JOINT PEACE AND VICTORY STATEMENT, GERMANY & BALKANIA

We, the Governments of the Empire of Germany and the Federal Empire of Balkania (Austria-Hungary) in Game 1966AA, do hereby declare that hostilities in Europe are at an end, effective 1 January 1915. In so doing, we submit the builds reported in GRAUSTARK #149 and jointly agree to consider the game a draw.

In accordance with the agreements of 1910 and 1911, the Government of Germany cedes to Balkania the city of Moscow and its environs.

The wedding of His Imperial Majesty Kaiser Wilhelm III and Her Imperial Majesty Kaiserin Lucrezia having taken place during the last Yule Orgy, the Empires of Germany and Balkania now constitute the Dual Monarchy of Europe, dedicated to the preservation of peace, plenty, Bordschabiazin, greed, stealth, and free love.

In our opinion, the present victory was due to the following factors:

- a. The early destruction of France.
- b. The steadfast loyalty of Italy to the cause of Bordschaism.
- c. The failure of Turkey to do much but sit and await the sure hand of destruction.
- d. The constant vacillation, missed moves, and mediocre play of England, which led to the German-Balkanian Alliance.
- e. The heroic Boy Scout Troop 711 of Munich, whose hike across the Alps precipitated the Seige of Austria.
- f. Count Ritorno Vincitere, the Balkanian Foreign Minister, whose constant pleas for help so drove Germany to distraction that the German-Balkanian Alliance was signed just to shut him up.
- g. The Grand Empire of Sevastopol, which almost won the game by crushing the other players under the sheer weight of its press releases

Underlined moves are not possible. Germany retreats A Tyr-pio and Russia retreats A Don-Swe. The Italian fleet in Apulia is annihilated. The deadline for "Fall 1907" moves is NOON, SATURDAY 17 FEBRUARY 1968.

BERLIN: It is a shame that the Czar does not recognize that the Turks are sharpening their swords for Russian blood.

FREEDONIA: Against a background of worsening relations with the neighboring country of Sylvania, President Rufus T. Firefly placed full responsibility for mobilization of the army in the hands of Secretary of War Chicolini. At a news conference in the home of Mrs. Gloria Teasdale, President Firefly responded to objections about Chicolini's alleged foreign origin.

In the "Spring 1906" moves in 1967V, France's "A Bur-Ruh" and Germany's "A Kie-Ruh" stood each other off. This left the Ruhr vacant, so that the French army dislodged from Munich could not retreat but was annihilated. The 1967V players have already been notified. As soon as all of them submit moves based on this revision, the "Fall 1906" moves will be published and a deadline set for "Winter 1906" builds and removals. "Fall 1906" and "Winter 1906" moves will be published in GRAUSTARK #152.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE GRAND DUCHY OF BEAUCOILLON - XVII

Like other Renaissance principalities, Beaucaillon was troubled with factional disputes. However, none of these were based on ideology; the conflicts of Empire vs. Papacy, Catholic vs. Protestant, or class against class never troubled the tiny Grand Duchy. Most disputes dealt with division and distribution of the income from the gaming tables and other sources of national wealth. Typical are the events of the year 1644:

Jan. 29: Grand Duke Cesare II poisoned by his son, who succeeds him as Roger V.

Feb. 14: Roger V dies of la morte douce on St. Valentine's day; succeeded by his illegitimate half-brother Dionisio XVIII.

Mar. 9: Dionisio XVIII quarrels with his brother Prince Lorenzo over accepting a bet by Prince Rupert of England on the Royalist side of the English Civil War.

Mar. 11: Dionisio XVIII stabbed by Alonzo Gemignani, an assassin in the service of Prince Lorenzo. The prince succeeds as Lorenzo IV.

Mar. 13: Prince Rupert bets 100,000 ducats on the English Royalists.

Apr. 1: Lorenzo IV stabbed by Alonzo Gemignani, an assassin in the service of his nephew Cosimo. Cosimo succeeds as Grand Duke Cosimo VII.

June 16: Cosimo VII marries Carlotta di Pizzina, mother of the late Dionisio XVIII.

June 20: Cosimo VII poisoned by Carlotta di Pizzina. Her son by Cardinal Richelieu succeeds as Ganymedes IX.

July 9: Ganymedes IX stabbed by Alonzo Gemignani, an assassin in the service of Prince Fortunato, son of the late Grand Duke Roger V. The prince succeeds as Fortunato XII.

August 7: Patrice Cardinal Kelly, Bishop of Beaucauillon, refuses to marry Fortunato XII to his illegitimate half-sisters Voglinda, Velgunda, and Flosshilda.

August 8: Fortunato XII challenges Cardinal Kelly to a duel.

August 9: Cardinal Kelly crushes the Grand Duke's skull with a crozier. His brother succeeds as Cesare III.

August 10: Cardinal Kelly refuses to marry Cesare III to Voglinda, Velgunda, and Flosshilda.

August 11: Cardinal Kelly's communion wine poisoned. He is succeeded by Alonzo Gemignani.

August 12: Bishop Gemignani marries Cesare III to Voglinda, Velgunda, and Flosshilda.

Oct. 6: Cesare III loses the crown at roulette to his cousin, who succeeds as Ganymedes X.

Oct. 31: Ganymedes X disguises himself as a lady-in-waiting for a Halloween Party and is won at baccarat by the Turkish Ambassador, Hassan Hadda Bath.

Nov. 1: Ganymedes X resigns the throne and goes to Turkey to join a harem. He is succeeded by his brother, Cesare IV.

Nov. 29: Cesare IV poisoned by Cesare III, who succeeds as Cesare V.

Dec. 10: Ganymedes X stabbed to death by a frustrated harem girl.

Dec. 25: Cesare V poisoned at the Christmas banquet by his brother, who succeeds as Ercole I.

Dec. 26: Ercole I marries Voglinda, Velgunda, and Flosshilda.

THE STAND-BY RULE

Now that the two new GRAUSTARK games are filled, stand-bys are needed. The entry fee for a stand-by is \$3.50. For this fee, the stand-by player gets GRAUSTARK regularly as long as the game goes on, whether or not he gets into it, and whether or not he is eliminated from it.

If any player misses a move, the stand-by should send in the next set of moves for that country. If the regular player misses the next move, the stand-by's moves are accepted instead, and he takes over the play of that country.

Two stand-by players should be enrolled for each game. If two regular players miss the same move, it is GRAUSTARK policy to give the country with the greater number of units to the first stand-by, and the other to the second. A stand-by whose country is eliminated resumes his status as a stand-by.

In the past, both the first two stand-bys have usually got into the game after the first few moves.

Players in the new games should note future issues of GRAUSTARK for the names of the stand-bys in these games.

The shortest game(s):

- a) Alan Huff, as England, won 1966D (Barad-Dur E) in "Fall 1907".
- b) James Latimer, as Russia, won 1966E (Diplophobia PBA) in "Fall 1907" - - though this game might, by splitting hairs, be classed as a variant, since it allowed the "Spring Raid" in which Spring occupation of a foreign supply center made that center neutral.

First Game Winners:

1. Bruce Pelz, Russia, 1963B.
2. John Smythe, Austria-Hungary, 1964B (since he played only as a replacement in 1964A, and took it over from me after 1964B began).
3. James MacKenzie, Turkey, 1964A.
4. Charles Wolls, Turkey, 1965A. (He also won his second game, as Turkey, 1965F.)
5. Jerry Pournelle, Italy, 1965H (replacing Man Alderson). He also won 1966B as Turkey, his second game, and his first not as a replacement.
6. Conrad von Metzke, Russia, 1965B.
7. Don Miller, Turkey, 1965S.

I think that list is exhaustive, but I could be mistaken. A number of others (well, Monte Zelazny) won the first game they finished, but that wasn't the first they started.
