QUEENS (3 September 1911): Assisted by the Bayleov Squadron, the Imperial Balkanian Fleet has captured the State of New York. The State has been proclaimed a province of the Empire, and is being governed by Her Inperial Majesty's cousin, Vlad Borgia. STRASSBURG (12 September 1911): The Balkanian Western Army, under the command of Grand Prince Caesare Bordsha, today crossed through this border town into the territory of the former state of France. Upon leaving, His Highness was presented with the Iron

Cross by General Macht von Schnapps for His services in protecting the Reich.

ROME (30 October 1911): Her Holiness, Pope Joan II, rode triumphantly into Rome to-day and reestablished Papal rule over the Holy City at the head of Her armies. In a fierce battle in lower Italy, the forces of the Balkanian Empire, bearing the Papal banner, defeated a large force of German boy scouts attempting to maintain control of the capital of the former Roman Empire. Her Holiness also crowned the German Emperor as Emperor of Europe, ceding to Him all Balkania's possessions in the New World except for New England and California. As Empress of Balkania, the First Lady of Europe acknowledged German's victory in the current war and recognized Wilhelm as temporal primate of Europe.

LONDON: After initial raids along the coasts by "privateers", as they are officially designated by the government, this war, which was to be the doom of civilization (or as Balfour put it last month, "the end of the British Empire, which of course means much the same thing"). After some initial skirmishes in the colonies and the Pacific, nothing. For some three months there has been no violence whatsoever, except for some skirmishes in the Balkans. Of course Kier Hardie and his labourites claim it was the general strike of December which caused the lull, but even he finds it difficult to claim victory for the workers.

The reason for Labour's not trusting their own claims is that the war is sure to start again in just a few weeks as the thaw of spring drifts north. And the war has not really ever stopped for Krupp and his like the world over: Arms shipments clog the sealanes and dreadnoughts are being rushed to completion in Portsmouth and Liverpool: The Fifth Fleet.

Worst of all, from the point of view of Townsend and the Government, is the loss of a vote of confidence over the measures to create the Fifth Fleet, which was voted down by the Commons in a strange show which had Tories crossing the aisles to vote with Hardie and his tweeded minority. The Fleet was at last approved, but the Government has fallen. Townsend has predicted that his government will remain in power, but that it will not have the 394-276 margin that it enjoyed at the turn of the century. He expects something on the color of a 340-330 margin at best, with the Liberals possible targets of coalition if things go their worst.

I leave tomorrow with the Second Army for Norway, which will hopefully be well out of the war-zone at least until I am safely there. Townsend has pledged to defend it against all attacks, and Olaf has asked him to put up or shut up with the Second Army.
