Italian forces are expected to set up provisional government areas in conjunction with Turkey in most of continental Western Europe. Already some hotheads are talking of Turkey next but little is expected to happen until the rise of Benito Mussolini in about 20 years.

SQUIJI ISLANDS: Pope Sylvester IV has had a turn of his luck in his perpetual pinchle game with the King of the Squiji Islands and several exiled noblemen and sundowners. Once losing heavily, he came up with a fresh stock of Russian gold rubles, and with this as a stake he has recovered his losings and is now several hundred dollars ahead.

PALACE OF THE GOLDEN HORN: His Sublime Majesty announced with regrets that the Northern offensive failed to drive the Pretender and his English allies out of Finland, and that this probably means that the war will continue for at least another year. Turkish military forces are at their highest level in modern history, he told the Grand Council, but despite this all wartime restrictions on the population may now be removed.

JERUSALEM: The Army of the Southern Faithful announced the capture of a slender young British Officer named "Lawrence". Captain Lawrence, who appears to be something of a local hero among malcontent followers of the outlaw Prince Feisal, had little to say except that he urgently requested that he be allowed a private visit with an unnamed Turkish officer who previously held him overnight in a small town East of the Jordan. He refused to say why such a visit should be allowed.

SEVASTOPOL: Ah, the awesome spectacle of the Sevastopolitan State's pomp and ceremony! Consider, for example, the recently concluded Sevastopolitan Diplomacy-Fertility Festival...

To officially initiate the Festival, Tsar André I was accompanied to the dais of the Fairwood Palace's Throne Room by J. J. Dygertevsky and Carl Turnoff, Foreign Minister and First Minister of Truth, Propaganda, and Censorship, respectively. The Tsar, the Mad Satirical Monk, appeared worn from his prolonged bout with that disease he contracted when...ah well, we all know that story...Anyway, he appeared worn, his tall frame bent over, but displayed momentary lucidity when he had to be restrained from chasing a young Feather Dancer who had bowed a little too far.

Carrying a curved scimitar, symbolizing Sevastopol's suzerainty over Anatolia, the Tsar was followed by Mikhail Celstriki, dutifully bearing a nine-ox-tail standard, symbolizing the loyalty of Asia's tribes to His Luminous and Imperious Majesty. Celstriki was clad in olive-drab garb, with three yellow stripes down his back. The Tsar, for the first time, appeared in public wearing the Crown of St. Stephen, His as a result of His marriage to the Balkanian Empress. His robes were a brilliant shade of Leechee-nut.

Admiral Bayleov, prince-regent, was third in the awesome, grand, spectacular procession, carrying the Sevastopolitan Coat of Arms. A half-step behind, at Bayleov's right, was Marshall le Tournier, in full dress uniform. Lt. Igor Brannanenko, head of Palace Security, was at Bayleov's left, carefully clutching the set of master keys to all the Fairwood Palace bedrooms. Other military luminaries followed, including Vice-Admiral Bobarick Wardshev, back from his successful bombardment of Brooklyn, and General Rozhdestvensky (Gopher) Walkoff, recently promoted in exchange for calling off the Sevastopolitan dock strike. (In honor of the occasion, the Tsar also elevated Walkoff to head of the Sevastopolitan Action Guard, a job worthy of his capabilities.)

Various other resplendently arrayed officials and foreign dignitaries filled out the procession.

Gently led by Turnoff and Dygertevsky to the Grand Throne of the Grand Empire of Grand Sevastopol, the entire court bowed. The Tsar, the former A. B. Swensonov, delivered a three hour and ten minute Imperial Soliloquy With Monologue (at least fifteen minutes of which was coherent) on the dangers of Schimmelpennick fumes mixed with essence of burnt GRAUSTARK. He noted the curious effects of this combination on sailors of the British fleet and attributed recent British naval reverses to this very cause. As His personally selected, inspected, and approved Virgin Feather Dancers amused Him, behind a conveniently descending canopy of course, J. J. Dygertevsky assumed the Tsar's role in the rest of the elaborate ceremony. He called for the symbol

of the Fertility-Diplomacy Festival to be brought forth to the dais. Contrary to rampant speculation, the symbolic icon of international intrigue and immorality was not a six-foot-long dagger once used to guard Sultan ibn-ben-Thomsa's harem. Neither was it a Creeping Snoopy Doll. Not even a bottle of Bordschabiazin. No, it was a carefully preserved copy of a HOLY GRAUSTARK #1, carried forth on a silver platter by Bébé Bélie. This sacred icon had been awaited for three years, the length of the delay in the start of the Festival, but its arrival from Brooklyn had been delayed because of the Allied Blockade of the port of New York. It had been necessary to bring the icon overland to San Francisco via rail, to Hong Kong via junk, to Delhi by dirigible, onto Lhasa via yak-back, and finally to the Fairwood Palace by an entire tribe of Yeti.

The ceremony commenced as Bélie placed the document at the feet of Dygertevsky and Turnoff. Dygertevsky blessed it by reverently opening it, thus causing the pages to come loose from the staple. Turnoff consecrated it by passing copies of Clausewitz and Machiavelli over it. The HOLY GRAUSTARK #1 was then placed in the Ark of the Broken Covenant where it was adored by all present for five minutes. Cardinal Peericelli - visiting from the Holy Office and substituting for the absent Cardinal Hötendorff - then presided over the Service of Incineration. Raising his fuming censer above the ark and swinging mightily, Peericelli muttered prayers to the goddess Ashtarte and the ghost of Pope Julius II. BROOKLYN (1 November 1911): The editor of a local tabloid repeated his assertion that Tsar Andre I was wearing St. Stephen's Crown at a recent ceremony. "If you examine the pictures of the ceremony carefully," he said, "you will see that the cross on the crown is indeed tilted. However, this is not immediately evident, because the Tsar and all his courtiers are also tilted."

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE GRAND DUCHY OF BEAUCOUILLON - IX

During the High Middle Ages - rendered even higher in 1290 by the invention of brandy by the Grand Duke Dionisio XIII - the practice of making book on sporting events was developed in Beaucoillon. The most favored sporting event at that time was jousting, although archery and a crude form of football also attracted the ducats of the Grand Duchy's visitors.

Typical of the tourneys of those days was the Grand Prix de Beaucoillon of 1328, held by the Grand Duke Ganymedes VI to mourn the death of his extremely close friend, King Edward II of England. In fact, according to a contemporary English chronicler, the monk Roger Echowonche, "Beaucoillon held that day the biggest Prix

in Europe." The tourney was won by Sir Reptitius, a 7-1 shot whose victory caused the bankruptcy of a Lombard banking house which had incautiously backed the favorite, the noted epicure Sir Fitto Lampreys.

The income from these athletic events, and the introduction of such new games as chess, craps, and the shell game, did not tide the Grand Duchy over the loss of income from the cessation of the Crusades. While the income from crusading knights was cut off, the expenditures of the Grand Dukes for the oriental luxuries introduced by the Crusades continued. In the year of 1381 alone, the Grand Ducal expenditures on silks and slave-girls amounted to 120,000 gold ducats.

However, despite this economic strain, the Grand Duchy of Beaucouillon was not troubled by the peasant revolts which roiled the rest of Europe during the 14th century. Almost every peasant in Beaucouillon was descended, albeit illegitimately, from a Grand Duke; regarding themselves as practically members of the nobility, they had no incentive to revolt.

At this point, Mehran Thomson raises the question of whose are the supply centers in Moscow and Warsaw. Builds are not in general transferable between allies. But the U. S. expeditionary force stands in a special circumstance. The reason why American aid has been so useful to her allies in two world wars is that American supply centers are far removed from any enemy action, and the U. S. does not depend on conquests in Europe to keep its forces supplied. In GRAUSTARK #122 I proposed that "supply centers taken by this force, or by any subsequently landed American Expeditionary Force, may be assigned to the Entente Power on whose territory the Americans originally landed. If this force is annihilated, then on the next subsequent 'Winter' move the Entente Powers may establish two American armies if the sea-ways are clear for their landings in Europe."

Under these rules, the "Winter 1920" moves are:

ENGLAND: Builds A Lon, A Edi.

ITALY: Removes A Pie.

U. S. A.: Builds A Bre.

TURKEY: Builds F Con.

Said Prince Vlad, "Still keeping up the act, isn't she?" The aged Svetsoxa then returned to work at the docks, while Prince Vlad impounded her personal effects. Among them was a birth certificate for a "Svetsoxa Schwartz", born in Brooklyn in 1886. "Ha!" cried Vlad, "Proof positive of the fraud! Fraud, fraud, I say!!"

BROOKLYN (7 November 1911, BPD): Svetsoxa Schwartz was placed on Social Security today, under a new rule that people who look 65 and over were eligible. Officials say that Svetsoxa's appearance entitled her to 45 years' back allowances.

SALONA (18 November 1911, BPD): Former rebel Cardinal Hőzendorff entered the capital of Balkania today at the head of the entire membership of the heretical Synod of Sevastopol. BUDAPEST (25 November 1911, BPD): Her Imperial Majesty the Empress Lucrezia and Cardinal Hőzendorff today dedicated the first Improved Bordshabiazin factory in Balkania. The new product will be marketed under the trade name "Nourne-Vita".

SALONA (25 December 1911, BPD): And now we leave Balkania, celebrating madly the Annual Winter Fertility Festival. Her beauty and accomplishments undiminished, the glorious divine Lucrezia presides like a goddess over the proceedings, holding private audience for many hundreds of panting males. And everywhere are cries of "Wiva Lucrezia!"

BROOKLYN (31 December 1911): At a literary tea which filled Prospect Park's skating rink (floored with pine planks for the occasion) and overflowed into Temple Mogen David, Nightstand Books and Svetsoxa Inc. today brought out the first of twelve anticipated volumes of I Am Lucrezia's Daughter, the sensational memoirs of the woman who claims to be Princess Svetsoxa, eldest illegitimate daughter of the Empress Lucrezia of Balkania. Presiding at the festivities was publisher Mutinus Nightstand, who apologized for the Princess's "unfortunate indisposition, which makes it impossible for her to be here". Mr. Nightstand was unable to be more explicit, and spent most of his time making sure that some six or eight obscure hack writers had so much to drink that they were unable to talk to the press.

Copies of Volume I, autographed by the Princess herself, were distributed to reviewers, some of whom noticed that she had apparently used three or four different hands in signing the massive quarto volumes.

A sensation occurred along about midnight when a certain tabloid editor leaped on the pyramid of whisky barrels and proclaimed that "Svetsoxa is Lucrezia and Lucrezia is Svetsoxa".
