old mistres- ses. In answer to a question, the Grand Duke said that he did not expect the open- ing of Jasper Pike's "Pleasureland" in Liechtenstein would greatly affect the in- come of Beaucouillon. "What the Hon. Mr. Pike is selling," Cosimo XIII said, "can

be bought only by ~~man~~ in reasonably good health and vigor. But the trade of the Grand Duchy is subject to no such limitations." He indicated a nearby roulette table where the players included a 96-year-old dowager from England and a dissipated young Crimean princess about 14 years old.

When I was transferred back here to the continent, it was only logical I should work for Reuters - but Reuters' office in Munich was destroyed during the shelling in late November, and the Imperial German News Association was the only agency left that had any carrier pigeons - now the only sure way of getting a message to the outside world. BERLIN (IGNA): Remember when we said we were learning French so we could speak to our subjects better? Well, it comes in handy with deserters, too.

PARIS (IGNA): We are not the "République de la France, Grande Bretagne, et Allemagne", we are the "Troisième République de la France, Grande Bretagne, Hollande, Luxembourg, Espagne, Portugal, Algérie, Corse, et l'Isles de la Manche". Our allies (if we still have any undoublecrossed) may call us La Belle France. Merci.

LONDON (IGNA): Prince Otto has taken well to life in London. His total of near-fatal "accidents" has gone up to an unprecedented 749, and even Bubbles is back in the bloom of health. TIENTSIN (30 January 1905, PNA): Russian troops and German seamen are digging mass graves for the thousands of bodies of Chinese Christians found lying in the streets. Admiral von Spee sent the fleet's Marine detachment along with the Cosacks to relieve the Peking legations. The telegraph lines to Peking have been repaired and the embassies are still holding out.

SHANGHAI (17 March 1905, AP): American troops entered Fort Sobieski, last stronghold of the European population, found only 230 people alive of the city's 5,000 foreigners.

KIEV (5 April 1905, IRN): A bumper crop of early winter wheat is being shipped to Rumania and Germany. Luckily, tracks to these areas are still undamaged despite the battles throughout Eastern Europe.

ATHENS (10 April 1905): President Nasturtium, who was rushed from Bucharest to command the 1st GAS Corps here, announced that war had been declared with Italy. "They took great offense at our purely unintentional victory over the Italian troops in Greece!" Nasturtium commented. "Ah well, they too will soon discover the invincibility of Turks in combat! Personally, I think the Pope is behind all this. We'll deal with him after the inevitable fall of Rome."

SOFIA (13 April 1905): Due to a foul-up in Turkish communications, the 164th Turk Army of the Balkans was given the order to attack Italian forces in Serbia instead of holding the flank for a 1st GAS corps assault as originally planned. The latest news from the front indicates an overwhelming Turk victory is near at hand.

PARIS: In a surprise move peace was made with Germany and Munich has been returned to German hands. It is hoped that Russia will now aid our cause against England. The army formerly in Munich has been dispatched to Austria-Hungary to help out Italian friends in their gallant stand against Turkey.

VATICAN CITY (26 April 1905): Pope Sylvester IV indignantly rejected a Turkish protest over alleged Vatican support for Italian policy in the Balkans. "The Vatican is, as it must be, completely neutral in the present world conflicts," the Pope told reporters. "We point to our successful negotiation of the American civil conflict between presidential claimants Bryan and Roosevelt, and the present reconciliation now taking place in that great nation under the compromise presidency of

Woodrow Wilson. We have also mediated the Canadian attack on America, so that peace once more reigns in North America. Our present concern is the negotiation of peace in Europe, and in the troubled cities of China, where Europeans are threatened by scarlet-robed nationalist fanatics of the so-called 'Red Garb'.

"If President Djemal Nasturtium of Turkey continues in his unwarranted attacks, we shall extend papal recognition to the Turkish royalist underground government in Angora, and send the Pope's Own Regiment of Amazon Axewomen to liberate the unfortunate females held captive in Turkish harems."

VATICAN CITY (30 April 1905): A slight misunderstanding of the name of a sempstress led today to a scandal which broke over the papal court with a vehemence not known here since the Counter-Reformation. All over Rome, people are asking one another what was the real purpose of Pope Sylvester IV in recruiting the Pope's Own Regiment of Amazon Axewomen, organized in 1903 under the command of Col. Elizabeth Borden of the USA.

The Sempstress by Papal Appointment to the Axewomen, who is charged with making their colorful uniforms, is a Mrs. Macalusa, a former mistress of that Cardinal Tosca whose death caused such a furor a few years ago. But there also lives in Rome a sempstress named MacAlister, a pious Irish Protestant widow who has built up a trade among British women resident in the eternal city.

Three days ago, four recruits in the Axewomen came to Mrs. MacAlister to get their uniforms made. None of them were Italians; they'd apparently intended to go to Mrs. Macalusa for a rush order to be readied for a celebration of St. Walburga's Eve at the Vatican tonight. Mrs. MacAlister overheard one of the girls, an American, tell another, "You'll like Sylvester. He's a real pussycat!"

This overheard conversation was reported to other women of the British community in Rome, whence it reached the press. Foreign residents, particularly those from Protestant countries, have been asking why Pope Sylvester recruited a large number of attractive young women into the Axewomen.

SQUIJI ISLANDS (2 May 1905): The great tides of life in the outside world usually pass by these tropic islands without even disturbing the perpetual pinocchio game among the native king and two German remittance men. One of the Germans, a tired merchant marine captain who claims, when full of schnapps, to be a prince or a near relative of the famous Prince Otto, has not received a letter since his notice of dismissal from the merchant marine in 1892. Then, suddenly, the pinocchio game was interrupted yesterday by a flood of cablegrams delivered to the quondam "Prince" Max.

"What is all this?" the native king asked after the fifth or sixth such interruption.

"Der Squiji Islands iss becoming very popular," Max replied. "Efferybody wants to come here in a hurry. Dere iss mine cousin Prince Otto, who wants to leave London because his dachshund Bubbles iss being sued for non-support by a female English bulldog. Und Max's personal physician, Dr. A. Ohne Umlaut, wants to make anudder antropologicke expedition - quickly, before der Pope finds out vot he's really been doing in der fizicke eggzaminations uff der Amazon Axewimmen.
