The Russian army dislodged from Warsaw must retreat to Prussia or the Ukraine; the direction of this retreat should be phoned in at once. The High Combatant Powers control the same supply centers as they did after "1906" (see GRAUSTARK #189) except that Sweden and Warsaw have gone from Russia to England. England may build two new units, and France may build one. Russia must remove two units. These moves are to be phoned in IMMEDIATELY, since all 3 players live in New York City. The Gamesmaster will inform all players. The deadline for "Spring 1908" moves is NOON, SATURDAY 6 SEPTEMBER 1969.

## THE GRAUSTARK TOURIST BUREAU

Recently a number of Diplomacy and other war-gaming publications have printed lists of their readers and players. GRAUSTARK is taking advantage of this opportunity to send out sample copies to these war-gamers in hopes that they will want to subscribe.

Diplomacy, for those of you who are used to Avalon-Hill or other war games, was invented over 10 years ago by Allan B. Calhamer, who more recently has created Hyper-Space. It is copyright by Games Research Inc., 48 Wareham St., Boston, Mass. 02118, and available there or from the better games and department stores for \$8.00. Unlike most other war games, there is no element of chance. Players are dependent entirely upon their skill in maneuvering their pieces, and in making and breaking alliances at the crucial moment.

The game board is a map of the Europe of 1914, though "Spring 1901" is taken as the opening date of the war. Each of the seven players (though fewer can play, with suitable rule modifications) takes one of the seven major powers of the time. They try to seize supply centers from neutral nations or from each other, and for each supply center that a player owns he can raise one fleet or army. Conversely, a player who loses supply centers also loses forces. Forces can also be surrounded by superior power and annihilated, or dislodged and forced to retreat. The first player whose units constitute a majority of all the units on the board is the winner.

When I encountered the game in 1961, it struck me that it could be easily modified for play by mail. The players could send their moves to a referee (now called a Gamesmaster) who adjudicates them, prints them up, and distributes them back to the players. GRAUSTARK began publication in May 1963, and is now approaching its 200th issue. There are about two dozen other postal Diplomacy bulletins; some of them deal with the "Orthodox" game, while others adapt Diplomacy to other periods of history or even to the world of J. R. R. Tolkien's novel Lord of the Rings.

GRAUSTARK has gradually ramified beyond merely reporting the moves. With the first game, players began sending in press releases, and now rivalry in reportage is as much a part of the game as is the actual play on the board. There are also articles on strategy, and a letter column in which the conflicts of both the Diplomacy board and the actual world are discussed. "The Adventures of Secret Agent O-O-Hate" has been running as a GRAUSTARK serial for over 3 years, and there are comparable features in other 'zines, including "The Chronicles of req-lav" in Rod Walker's Erechyon.

There are currently six postal Diplomacy games running in GRAUSTARK, though two of them are now being briefly held up during the vacations of some of the players. At present I am not opening any new games, though there may be some next year. Other Gamesmasters do have openings for new players; see future issues of GRAUSTARK for details.

The rule modifications necessary for the postal play of Diplomacy have been printed in GRAUSTARK #190, which like other back issues of GRAUSTARK is 10¢, or 15¢ for \$1 as available. Subscriptions to GRAUSTARK are \$1.00 for 10 issues. Non-playing readers may of course send in press releases, contribute to the letter column, and otherwise profit from the play and discussion of the current games and their strategies.

LONDON (4 Sept. 1906) - Robert Jerkman of the Pure Fantasy Party today gave a pep talk to a mammoth rally at Trafalgar Square.

"The Russian people are suffering from the repression of a fascistracistcapitalistestablishment. We must liberate them from this horrible militaryindustrial-complex, whether they like it or not." (Loud cheers.)

"Remember, we are for PEACE! And there can be no PEACE until those reactionary-fascistpigwarmongers in Washington St. Petersburg are annihilated! Kill for peace!" (Loud, prolonged cheers.)

A twenty-three year old reactionary was flogged for daring to suggest that wars have two sides.

NEW YORK to ERIE: HAAAA yourself, David Saunce Pito! Dolos Harriman is subsidized by the CIA! HAAAA!

SALT LAKE CITY, MEXICO (28 Feb. 1907): The greatest manhunt in history is under way in this small province. Whole regiments are pouring into the Desert of Deseret to search for the one man with the key to New England - the mysterious Bangs Leslie Tapscott.

General Tillero explained the purpose of "Operation Agitation". "Our object is to catch this man, and drag him back, if necessary, to the supervisory duties which he has neglected so outrageously in Brooklyn. The results of his desertion are horrendous."

The Operation is further complicated by reports that Chief Crazybrannan has had his fill of peace, and is about to take the warpath again.

WASHINGTON: In a press conference at the Pigpentagon, Secretary of Defense Melvin Lard demonstrated new chemical weapons. The demonstration itself was classified, but as the reporters escaped, choking and gasping, from the building, they testified to its effectiveness. "Secretary Lard himself operated it," one of them said. "At first he was facing us. Then he turned his back, and the weapon was if anything more effective from that direction."

Secretary Lard announced that the first use of the new gas would be against opponents of the Safe-Lard CBM (Canis-Ballistic Missile) system.

WASHINGTON: President Pigasus J. Pig indignantly denied that he had meant Washington when he referred to agitation in Charleston. "I mean, of course, the strike in Charleston, Sows Carolina," he said. "Domestic problems can't stand in our way if we are to Make the World Safe for Pigs!"

VIENNA: The Eastern Reich celebrated the official occupation of Venice with great pomp; while they were engaged in a fierce fight against the last Italian hold-outs, Kaiser Franz-Josef telephoned them person to person, congratulating them on their achievement, and generally disrupting things. 400 Austrian soldiers were lost as they took time out to listen to Franz's stirring speech, in which he credited himself with everything but actually storming the noats of Venice. Most Austrian citizens don't like Franz and his ways, but are mortally afraid of anything happening to him, because the heir to the throne is Archduke Rudo-Olf, who is accustomed to saying, in the Hungarian dominns, "I've always liked Bohunks," and, in the Tyrol, "Some of my best frien's are Krauts." Some think he has been paid off by the French. Historians remember that he was awarded the Archduchy only because of his victory over Jorge Baloni, an aristocratic immigrant who attempted to rouse the nobles with his slogan "Your castle is your home".

WASHINGTON: The Safe-Lard Plan to establish a system of anti-ballistic missiles today passed the Senate after an impassioned speech was made for it by Senate Pejority Leader Everett M. Durocson (Ill.). "President Pegasus J. Pig and Secretary of Defense Melvin Lard need the CBIs to protect us against the menace of the Grand Duchy and People's Republic of Hernia," he told the assembled Senators. "The national emblem of Hernia is the goat, which means that when the Age of Capricorn begins 2160 years from now Hernia plans to rule the world. The CBIs are necessary to preserve the Pig way of life. Besides, we've already started work on it, and if we don't vote this money for it, our electronics stock is in for a serious loss!"

The adjudication of the action in Italy illustrates some of the fine points of the rules of Diplomacy. The French navy in Apulia attacked Venice with one support, that of the French army in Rome. This attack failed because the Austro-Hungarian army in Venice was supported by another in Trieste. Thus, the action in Venice was a stand-off, two against two. Since the army in Venice was attacked from Apulia, the support it delivered into Apulia is valid. Thus, thanks to this support, the Turkish attack on Apulia succeeds, two units against one.

## 1968CL - PRESS RELEASES

ROME (L'Espresso): The city is tense while awaiting news from the front. The President, who was just elected on the seventh election this week, spoke to the populace on WOP radio. "Our victorious armies are now stationed in France and Germany! Reportedly we have tried to find a solution to the present conflict. But could we stand by and let a militaristic government from the north impose its will upon the southern peace loving Mediterranean peoples?"

"But within our ranks we have so called 'patriots' who claim that our war is unjust. The funds could be better spent in assisting the Dag- (oops!) I mean the Sicilians who migrated from the farms to the city to COLLECT WELFARE, I mean to find jobs.

"I am not insensitive to the cries of the poor; I started as a poor boy myself! But let me say this, I have a plan to end the war honorably. Due to the sensitive situation I cannot reveal what it is yet, but MEETINGS are going to take place. I must have the blind (sorry) I mean loyal following of all Italians. The speeches by various elected officials, however well intentioned, border on treason.

"But let me say this. I am not questioning the loyalty of those POLITICIANS, but they should hold their tongues until they have public funds." ~~and you can~~

Immediate demonstrations were held in support of the President. Unfortunately, they were broken up when a chant was taken up that sounded like "Hell NO! We won't go!"

VATICAN CITY: A puff of white smoke was seen and thousands cheered! The new Pope was elected. After much political in-fighting a caretaker Pope was picked, a mild-mannered priest from Ireland. He has chosen the name of ibn Beshara (Son of God) in honor of the Patriarch of Constantinople. "It will be my task to heal the schism between the two segments of the Roman Church."

It is thought that the new Pope will reinstate the Knights of Malta and expand their activities to combine with the forces of the Patriarch to suppress heretical views being expressed in northwest Europe.

BEIRUT (An Nahar, via Rome): The main banks in this financial center pledged to underwrite part of the cost of the current conflict in Europe. The financial wizard of this Zurich of the East, J. Beshara, stated that "I think it is our duty to aid the poor refugees caused by the war. We will forget the exploitation of centuries. Our intention is not to exploit and control, this is against our nature, but to aid the refugee. We know the pain and suffering caused by displacement and political expediency. We have never asked for mercy, only simple justice. What did we receive? Ah, Europe is lucky we do not repay in kind. We might create a nation of Moroccans in Paris."

MOSCBA (13 Oct. 1906): The Czar today proclaimed a national holiday in honor of the German Ambassador. Early yesterday morning, the Ambassador, Heinrich von Spitzpolsch, was escorted by Russian honor guard from the German Embassy to the Royal Guest Chamber beneath the Palace. Most observers in the Palace are happy to see Heinrich had left the Embassy just before it mysteriously burned to the ground. (Troops had been called to the scene of the fire to keep spectators away; not to keep the Embassy staff in as has been erroneously reported.)

Von Spitzpolsch is reported to be in conference with officials of the Czar. Chief among these is Ivan Poitkoff, Court Master of the Torture Chamber. "Always the entertaining host, the Ambassador is said to be "singing" to Ivan.

Further developments are expected shortly.

MOSCBA (14 Oct. 1906): In honor of the latest developments in Russo-German relations, Heinrich von Spitzpolsch, German Ambassador will appear before a large gathering today in the Palace courtyard. The agenda for the day features Heinrich in his final appearance in Russia. Herr Spitzpolsch will "dance at the end of a rope" before the Czar.

Late word has reached us concerning the celebrations in the Palace courtyard: Heinrich von Spitzpolsch, German Ambassador, is reported to have suffered a severe strained neck as a result of his performance before the Czar. His condition is listed as "very quiet" by officials of the Palace. He is being sent back to Germany in a special train (code-named "Pine Box"). Word is expected from Berlin shortly.

PARIS: Forces of the Free French Republic today decisively defeated a small contingent of the Illuminati led by Clark Gungel, a charter member of the SMICC. To date they have had less success against the Italian-Turkish Alliance.

MOCKBA (14 Dec. 1906): The Czar, when informed of the German reply to his latest action, remarked: "The Kaiser had better be more careful. The Imperial Russian Fleet (three fishing trawlers, a garbage scow, and the battleship "Impotent") will reply to his actions against Russia unless the Kaiser returns the Russian provinces (Norway and Holland) he invaded. I have spoken!"

ST. PETERSBURG (20 Jan. 1907): The Palace today announced that the Czar, who had demonstrated his peaceful intentions by disbanding the Army of the Ukraine, may reply to the imperialism of Germany by rearming once again. In a speech at the St. Petersburg Cathedral, the Czar promised that unless "the beer-sippin' German Kaiser gives up his war-like and uncivilized actions," the Grand Russian Armed Forces would mobilize against Germany.

## THE DIPLOMATIC POUCH

ROD WALKER, 4309 Adams Ave., San Diego, Calif. 92116: I will agree with you that, given the red flag and nuclear annihilation as the only available alternatives, I, too, would prefer the former. A strong military establishment is, under most conditions, a good guarantee against either eventuality. Further, should we wind up in a nuke war, it does not seem likely that the cities will be prime targets. Each side will try to wipe out the strategic bases of the other. The only such base in the ConUS is Offutt, near Omaha. Once the initial exchange is over, the side with no nuke capability left has lost and ought to surrender. There is nothing wrong in admitting you've been licked in a fair fight. Besides, were we to lose in such a war, the peace terms would hardly be severe; I doubt they would amount to more than giving up western Europe. Several studies have been conducted into the conditions under which we would negotiate a surrender. The Birchers and other nuts have found out about some of them and have denounced them as "treason" as you probably know. However, I think it is essential to have some sort of idea at what point it would be



foolish to continue fighting, once war has broken out.
