RUSSIA: A Liv-fru; A War S. A Liv-Fru; A Ber-Sil; A Boh S A Ber-Sil. ((As always, underlined moves are ruled as impossible. A retreat is possible here.))

2. In the following example, can Sil now retreat to Pru? GERMANY: A Pru-Liv; F Bal & F Bot S A Pru-Liv; A Sil-Pru.

RUSSIA: A Liv-Pru; A War S A Liv-Pru; A Ber-Sil; A Boh S A Ber-Sil. ((Here the retreat is not possible. Prussia was left vacant owing to a stand-off.))

3. In the following example, can Sil now retreat to Tru:

GER IANY: A Pru-Liv; F Bal & F Bot S A Pru-Liv; A Sil-War.

RUSSIA: A Liv-Pru; A War-Pru; A Ber-Sil; A Boh S A Ber-Sil.

((Nobody can retreat to Prussia, for the same reason as in the previous example.))

((No. The rulebook states that "the space in which support is given must be one to which the supporting unit could have made a move if not opposed by other units.". The only modification of this rule concerns the provinces with two coasts: "A fleet which may move to one of these provinces may 'support' in such province... without regard for the separation of the coastline into two stretches: "))

EUGENE FROSNITZ, 200 Clinton St., Brooklyn, N. Y. 11201: Your citing of the Second Amendment is gun lobby propaganda. You imply that they have about a five percent case, when in reality they have no case.

The Second Amendment gives the states the right to a militia, i.e., National Guard. It does not give individuals the right to bear arms. The Supreme Court has so held many times, e.g. when they upheld New York's Sullivan Law.

No civilized country in the world allows the unrestricted gun use that we do. (After looking at Viet Nam, the Gun Lobby; Wallace and Chicago, one could hardly call this nation civilized. The fatt that the Russians are equally had (Czechoslovakia) doesn't exnuse us.) I've never gone along with those who see fascism under every bed, but it seems like the main difference between Germany in 193 or 1932 and the U.S. today is that Hitler got about 45% of the vote, and Wallave is only expected to get 20%. It seems like a thin margin of difference.

((This estimate, sent in in September, was like most estimates of the Wallace vote at that time inflated by half again as much as the actual total. Both these expectations and the actual vote were increased beyond reasonable proportion by Wallace's enemies, who characterized him as a "third major candidate". This aura of respectability

brought Wallace votes he otherwise never would have received, and made it appear as if his movement here some significance in the contemporary political scene. A similar spasm of publicity in the press would have done as much for the perpetual Prohobitionist candidacy, or for Bishop Tomlinson, or for the late Henry "Farmer" Krajewaki, the Secaucus pig farmer.

((But alas; for all the journalistic attempts to make this dribble of piss sound like the Wave of the Future. When the issue was submitted to the public, Wallace get only about 13% of the vote. And his political organization is already falling to pieces, indicating the transient

character of him and his platform.))

A year ago, I wrote some articles in <u>Xenegogic</u>, suggesting that the domino theorists were stacking their <u>dominous</u> all incorrectly. I voiced the suggestion that if a Kremlin master planner could infiltrate washington, he could not conceivably devise a better strategy that to send half a million men off to a corner of the world, where they would be doing nothing but killing peasants and burning villages, and not even engaging the Russians and Chinese who are supposed to be our enemies, thus leaving the Russians and Chinese free to sperate elsewhere without American interference.

The domine theorists should look at the record. In the past year the Communists have (1) supported the Arabs into Israel, with the Americans in Viet Nam too far away to cut support (fortunately, they didn't succeed, but not due to anything the U.S. did) (2) taken the Pueblo, with the U.S. left standing by helplessly (although it appears that we were spying and therefore did not have clean hands) (3) invaded Czechoslovakia, while we were twildling our thumbs elsewhere.

It seems to me that these dominees should be rearranged; when a theory is proven wrong three times in one year it's time to revise your

thinking.

Maybe the Birchers are right, and Johnson is really a Communist agent. I can't conceive of any foreign policy which would benefit the Communists more than our present policy.

((Now do I have your argument straight? The reason that the American invasion of Vietnam is wrong is, that it does not leave us free to

go to war in the Middle East, Korea, and Czechoslovakia?))

Back to Czechoslovakia: I blame the Johnson administration. (Although not as much as I blame the Russians). First, with all our resources and troops in Viet Nam, we were too weak to take a stand elsewhere. ((Yes, I guess I did understand you correctly.)) Second, with the U.S, saying "morality be damned" in Viet Nam, the Russians thought they could get away with it, since they would be soing the same thing in Czechoslovakia that we did in Viet Nam, therefore they thought they wouldn't be condemned by the rest of the world. (One difference, though, we were able to find a few puppets to invite us into Viet Nam.) ((They have some of their own in C\_echoslovakia. Who fired Smrnkovsky?))

Third, the U. S. government, according to reports in the New York Times and the New Republic, virtually encouraged the Russians to believe that we would give them a free hand in Czechoslovakia, and not make too much fuss about it. Rusk was quoted as saying "why should we help the Czechs, they are giving aid to North Viet Nam." A tacit agreement was reached with Russia, to the effect that we divide the world into spheres of influence, we can bully anyone on our half of the world.

((Also, NATO comes up for renewal next year. Before this Russian stunt, it seemed that several nations would opt out. Now this anti-Russian alliance has a new lease on life. This consideration may have carried considerable weight with Rusk.

If you are not God, I would like to know what gives your preferences precedence ever mine and George Wallace's and Alexei Kesygin's and Lyndon Johnson's, and why I may not decide that your own murder would be execution and therefore only right and proper. Lastly, if you think substituting Verster for Verwoord was an improvement, you are

mad. I always suspected as much.

((If you believe that there is no such thing as a "right of revolution" of the part of oppressed peoples, then of course all political assassination is wrong. From this viewpoint we can equally honor Reinhardt Heririch, Benito Mussolini, John F. Kennedy, and Martin Luther King as the victims of assassination and martyrs to their versions of righteousness. But if you accept this right - and no citizen of this country can with consistency reject it - then it follows that there are circumstances where its invocation is unequivocal, circumstances where there is some doubt, and circumstances where it is unjustified. To this extent an element of personal judgment does enter in. If a man praises the assassination of John F. Kennedy as a legitimate act of tyrannicide abainst an oppressive ruler, and mourns the death of Henrik Verwoerd as the martyrdom of a great statesman, we are perfectly at liberty to draw the inferences about his views that these sentiments indicate.)).

...the assassination issue...affords such a beautiful opportunity

for a debate of Boardman vs. Boar man on violence:

"It's the difference between taking murder straight, and spicing it with hypocrisy." - John Boardman, Dec. 12, 1967.

"I had in mind the assassination of ... Asanuma... Henrik Verwoord was executed. There is a difference." - John Boardman, Sept. 21, 1968.

May I suggest that the arguments you apply incessantly to mass political killing are also applicable to solitary political killing? You think murder is all right, if the victim is someone whose politics you don't like, but have fits if a government kills those in arms against it. Any justification you give can be used to justify killing Viet. Cong (Herrors!) or used by say, Reinsel, to salve his conscience if he decides to "execute" the great Boardman. If someone said that Dr. King. was "executed", you would instantly scream yourself into apoplexy.

Finally, you seem to lose sight of the fact that Stifianos killed Verwoord because he wasn't racist enough, paying lip service to "separate development" instead of undiluted white supremacy. Justification

seems to vanish in the light of this.

((The man who killed Verweerd was named Tsafendakis, net Stifianos. And en his mether's side he was a Negre. In this light I find your assertion about his metives difficult to accept.)).

## A BRIDE HISTORY OF THE GRATO DUCHY OF REAUCOULLION - XXXV

After General de Gaulle's 1958 coup d'etat in neighboring France, there was some concern in Beaucouillon that the more straight-laced tone of the new government might menace the traditional customs of the tiny Grand Duchy. Fenatical enthusiasm was the mark of a real man... Anyone who held violent opinions could always be trusted, and anyone who objected to them

became a suspect." - Thucydides, III 45.

((Odd you should mention Thucydides. The historical parallels between the Sicilian and Vietnamese expeditions are getting nore and emeracy ovident. In both cases a nation nominally committed to democracy but actually a plutocracy went in for empire building. These who objected to this policy, both at home or abroad (Melos, Pominican Republic) were suppressed with a vigor that reflected ill on the democratic professions of the imperial power. The war dragged on for years and years, causing an appalling slaughter, until finally the other states combined to bring down imperial ambitions that endangered them all.))

I am sure De Gaulle and Tito would be interested to know this.)


