1968G - PRESS RELEASES

PEERISAILLES: The results of the Fall elections are in and it is clear that a decisive victory has been won by the "hawkish" People's Peerist Party over the "doveish" Peerist Progressive Party. However, the overwhelming People's Party victory was moderated somewhat by the strong showing made by the Young Peerist League, which captured 13% of the total votes, and 111 seats in the Council of Multi-Peerisites. Still, the war coalition formed by the two major parties clearly represents a national consensus as Frenciana faces invasion on a multitude of fronts.

Following the elections, which sent 666 members of the People's Party to the national Council of Multi-Peerisites, 222 members of the Peerist Progressive Party, and of course the 111 members of the Young Peerist League, a coalition government has been formed for the Peerocracy of Peeriland. (Note: Peeriland embraces Frenciana, those states which have voluntarily joined with it in mutual defense union, and other territories linked to the Motherland by common bonds of friendship and tradition.) The above members of the Cabinet and two committees form the PERICLAQUE which is the supreme governing body of Peeriland. It is presided over by the nation's highest office-holder, the PEERIMOUTH, who is appointed by Her Majesty. The office is currently vacant but it is expected that our beloved Queen will very soon announce it has been filled.

These announced changes in no way conflict with the governmental appointments announced in the Spring for Frenciana; however, as is noted below, there are changes there also.

PEERISAILLES: The Frencian Foreign Ministry today announced that the former Prime Minister of Frenciana had been replaced. While the cause of the Duc de Greene's ouster was not immediately known, rumors were circulating that the Queen was embarrassed by his poor performance during the first weeks of his ministry. It has been announced that the Duc de Greene has been appointed to serve as Her Majesty's Ambassador to the Maldivé Islands. Meanwhile, an interim Government has been formed under the direction of Baron Peripierre. The Frencian Foreign Ministry also announced that Frenciana would not reciprocate with a declaration of war against Germany in an effort to leave the door open for future restoration of good relations between the two countries. However, events vis-a-vis England were clear.

BREST: Her Imperial Majesty Lurlean IV, looking better than she had in months, arrived here in early December to observe the winter maneuvers of the 2nd Frencian Fleet which has been building here for some months. Her Majesty was reportedly so pleased with the fleet's progress that she awarded the Legion of Excellence to its commander, Capt. Jean-Paul Lulle.

PEERIS: Back from Brest Her Majesty spent Christmas Day visiting with newly conscripted troops of the 3rd Army which has recently been formed in the Ile de France. The Queen is reported to have promised a total effort to have the troops home by next Christmas next year if humanly possible.

PEERIS (26 December 1901): The Frencian Foreign Ministry today proposed that the Government of Frenciana recognize as legitimate the military dictatorship of Austria under Field Marshall Ivan Musicant. The Cabinet has taken the matter under consideration.

PEERIS: In her annual New Year's Eve message to the people Her Majesty tonight revealed the real reason for the recent departure of the Duchess of Westmoreland and the steadily deteriorating relations with England. "The situation has been and is exceedingly complex, which explains why English reports are so confused and contradictory. First, the man currently imprisoned in the Tower of London is not the Comte du Peri. Peri has been on a secret mission for us in Hellotidar for some time. The man the English have captured is really Karl Turnoff, the former Grand Sevastopolitan diplomat who has turned into a roving (for pay) trouble-maker. We have made excellent use of him. The English are aware of Turnoff's identity, but refuse to admit either this mistake (for Russia would be surely upset) or release the man. Instead he remains in the Tower. But as for the Duchess of Westmoreland. She was forced to flee from Frenciana when our Counter-Intelligence Corps (under Marshal de Peeria) discovered that she was in reality a leader of the John Boardman Society, a small band of anti-royalist, English supporters who seek to overthrow us. She had been here sometime as an English agent seeking to upset our government. She has fled for her life and if she reappears she will be arrested and brought to trial." In other comments Her Majesty revealed that Frenciana would go before the International Court of Justice to seek an investigation into claims that English Hessians have been guilty of Peericide in Norway. The Queen also promised to defend Frenciana's ally, Belgium, against English aggression. And lastly the Queen implied that she might soon bring forth a new commander to lead Frenciana's armies to victory. She referred to him only as: "MY LITTLE CORPORAL..."

HELLOTIDAR (ALLEN AND ROSSI PRESS AGENCY): (The following special report comes from Comte du Peri, Frenciana's ambassador at large who is here currently seeking an alliance with Hellotidar against England.) I arrived in Hellotidar in March of last year and have spent the intervening time studying the local political situation and attempting to win friends for Frenciana. How well I have succeeded only you can judge. The situation in Hellotidar is tense and confused. Although there are rumors that Hellotidar may soon go to war with Pollutidar, the lower kingdom, few preparations are in evidence. Instead, Hellotidar appears to be on the brink of civil war as two contending factions struggle for mass support. The largest faction is the Apogeians, who represent the masses of slaves and helots. The smaller faction is the Periogeians and their allies the Perioikoi who represent the intelligentsia of Hellotidar. The two are at opposite ends of the political spectra and no possibility for compromise is seen as possible, unless some strong outside force threatens them. Such a force may exist in Pollutidar.

LONDON (25 December 1901): The Ministry of Truth today announced that yet another plot by the despised and illegal sect of Christians to celebrate Christmas has been suppressed. The Ministry also issued an apology to His Imperial Majesty Emperor Honj of Pollutidar for the unfortunate error in His title. Communications from some of the Emperor's ancestors to the glorious King-Emperor Huon as late as 1673 had used the title "Putrefaction", and there had been no reason to suppose there had been a change in title.

GLASGOW (1 January 1902): Her Highness, the beautiful Lucretia, Duchess of Westmoreland, departed this northern port today in the dreadnought Invincible, bound for Pollutidar. The cargo of the ship included several captive Christians (in cages marked "CARE" and "To Pollutidar, with love") and 500 tons of nitroglycerine. As to the latter, Her Highness remarked, "I understand that some of the vents are clogged with ice

and rocks and things. We don't want our friends from below to have any trouble getting out."

LONDON (3 January 1902): Scandal of the season: Larry Peery is really Conrad von Metzke!

LONDON (5 January 1902): Scandal of the year: John Boardman is really William F. Buckley with a fake mustache!!

LONDON (7 January 1902): Scandal of the century: Lucretia Borgia is a charter member of the W. C. T. U.!!!

POLLUTIDAR: His Inferial Majesty Honj the Horny, Emperoar of Pollutidar, announced the arrest of the Compte du Peri, a spy from one of the noisy outer crust nations whose war is disturbing the tranquillity of Pollutidar. "Furthermore, this spy had been sending to the Outer Crust slanderous reports about our noble, free, and peaceful Empire," he told an audience of cave men, Amiocapans, Himeans, Coripis, Horibs, Sagoths, Shoggoths, Thipdars, Mahars, Koarsars, and Hirshibars. "These are the worst libels which have been circulated about Pollutidar on the Outer Crust since that fellow came through in his burroughing machine. In this connection, I think it particularly worthy of comment that one of the outer crusters involved in this last invasion was named Abner Peery." At the mention of the name of this aggressor, the entire crowd broke into a chorus of hisses, howls, catcalls, taragcalls, gnashing of teeth, smacking of lips, and heavy telepathic static from the Mahars.

"Fortunately for the peace and justice of Pollutidar," the Emperoar went on, "this spy has been apprehended, and will soon get just desserts. More precisely, he will become just dessert to the Trodons on the Inferial Zoo."

KOARSAR, POLLUTIDAR: Fleet Admiral Bobo Rygmus announced today that the Koarsar fleet is ready for any eventuality, should the Emperoar send them to the Outer Crust. "But this, of course, must await the arrival of the Duchess of Westmoreland and her entourage. The Emperoar has ordered us to go out to meet her, and to unclog her vents if necessary."

AMOZ, POLLUTIDAR: Emperoar Honj acknowledged worsening relations with the warring nations of the Outer Crust by banning the playing of the national anthems of Frenciana ("Peeriland, My Peeriland"), Germany ("Die Wacht am Wein"), Italy ("Lyndonezza"), Austria-Hungary ("Ich Bin Musikanter"), Russia ("God Shave the Tsar"), and Turkey ("Ballad of the Yellow Berets"). The English anthem, "Hun, the Night, and the Music" was exempted from this proscription.

"We are particularly concerned about the low moral quality of 'Peeriland, My Peeriland,'" said Blab the Talkative One, Minister of Impropropaganda. "One line goes, 'She bleeds, she burns, she'll come, she'll come.'" This is scarecely the sort of high moral sentiment we hope to establish in Pollutidar. The Minister then went on to award the Order of the Golden Tarag to the Himean composer Yawp for his new composition, "War Song for Drum, Bagpipe, and Tuned Skulls".

KUT-EL-AMARA (12 November 1901): This tiny Mesopotamian town was the scene of what promises to be one of the crucial battles of the Middle East War. On November 5, the Turkish garrison was attacked by the combined Iranian and Frencian forces. The attackers, realizing they could not defeat the Sultan's invincible legions in pitched battle, laid siege, expecting to starve out the defenders.

However, an heroic scout of the Turkish army, a native of the area named Mua'dib, managed to slip out of the Frencian lines and reach Baghdad. A division was dispatched to relieve the garrison, reaching Kut-el-Amara on the tenth. The Frencian forces attempted to escape, but were caught between the two Ottoman lines. A pitched battle followed, in which the Frencian army was dealt a decisive defeat. The Iranian insurrection has been crushed, and 7,549 Frencian troops were captured, including General Villeperi, one of the Frencian commanders in the East. The only note of darkness in the situation was the severe wound suffered by General Kiamil, son of the great Midhat Pasha, Grand Vizier 1876-77 and 1881-89. Midhat is generally credited with the judicial and legal reforms which reversed the trend to stagnation in the Empire and placed it again in the ranks of the world powers. It was he who prevented the partition of the North African dominions in the early Eighties and engineered the Constitution of 1888. His son Kamil, following his education, entered the armed forces, distinguishing himself during the Balkan Wars of the Nineties and rising to the rank of General. It is expected that upon the retirement of Mehmed Jemel he will become supreme commander of

the Ottoman forces in the Balkan theatre. He has twice been the target of Peerist assassination attempts, and as a result has become a dedicated anti-peerist. He is married to Lady Wenna Montchauve, sister of His Excellency, Baron Edwin Montchauve, Grand Master of Britain's influential Order of the Wolf, and Admiral of the Fleet.

CONSTANTINOPLE (8 February 1902): With less than two weeks to go until the Parliamentary elections, Minister of State Yorgo I Stefanopoulos announced the capture of Colonel Alexis Statkaer of Austrian Intelligence. Statkaer has, according to documents captured with him in Adrianople, been operating inside Turkish territory since 1897, mostly in Greece and Rumania, under the name of Nikolaos Platikis. He was involved in the Balkan War as an advisor to the Ethnike Hetairia and is suspected to have master-minded the assassination of Prince Mohammed in 1899.

I Stefanopoulos hinted at "startling revelations" in the manuscripts discovered with Statkaer, and according to an informed source inside the Ministry several of the Young Turks were implicated as receiving Austrian monies to finance their People's Party. It was also rumored that the documents prove that during his exile in the late Eighties

Mehmet Azizoglu, prominent in People's Party councils, joined several Peerist societies in Switzerland, and although no others of the People's Party leadership were linked with Peerism the suspicion is bound to arise that the party is a Peerist front organization.

CONSTANTINOPLE (17 February 1902, Official Ministry of the Interior Bulletin): Effective on this day, 17 February 1902, the Ottoman People's Party, the National People's Youth Groups, and the Armenian Citizenry Party are all outlawed and dissolved as subversive groups under the direction of a foreign enemy power, the Empire of Austria and Hungary. All citizens having information leading to the arrest of Mehmet Azizoglu, Kemal Misansioğlu, or Murat Sertel, or of any of the members of the above groups, should inform the local authorities. A reward is offered.

SCUTARI (17 February 1902): Mehmet Azizoglu, wanted in Turkey for political crimes, was seen slipping into Austrian occupied territory tonight, where he asked for political asylum. With him was Alexis Statkaer, an Austrian intelligence agent who was captured two weeks ago by Turkish police but escaped on the thirteenth and fled to Greece. News of his escape has not yet been released to the Turkish press, apparently to avoid an electoral crisis. (Albanian Press Agency Report.)

VALONA (3 March 1902): Turkish units took this Albanian city today, as the advance on Austria begins. Skoplje, according to reliable sources, is expected to be taken sometime in early April, and if the threatened Serbian uprising materializes the Janizaries should be at the Danube in July.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE GRAND DUCHY OF BEAUCOUILLOU - XXI

As the centuries-old playground of the world's aristocracy, Beaucaillon has never been particularly receptive to democratic ideas. At the time of the French Revolution, therefore, the tiny Grand Duchy served as a refuge for many French nobles, who took refuge at the court of Fortunato XVIII. However, they failed to find any support for their plans to return to power. This policy was contained in some whispered advice given to the Grand Duke by Count Giuliano d'Avino, in words which were preserved for historians by a girl who happened to be lying between them:

"Your Highness should find place for these noble refugees around the gaming tables in the Grand Ducal Bourse," d'Avino advised, "particularly if they brought any money out with them. But make no commitments which will alienate the revolutionary government. Somebody has to run all those confiscated estates, which means that there is growing up in France a new class of wealthy men who will soon seek out Beaucaillon for diversion. Furthermore, so natural is an aristocratic order to human society that, inevitably, the new government will create a whole fresh set of barons, counts, dukes, and princes to grace our salons. And of course we'll still have the original batch here, having cleaned them out so they can't afford to leave."

"But won't our own peasants revolt?" the Grand Duke asked. "We can't very well have the lower orders getting the idea that they have the disposal of their own lives!"

"As long as the money keeps rolling in, we can get them to do as we please," the Count replied. "Take, for instance, this wench -"

The account of their conversation breaks off at this point.

THE MINISTRY OF MISCELLANY

Some time ago your editor heard of a game which had been marketed by students of a New-Leftist persuasion in Orange County, California. The game was modeled after Monopoly, but carried bitter criticism of the existing economic system, including the immense profits reaped from slum real estate. Appropriately, the game was called "Avarice". Art Kunkin of the Los Angeles Free Press now writes that the game was never published, but was described in a student magazine at Fullerton Junior College as if it actually existed. Needless to say, Orange County conservatives were deeply upset by a game which makes fun of the capitalist system, and demanded that the college discipline students who demonstrated such unfitting levity.

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A musical based on the life of the "spy" Mata Hari will open on Broadway in December. David Merrick will produce this show, tentatively entitled "Façade"; the film director Vincente Minnelli will direct it. Marisa Mell, heroine of the film "Casanova '70", will play the title roll.

We may wonder whether the musical, which covers Mata Hari's life from her discovery in 1916 to her execution the following year, will correspond in any way to the facts. Mata Hari has become synonymous with "sinister, beautiful female spy". Actually, she was a Dutch girl, a dancer who became the mistress of a German general some years before World War I. The general did not have the funds to keep her in the style to which she wished to become accustomed - but he did have at his disposal funds for espionage work. He was accountable to no one for the use he made of this money, so it went to Mata Hari. When he passed her on to another German general, he passed on this financial arrangement as well. By the time that Mata Hari had been through 3 or 4 generals, she was carried on the books as a top-rate secret agent.

Unfortunately, she let this distinction go to her head. When in Italy in 1916, she let drop many lightly veiled hints about her exciting career in espionage. The Italians turned her over to the French, who were at war and in no mood to distinguish the boastings of a playgirl with the activities of a spy. She was unromantically shot in 1917.

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According to the Wall Street Journal, the National Casket Company of Boston has merged with Federal Drop Forge Co., which makes forgings for army tanks and shells.

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In answer to a question raised in GRAUSTARK #153 by Mehran Thomson, John Koning and John McCallum point out that Italy has won postal games 1965D, 1965H, and 1965I. Some will resign from government posts, others will ask for reassignment, while still others go into retirement or take long trips abroad. A few will actually side with the insurgents.

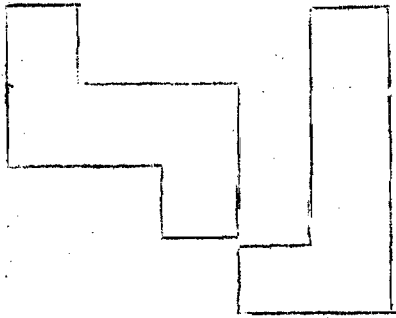
"The careful observer should also watch for signs of growing bitterness, impatience, and opposition among the intellectuals, professional people, and the leaders of labor, farmers, and students. Normally they stay close to 'the Establishment' and are merely interested in limited reforms and democratic change.

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"However, before every important revolution there have been signs of 'the desertion of the intellectuals'. This means that they have given up hope that the 'power elite' can meet the problems with which it is faced. The intellectuals are apt to talk much more freely than the government leaders and to show their disillusionment and anger more readily. Some will fall back on escapism, but many are ready to join the party of revolt. This occurred in Russia, in Egypt, and in Cuba, to cite but three examples. If there is evidence that both the power elite and the intellectuals are losing faith in a regime, there is good reason to expect a political upheaval of some sort." - Richard H. Sanger, Insurgent Eras, 1967.

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The polyominoes, invented by Solomon Golomb and popularized by Martin Gardner through his column in Scientific American, have been made the basis of a new game, Parker Brothers' "Universe". Like most games nowadays, this one is being marketed as a tie-in with a dramatic production, in this case Stanley Kubrick's new Cinerama film 2001 - A Space Odyssey. The game consists of a board ruled in squares, and four sets of pentominoes in four different colors. A pentomino consists of five squares joined to one another. There are 12 possible pentominoes, two of which are shown to the right. The game rules suggest one way of using them in a game; others appear in Gardner's The Scientific American Book of Mathematical Puzzles and Diversions.



The game has a list price of \$5.00, but New Yorkers can get it at half price at Digby's, a discount house on Cortlandt Street which is going out of business owing to the construction of the World Trade Center.

Yet in order to play your little game we must stray still further. Curiously, Augustine was born in the Numidian province of Imperial Rome, where the educated people, I suppose, spoke Latin. They were not black, as blacks are, though probably swarthy, since their descendants were Greeks and Tyrians. ((Don't you mean "ancestors"?) If you consider Spaniards, Gauls, or Syrians as civilized, then you should regard Augustine's compatriots as civilized.
