Neither Bob Whalen nor the stand-by player, Tom Griffin, sent in "Fall 1915" moves for France. Therefore the first person to send in "Spring 1916" moves for that country will take over its play; only present players of other countries in 1965Q are ineligible.

CONSTANTINOPLE: We congratulate our allies, France and Germany, on their steadfastness to the cause in the face of threatened oblivion. France will be rewarded for her efforts soon; the Germans must, because of their geographical position, wait. We promise, however, to aid the Germans in the recovery of their homeland.

CONSTANTINOPLE: The Sultan has announced that Spiros Preposterous, who has not been heard from in some time, has been in seclusion, studying the problems of the defense of the Mid-Atlantic/Western Mediterranean area. Yesterday Grand Duke Spiros' report came in. In it, he pointed to this area as simultaneously the key to the war, and Turkey's weakest point. He demanded and received two fleets and an army from the Eastern front to reinforce the West. "Our ally France," he stated, "will lose Marseilles. Swift action on our part will preserve Spain. If Spain is lost our left flank is crushed, and we are in for trouble." Preposterous pointed out that Turkish fleets will never advance beyond the Mid-Atlantic, but that they would not need to. If they hold the English back, our Armies will sweep to victory on a line from Belgrade northwards.

TRYPHEME: "In the name of the oppressed Turks, I claim the Sultan-ship of Turkey for my own." - The Queen, Paternal Grandmother of the Usurper.

HYDUNDERABAD: Civil war still rages in this tiny Indian state between the forces of the Maharajah Kamasutra IX and those of Pandit the Bandit, leader of the Peristaltic Movement. The Maharajah's headquarters today announced final and complete victory for the fifth time, and reconfirmed his steamship reservation to Cyprus. The rebels claim that they have seized and nationalized the Maharajah's second-best harem.

MONTERREY (3 Mar. 1911): His Voraciousness, Antonio Bordsha, Archbishop of Tucumcari and Points West, today established His seat at the Cathedral of St. Pomfroy the Obsequious and issued an Archepiscopal letter to all His parishoners. The Archbishop declared that His portion of the United States was seceding from the Union and joining the Balkanian Empire. "It has come to Our attention," He declared, "that an insidious anti-Catholic plot is being hatched by the U. S. Government in the Lafayette Naval Yards and the Walnut Creek Naval Training Center (not to mention the Berkeley Riot Training Center). In order to prevent this dastardly plot from coming to fruition, We are leading the Western States out of the Union and into the Federal Empire of Balkania, which already had admitted New England to membership."

VALONA (25 Mar. 1911): The Balkanian Fleet, accompanied by no less a personage than Grand Admiral Cielo del Mar himself, today landed in this Albanian port to celebrate the Spring Fertility Festival. The Grand Admiral, at a press conference held this afternoon, indicated that the Fleet would thence steam south against the perfidious, cowardly, and decadent Ottoman Empire.

PRAGUE (7 Apr. 1911): Rumors of intensive German-Balkanian negotiations in this city have yet to be confirmed. NEW YORK (30 Apr. 1911): A spokesman for Mrs. Svetsoxa Hullaballuia, who claims to be Princess Svetsoxa, daughter of the Empress Lucrezia, announced today that "Her Imperial Highness the Princess Svetsoxa has been reorganized as Svetsoxa, Inc., Ltd., & S. A. She has been incorporated in the Grand Duchy of Beaucauillon for the tax advantages, since that nation, living off its gambling casinos, has no taxes." The spokesman further announced that Svetsoxa Inc. would produce the Princess's memoirs, as well as magazine articles, exclusive interviews, photographs, devotional articles, pennants, balloons, bubble-gum cards, T-shirts, and advertising endorsements.

Questioned about the Princess's whereabouts, her business manager remarked, "Oh, she's still unloading coal on the docks. We can't have her interfering in the management or manufacturing end of Svetsoxa Inc. It's work she is fitted for, and it keeps her happy. Right now, she's earning almost as much as the man who is writing her memoirs."

BERLIN (InterNews Service): Austrian or Italian armies in Tyrolia will undoubtedly be interpreted by the High Command as aggression against Germany unless this army is removed in the spring.

RACINE, WISC., U.S.A.: The theme of the news was "local boy makes good" when young Thomas Alva Crickley received a patent on a curious machine he invented. "This instrument will fill a long-felt need on the part of many people," he told reporters. "It is going into commercial development as soon as I work out an easier way to clean it. Abercrombie and Fitch is interested, as they have already marketed a machine similar in character, but of somewhat limited scope."

HEIDELBERG, GERMANY: Fräulein Reba Heisshosen was today taken into custody by police on unspecified charges. Also picked up was a huge amoeba which Fräulein Heisshosen had allegedly stolen from an experimental biological laboratory at the University of Heidelberg. University authorities expressed pleasure at the return of this creature, which is said to be the largest unicellular animal ever developed, but declined to tell why it had been produced. They denied as "Silly" a rumor that this amoeba was capable of speech.

ROSTERS OF CURRENT POSTAL DIPLOMACY GAMES

These rosters update and correct those given in GRAUSTARK #100, and no further reference to rosters in issues 101-132 is necessary. Postal Diplomacy games are designated by the year in which they began; and the letter indicates the order within that year. After the alphabet is exhausted, the notation begins again with AA, AB, etc. Following the name of the Gamesmaster, and that of the publication in which the game appears, the players' names are given in the order England, France, Germany, Italy, Austria-Hungary, Russia, and Turkey. Team games are indicated by the letter "t", and countries are grouped by teams, with the captain indicated. "Out" indicates the game year in which a player was eliminated from play; "res" means a resignation, and "dro" a player dropped by the Gamesmaster. Winners of completed games are indicated.

This will probably be the last postal Diplomacy roster to be published in GRAUSTARK. Postal Diplomacy, with more than 100 games now in progress, is growing too large for any one person to keep track of it. Furthermore, such rosters cannot be kept up to date if Gamesmasters do not trade their 'zines with GRAUSTARK. In the past I have subscribed to a few 'zines which do not trade, but even this expedient will not work any more. Charles Reinsel, James Dygert, and Charles Turner have announced their intention of neither trading nor accepting subscriptions, but limiting circulation solely to players. Under these circumstances a complete roster can no longer be kept of the progress of all postal Diplomacy games.

From now on, therefore, GRAUSTARK numbers will no longer be assigned to new postal Diplomacy games, save for those in GRAUSTARK itself. Gamesmasters and players are requested to check the rosters of their games and to send in any corrections. However, no further attempt will be made to keep these rosters up to date.
