THE DIPLOMATIC POUCH

JAMES A. BARBER: In #212: I completely deplore violence in the streets and also the people that just stand around and watch other people get beat up. (On page 28.)...By the way your last post card got here on the 24th (mailed on the 22nd) while your air mail GRAUSTARK got here on the 25th. Also my winter move (mailed on the 17th) took 4 days to get there [from Minnesota] (not counting Sundays) on the 22nd. That was quite rare.

HUGH ANDERSON: The last 2 GRAUSTARKs arrived on Wednesday [after the Saturday of publication] - airmail doesn't help. Buddy Tretick is wrong in asking for a veto on standby players. Last fall's disaster [in 1970M] may have had something to do with his decision to resign.

Keep the 2-week deadline:

CHARLES VEST: Tou have been in this business a long time, and if 2 week intervals has worked out for your game during that time, I see no reason to change it now. On the other hand, I for one find it very difficult to do very much diplomacy [from Texas] in the time alloted. By the time I write Jay Kimmel in the Bronx, for example, I will miss the move before he can reply - the mails being what they are: I for one would favor the longer interval, but won't push the issue.

MIKE LEHTONEN: I think you were a little premature in saying that Humphrey would have been elected President if Daley hadnit alienated the California Democrats. In the first place, Nixon carried California by almost a quarter million votes. And, in the second place, if the election had been thrown into the House of Representatives, the Democrats controlled 27 delegations to 19 for the Republicans and four split. But the Democrats would have needed 26 delegations to elect Humphrey in the House, and 5 of those 27 were from states carried by Wallace.

[Yes, but Wallace's jerry-built organization did not command the prestige or the patronage to attract Democratic votes under these circumstances. And Wallace would have demanded, as the price of his sup-

port, terms that would have been unpalatable even to Nixon.]

JEREMIAH B. MODEL: I've been playing Diplomacy with a local group of friends, off and on, for nearly two years. We play very infrequently, mainly because games leave us physically and emotionally exhausted, totally aggravated, and at odds with our wives, who detest the game s

tendency to bring out the worst predatory instincts in people.

- A former Gamesmaster on the West Coast attributes the breakup of his first marriage to Diplomacy. His second wife, fortunately, is a Diplomacy fan herself. Two local Diplomacy fans are no longer on speaking terms with each other on account of frequent disputes over the board. I regard it as only peripherally relevant to their quarrel that one is a Jew and the other is an Arab.

BERLIN (SNP): Germany is at WAR: The Kaiser said that as of October 13 we have been at war with the English. The Triple Alliance of Germany, France, and Russia will take England by storm in 1903. Through an agreement Russia will take Denmark and Edinburgh, France will take Liverpool and London.

MUNICH (LSMP): "Though the Pope died, the new Pope will lose all of his lands due to the cowardly attack on the Czar." This was said in a

speech given by A. Hitler in the Beer Garden of the Deadly Sins.

PARIS: Bearing their two-fold gifts, the German ambassadorial contingent composed of fifty of the Kaiser's famed topless beer maids received the warment of welcomes from the French government. Emerging from the private welcoming coremony Premier Dumass disclosed, "One thing is for sure, they're certainly not inscrutable."

PARIS: Premier Robert Dumass on this day, April 1, 1903, did formally declare war on Italy. Said Robert, "The abominable naval maneuvers of Italy can only indicate that Rome is in the hands of a degenerate madman. Treticcino the Paranoid must be stopped! So we're gonna fix his ass."

WOGASTISBURGER-NEUSTADT (1 November 1903, URRP): Today the Grand Duckess Pristing opened the first faucet for the new water supply of the capital of this tiny state in the Balkan Massif.

"This new water supply," she said as she turned the golden tap, "is completely free from fluoridation, chlorination, detergents, insecticides, and industrial pollutants of every sort. Our anti-pollution campaign thus takes another step forward in the struggle

to maintain the purity of our bodily fluids."

When the Grand Duchess turned on the golden faucet, it wheezed, sputtered, and emitted three eels, eighty-five tadpoles, eleven pounds of an unidentified solid matter which the Palace Gardener later seized for the Grand Ducal resebushes, and several gallons of a brownish fluid which the Minister of Agriculture described as "too thick to drink and too thin to plow". The Grand Duchess later met criticism of the new water supply by observing that not one artificial substance had been found in the water. "Every bit of it was perfectly natural."

Physicians were unavailable for comment on the Grand Duchess's anti-pollution campaign, as they were too busy treating a typhoid epidemic which has just broken out here.

HEUFUSS (3 November 1903, URRP): The Bobtailed Brown-bottomed Bobolink has increased remarkably in this agricultural province of the Grand Duchy of Wogastisburg-Schlämpebbüttel since the Grand Duchess Pristina issued a decree protecting them. Not one farmer has dared to set out birdlime or poison for these songbirds, which have thrived during the past year. This species, once thought in danger of extinction, may now be seen all over Heufuss and Strohfuss provinces, singing, nesting in threshing machines, or perched on barley stalks pecking delicately at the bearded heads of grain.

Meanwhile, local spokesmen for the Trade and Agriculture Ministries describe this year's barley crop as one of the worst in living memory. "We may actually have to import beer this year," said a horror-stricken official of the Bureau for the Balance of Payments

and Protzels.

PROPHET AND LOSS?

In the last issue of GRAUSTARK I cited a number of prophecies which had resoundingly failed to come to pass, including ones from such notables as Winston Churchill and John Foster Dulles. Under these circumstances, it seems foolhardy to attempt the same sort of thing. But there seem to be a number of interesting things shaping up, and I'd like to be on record about them in advance.

1. Civil war will break out in Italy sometime within the next two years, most likely as the result of an attempted military coup. On one side will be a group of high officers comparable to the group now ruling Greece, with backing from clericalists and landowners in southern Italy. The other side will be a melange of leftist groups, from the Communist and Socialist factions through left Christian Democrats, drawing their principal strength from the industrial cities of the north.

2. Leonard Garment, "special consultant to the President on civil rights, voluntary

action and the arts" will either resign or be fired within a year.

3. Right-wing groups have already begun invading and "trashing" the offices of peace groups. There will be much more of this, but instead of acting clandestinely the rightists will proudly identify themselves and take "credit" for these actions. Chief among them will be the Young Americans for Freedom, the Jewish Defense League, and Statecraft Enforcers.

4. A Los Angeles group will put forward the claim that Robert Kennedy was shot, not by Sirhan Sirhan, but by a private security guard employed by the hotel where the Senator was killed. The guard is an enthusiastic Wallaceite.

5. Before the end of 1970 an anti-American government will be installed in the capital of Cambodia. As a result, American planeswill be sent to bomb major Cambodian cities.

THAT CONTEST

In GRAUSTARK #210, a contest was proposed as the result of the apparent intent of many Americans to support and defend any action whatsoever taken by President Nixon. The contest was posed in this manner:

"President Nixon balls his daughters on a nationwide TV hookup. Using the style of any person (a public figure of a GRAUSTARK reader) who has defended the President's previous policy decisions, write a defense of this action of the President." (100 word limit)

Regrettably for such an inviting topic, only two readers responded, Michael Aita and Bill McDuffie. Entries and the persons to whom they were attributed are:

Aita: TRICTA NIXON: "Wow, daddy always said he'd bring us together."
McDuffie: AND NOW, THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES: "My fellow Americans: As you know, yesterday I took the unprecedented step on invading the sacred area yet untouched by American forces in the conflict in South Testesia. This operation, known as 'Operation Total Penetration 43', was conducted by allied ground troops under Genital Yung Hung Low. Attacking from My Coc province, these forces have completely douched the enemy defenses, commanded by Genital Ah Woo Wee. True, it took some time before our allies could be hardened into the strong tool they now are, but, and I want to make this pubically clear, they have inflicted a heavy pounding on the enemy. I am proud to report the total completion of this climactic operation to the American penal. All chastity aside, we have, in one stroke, erected the American symbol of freedom to the peoples of this subversive area, and shown the world that, in deed, America is not a paper Pussy."

Frankly, I don't think that either of these comes up to the level of my own suggestions upon posing the contest. Furthermore, the second entry, while amusing, is too long and does not address itself to the posed problem. I appreciate the efforts of the contributors, but I fear that I'll have to withhold the award of a free 20-issue subscription.

Would anyone else like to try?

THE PEJORATIVE PIG

"The Jews reject everything that pertains to the pig. The Nordic peoples, on the contrary, accord the pig the highest possible honor. In the ancient cult of the Germans the pig occupies the first place and is regarded as the first among the domestic arimals... This special honor to the pig, the sacred animal destined to become symbolic sacrifice among the Nordic peoples, has drawn its originality from the great trees of the German forest. Thus out of the darkness of earliest history arise two human races whose attitude in respect of pigs presents an absolute contrast...The Semites and the pig are faunal and thus physiclogical opposites. It is not unthinkable that the eating of pig flesh by the Semite sets up physiological disharmonies in his body... The Semites do not understand the pig; whereas this animal occupies the first place in the cult of the Nordic peoples." - Walter Darré, Minister of Agriculture in the Nazi cabinet, 1933

In the last few years the term "Pig", first applied to the police and then to the entire American authority structure, has achieved a remarkable currency. Like much New Left slang, it appears to have arisen from Negro slang, and in particular from Nogro prison slang.

This is a rather surprising development. The pig has been for many centuries the standard food animal among the poorer Negroes. Most of the meat components of "soul food come from the hog, and quite low on the hog at that. The Chinese, who are in a

similar situation, do not have this contempt for the pig.

The modern use of "Pig" is probably of Jewish origin, and was transmitted to Negroes by way of the Muslims along with the heretical form of Islam marketed for so many years by Elijah Mohammed. But the sizable number of New Left radicals of Jewish origin have seized eagerly on the term. It is interesting to note that these groups are the same ones who popularized the "Polack" and "Italian" jokes of a few years ago. These jokes were a retaliation against the anti-Jewish and anti-Negro attitudes shown by these ethnic groups. But pork is a major part of the traditional Polish and Italian cuisines, and it is from these groups that many police are recruited in major cities.

Radicals have not been the only ones to call the American establishment "Pigs" Not long ago an official of the American Bankers' Association construct d an elaborate and well-received analogy in which he characterized American government, business, and labor leaders as "Pigs". (GRAUSTARK #200, p. 8.)

However, many terms originally intended as abusive have been taken up and used with pride by the abused. The Anabaptists, the Gueuex of Holland, the Quakers, the Yankees, and the Torics all were christened by their enemies and have had these names accepted

by the people at whom they were directed. "Pig" may be taking the same route.

Two different commercial operations are making money off this process. In New York, two young patrolmen have founded Keystone Pig Enterprises. They manufacture buttons which show a pig with a patroIman's cap and the words "Support Your Local Police". But Oink Products is more ambitious. Located in Trenton, they are planning a whole array of pins, t-shirts, and other decorations. "In addition to his police pig line-up, he is introducing a Mafia line with...a pair of miniature coment bags; for veterans of My Iai he has issued a tiny gold-plated meat cleaver; for dope pushers he has a miniature hypodermic needle tie clasp; and for environmental polluters a laminated soot medallion (solid gold if you work for Con Ed)." (Village Voice, 23 April 1970; New York <u>Times</u>, 23 May 1970.)

This process is already boosting the professional pride of the people who have been exceriated by radicals. One My Iai veteran put it this way to Howard Smith of the <u>Village Voice</u>: "Being called the butcher of My Iai really used to hurt my feelings something awful. But as soon as I started wearing the meat-cleaver lapel pin it like

THE DIVISIBY OF HISCELLANY

In 1933 Ray H. Abrams collected the numerous pro-war statements of the American clergy during World War I into a book, <u>Preachers Present Arms</u>. Several of these quotations have appeared in the GRAUSTARK feature "Directory of Unfamiliar Quotations", par-

ticularly in #205.

These statements, from almost every Christian denomination, represent a screeching patriotism which, nowadays, would even embarrass Spiro Agnew. Every enormity that the Germans later practiced against the Jews, except actual extermination, was advocated as proper post-war treatment for Germans. (There was even a proposal for the mass sterilization of every German male.) There has never been a more convincing demonstration of the fact that Christianity is the most bloodthirsty superstition that has ever stalked the earth,

The message of Abrams' book is still valid at the present time. For this reason it has been reprinted by Herald Press, publishing house of the Mennonites, the modern descendants of the once-feared Anabaptists. This new edition includes Abrams' remarks on the clergy's attitude towards World War II and Vietnam. The list price of the book is \$5.95, but according to the March 1970 issue of <u>Fellowship</u> (in which it is reviewed) it is available for \$2.00 from Dr. Jerome Davis, Apt. C25, Friends House, Sandy Springs, Md. 20860.

Bob van Andel, 1141 Thomas St. S. E., Grand Rapids, Mich. 49506, is beginning a new postal Diplomacy publication, <u>Saeta</u>. The 'zine is printed on computer paper to look like a read-out.

The introductory issue gives the rules under which Saeta games will be conducted. The entry fee is \$2.50, but 50% off for N. A. members. (No, I don't know what "N. A." means.) Deadlines are the same as <u>Graustark's</u> - noon on alternate Saturdays. Subscriptions are \$1.50 for 10 issues. Van Andel plans to begin with three games.

GRAUSTARK, the oldest bulletin of postal Diplomacy, is published every two weeks by John Boardman, 234 E. 19th St., Brooklyn, N. Y. 11226. Subscriptions are 10 issues for \$1.00. Back issues are 10¢ each or 15 for \$1.00. They are available continuously from #195, with earlier issues available as described in #212 or #213. No new games are presently being organized. This publication is not edited under the supervision of Bangs Leslie Tapscott.

turned into a terrific joke. Now everybody loves me." (Village Voice, ibid.)

Poul Anderson, science-fiction writer and professional Nordic, put it another way in his column "Beer Mutterings" in Science-Fiction Review #36 (Richard Geis. P. O. Box 3116, Santa Monica, Calif. 90403) He expatiated at great length "to see if I could handle the rhetorial and logical style of today's most prominent sociopolitical thinkers". The subject of his concern was a persecuted ethnic minority "with the racial stereotype (of) a funny-looking person, tall, lanky, long-skulled, with a big nose and straight yellow hair and...easily sunburned skin". These people, whose history he traces from the dawn of the Iron Age to the present day, are called "People Inhabiting Germanic Settlements" or, of course. PIGS. He goes from racial slurs on them by Aristotle and Pliny, through their persecution by the Roman Empire and the Roman Church, down to the "castrating effect...on male PIGS" of the myths about latin lovers!

. Two other science-fiction writers have also got into the act. Harry Harrison has written a novelet (padded into book length by Avon) entitled The Man From P. I. G. In this book, an interstellar policeman with a trained herd of mutated, intelligent, halfton pigs ("Porcine Interstellar Guard") responds to a call for help from a newly settled planet. In the course of the book, as he defends this rather unusual force to the local authorities, he expounds at great length on the intelligence, courage, and innate nobility of his porcine charges. At a more mundane level, Dean and Gerda Koontz are out with a book on <u>The Pig Society</u> (\$2.95, Aware Books, 8535 3/4 Sunset Blvd., Los Angeles, Calif. 90069) with such chapter headings as "Sex in the Pig Society", "Law and Order in Pig Society", "Pigs and Epithets", and, as an appendix, "The Oink List". Illustrations are by Vaughn Bode.
