A BRIEF HUSTORY OF THE GRAND DUCHY OF BEAUCOUILLON - XXXIV

The economy of Beaucouillon went into a slump after World War II. This decline has been attributed to many factors. The end of the war made people more interested in planning for the future, and less likely to spend everything in one grand fling at the gaming tables in the Grand Ducal Bourse. Also, the American invasion of France had brought thousands of American soldiers to Beaucowillen, who insisted on playing nothing but craps. Their far superior experience broke the bank five times. Also, many of the noble patrons of the Bourse were killed in the mysterious collapse of Baren Czerni's castle.

With the gradual economic recovery of Europe in the 1950's, the demand for Beaucouillon's principal products also revived. This was in part due to the new policies introduced by Cosimo XV and his principal advisor Count d'Avine - the sons of the men who had guided the Grand Duchy's fortunes before World War II. (The previous Grand Duke had been caught in the collapse of Czerny's castle. His only living friend,

the elder Count d'Avino, took charge of the funeral ceremenies, and the wake developed into an ergy which d'Avino, at his advanced age, did not survive.)

Cosimo XV inherited a Grand Duchy burdened with debt. But, by adapting Beaucouillon's traditional economy to the necessities of the Cold War and Dolge Vita eras, he was able to recover his country's traditional place in the economy of Europe. To the traditional activities of gambling, espionage, and making book on wars he added currency speculation, film-making, and the collection of professional political exiles.

The explanation, or at least the outcome, became evident today.

By an everwhelming majority, the next President of the United

States will be a pelitical unknown named Figasus J. Fig.

LANDON (4 March 1901): Today the Swiss Censul, Dr. John Beredem, emerged on Flett Street and shot 06 passes-by, 23 of them fatally. When arrested, he demanded that the case against him be dropped, on the greunds that his victims had not been murdered, but only "executed". "My ebject," he shouted, "was to bring the horror of war home to the meanle!"

"War? War? What war?" commented the Frime Minister, Sir Mycroft Helmes. "We are astounded they his imputation of warlike designs to the Government of the Ninefold King. He couldn't be referring to our wellknown support of the Norwegian National Liberation Front, could he?"

For those of you who came in late, 1968BD is a game of Telephone Diplomacy. The players phone in their moves to Gamesmaster John Beshara, who adjudicates them and mails them out to the players. This makes it possible to play the game at the rate of one move per week, and to telephone players directly for builds, removals, and retreats. Much time is thus saved. This game began only 3 menths ago, and is already in its 7th game year.

THE MINISTRY OF MISCELLANY

Terry Kuch asks: "By law, no American can be portrayed on a U. S. postage stamp while he is alive. Name one man who was so pertrayed."

And, while we're at it, what weman was pertrayed on a U. S. postage stamp during her lifetime? Hint: She beat out the above-mentioned man by a considerable number of years.

Dave Jehnston asks: "Have you read Graustark, The Story of a Leve Behind a Throne by G. R. McCutchen, Herbert S. Stone, Chicage, 1901". In the 52 years of GRAUSTARK's publication, your Gamesmaster has been amazed at the number of people who did not recognize the source of this publication's name. (For a while the name was connected with a race-horse Graustark, who enjoyed a transitory fame a few years ago.)

Graustark, which is a German rendering of "Gray-Strong", first appeared as the title of George Barr McCutcheen's above-mentioned nevel. It was one of many such books, including Anthony Hope Haw-Kins! The Prisener of Zenda (1894) and Edgar Rice Burroughs! The Mad King (1926). The plets of such books were all cut of one piece. A handsome young American or Englishman (depending on the author's nationality) travels to a small, usually German-speaking country in eastern Europe and gets involved in an intrigue involving the succession to the throne. Ingredients of the plot are an impersonation of a member of the royal family by the here, a thoroughly villanous cadet of the royal family who plots to take the throne, a romance between the here and a princess, and numerous buckled swashes. Sometimes sinister red revelutionaries plot to dispose of the king, and are thwarted by loyal common people rallied by the here.

McCutcheon's nevel was apparently the best-known of these, beeause the whole genre is often called "Graustarkian" fiction. Sometimes small countries with unstable governments are deprecatingly char-

actorized as "Graustarks".

Other restal Biplemacy Winas have been named after fietional countries. These include Ruritania, Freedonia, Costaguana, Brobdingmag, Trantor, Wild 'n' Wooly, Frehwen, Thulcandra, and Kanadu. Can any reader identify the sources of all of these?

In GRAUSTARK 169 was mentioned Herman Kahn's article in the November Fortune, which had the arrogant title "Hew to Think About the Russians". The New York Times Magazine of 1 December 1768 has an article

about him, by Richard Kostelanetz.

It is impossible to read about Herman Kahn without recalling a sterestype common in the satirical fiction of two or three decades age — a sterestype such as Professer Schninkelfinger in the lame but humor—ous satire The Liberation of Manhattan by Edmund de Maitre and Mark J. Appleman (1949): "In my imagination I had pictured a cadaverous Torque—mada, with hollow cheeks and fiery eyes. And here beside me sat a veri—table cherub with small blue orbs as clear as a new-born babe's... It was still hard for me to realize that this jovial butterball had spent all of his mature years perfecting cheap and e ficient methods of kil—c Ring. He looked as if he would have compunctions about destryong a wembat."

With Kestelanetz's story, "Bref. Schninkelfinger" steps out of satire and comes to life. He is described as "a master strategist who can talk coolly about nuclear death, he years age got so ill from disposing of his wife's dead cat that she has since done any such dirty work her-

self."

Herman Kahn has diefly busied himself, since 1948, with the planning of world-wide thermonuclear war and the weapons with which it is to be fought. This is no drudgery with him, but an intellectual sport which he enjoys highly. ("I can be really funny about thermonuclear war.")

I have long believed that the supporters of war constitute, not a political faction, but a pathological manifestation. Herman Kahn is offered as Exhibit A.

Is Kahn Strangelove? That is, is he the model upon whom is based Dra. Strangelove of "Peter George's" novel and Stanley Kubrick's film?

Kahn himself has the answer: "((He is)) part Henry Kissinger, part myself, with a touch of von Braun". And who is Henry Kissinger? Well, President-elect Nixon has just appointed him as his assistant for national security affairs.

Dees anyone out there feel secure?

Farker tells, in a dramatic fashion leading up to the tragic climax, the stories of 14 air mishaps - if the comic-relief tale of Wrong-Way Corrigan can be called a "mishap". Among the famous air disasters discussed are the disappearance of Amelia Earhart (who was not spying on Japanese military installations in the facific), the tragic last days of the crew of the Lady Be Good in the Libyan desert, the Scottish crash that took the life of the Duke of Kent (uncle of Queen Elizabeth II), and the still-mystifying death or disappearance of Alfred Loewendtein. Some of these, such as the Lady Be Good crash and the death of bandleader Glenn Miller, do not any longer qualify technically as "mysteries", but all are compellingly narrated.

GRAUSTARK's ene-time sister publication FREDONIA took its name from the mythical country whose leadership Groucho assumed in Duck Soup. Freedonia has also from time to time forced its way into the 1767U gress releases.

Mest Marx Brethers enthusiasts regard either Duck Soup of A Night at the Opera as their best film. Duck Soup was produced at a time when, like today, conventional politics and economics had run the world into a hopeless lead end. The Marxes kid the hell out of "accepted" ideas of statecraft.
