France may build three new units and Russia may build one. Turkey must remove four units. This gives France an absolute majority of all units on the board, even if no new builds are made. France, played by Robert L. Strayer, is accordingly the winner of postal Diplomacy game 1970M.

This game is one of the six that were opened in January and February of 1970. It is the third to be completed, the first being the "New Yorkers' game" 1970AG, which proceeded at the rate of a move a week and was ended by August. The second was 1970D, which ended in November. In both the previous games Turkey was victorious: in "Fall 1905" in 1970AG (John Beshara) and in "Fall 1907" in 1970D (George Grayson).

A fuller analysis of 1970M will appear in a future issue. For the time being, the supply center chart and roster appear below. The supply center chart indicates how many supply centers each country controls at

((I see no reason why an opponent of war must also necessarily oppose capital punishment; as Paul Krassner observed during a comparable controversy almost a decade ago, "Notice how all the Caryl Chessman fans finked out on Adolf Eichmann?" There seems to be a belief that prison systems are for rehabilitation, but no evidence for this belief exists in practice. William Calley has murdered at least 22 people, with malice aforethought and under circumstances that no civilian court could call anything

POSTAL SAVINGS

A week ago "temporary" postal rates became effective under the "postal corporation" plan. Since in government there is nothing so durable as the temporary, we can expect that these rates will be with us at least as long as the ones they replaced - some three years, let us say.

One unpublicized feature of the new rates is that the government has abandoned its plan to phase out air mail in favor of an all-purpose first-class mail which will go by air or surface mail depending upon which is faster. Contrary to the statement made in LEFTOVERS #4 at the time of the 1966 rate increase, we can expect to have air mail with us for some time. Furthermore, if the letter is going over 300 miles, some saving of time might be accomplished with air mail. All active players in GRAUSTARK games will receive GRAUSTARK by air mail, unless they live in Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, or one of the states north or east of these.

Another little-stressed aspect of the postal regulations is that any surface or air first class mail weighing less than one pound travels at a maximum of \$1.00, and will get air mail handling.

The new postal rates are listed below for gradations in ounces up to one pound. "Third class" is printed matter weighing one pound or less.

* - These rates are for surface mail. Air mail rates, computed by the half-ounce, vary depending on destination.

In addition, domestic surface postcards are 6¢ and domestic air post cards are 9¢. Overseas surface postcards are 10¢ while overseas air postcards and aerogrammes are 15¢. These last are the only overseas rates to be changed except for air mail to Europe and North Africa, which is up from 20¢ to 21¢ per half ounce. Mail to Canada and Mexico goes at domestic rates.

Special delivery is up from 45¢ to 50¢. However, this should be of little interest. It is general knowledge by now that special delivery saves no time whatsoever, and may easily result in delaying the letter.

Kaiser Cunnig-lingus is in charge here for a brief stint of only a few years, and will then return to his \$400,000 a year job as head serviceman of the "Wonder-of-the-World" hotel for rich young lovelies in Geneva. In the meantime, he sullenly stared at reports of the war, and licked his eyebrows. "There are better things to do than fight," he mumbled, as 26 of his advisers giggled and writhed their very comely bodies as closely against him as possible. Being a very firm supporter of the Lib movement, the Kaiser has hired as many as possible on the limited state funds left behind by the last premier.

GENEVA: The International Council of Churches expressed horror at the selection of the new German leader. "It's entirely too much of a change from the sympathetic treatment we received from Germany before!" according to the official statement. Larry Peery, 750 I Avenue, Coronado, Calif. 92118 (714-435-8803) has sent Press Release #1 of the San Diego Dipcon to all Gamemasters. Despite recent announcements that Dipcon has been cancelled, it is alive and well, and has been scheduled for 26-29 August 1971. It will include not only a Diplomacy Tournament, but also a tournament of Avalon-Hill games, other wargaming activities, and a few tours. Dipcon participants will go to the San Diego Zoo, the US Navy's Amphibious Assault Base, and other places where savage boasts are kept.

"A special effort is being made to get people from the east coast to attend," Peery writes. "We are considering approximately 200 to be our attendance goal and we hope at least 100 of that number will be from the east coast."

East Coast coordinator of the Dipcon is Walt Buchanan, Route 3, Lebanon, Indiana 46052. At this time diligent research is under way to determine what Indiana is on the east coast of. So far, all that has turned up is that Indianapolis was once awarded a baseball franchise in the Pacific Coast League.

Peery urges that potential attendees should write as soon as possible so that transportation and housing arrangements can be begun. On the other side of his Dipcon announcement is a questionnaire for Dipcon registrants.

Rod Walker asks for publicity for two of his multitudinous publications, Erohwon and Zothique. Erohwon has announced a special subscription rate for members of The Diplomacy Association. The regular rate is 7 issues for \$1.00, or 10 for \$1.50, but for TDA members it is 8 issues for \$1.00 or 10 for \$1.25. Published tri-weekly, Erohwon carries 8 postal games, Diplomacy news from all over, Rod Walker's History of Pedorlagg, Ahrydd Pedant's History of the Punic Wars, the scintillating poetry of Senilo Quiverlimbs, and some of the best press releases to be found outside GRAUSTARK. (Thus Walker.) Zothique, named after Clark Ashton Smith's tales of a decadent, dying, serecerous civilization, announces the opening of a new section of Aberration III, a 9-man variant, the "game of the copelless, hopeless, and hapless". If you qualify under one or more of those headings, you can enroll for \$4.00 and play either Ireland, Spain, Burgundy, Sicily, Poland, the Ukraine, the Byzantine Empire, Hungary, or Israel. Circumnavigation of Africa is possible, and units can move east of the Caspian; the entry fee includes maps and rules explaining how all of this is to be done. 1970M .. LATE PRESS RELEASES

MOSCOW: The government of Russia has only good will for victorious and defeated allies. We promise excellent treatment to conquered peoples (and request same for our own citizens under foreign control).

ANKARA: It seems that spears wielded by Russian forces removed from Turkish backs are of French make. The Tsar was reported to be hurrying peasants in the production of new arms. Bows and arrows were in short supply.

KOARSAR, POLLUTIDAR (URRP): His Inferial Majesty Honj the Horny, Emperor of Pollutidar, reported to the Representative Diet that recent events in Sicily portended a great increase in imports from Italy into Pollutidar. Principal imports were garlic, tomatoes, olive oil, pasta, peppers, and Italians. The Mahars, Azarians, Coripis, Horibs, and other anthropophagous races are eagerly building Italian restaurants.

(This henceforth will be referred to as the NFFFGDD, or, "Bunchaletters".)

At this stage a little history might be in order. In February John Beshara suggested to me the desirability of a Diplomacy organization. I had generally been opposed to such an idea, since past Diplomacy groups seemed to get bogged down fairly easily in arguments over rating systems or personalities. However, John convinced me that a group to help new players get acclimatized into postal Diplomacy, and to serve as a forum for discussion of the rules, would be useful.

A discussion among John Beshara, Edi Birsan, Dick Miller, and myself on 25 February led to the formal organization of TDA. We agreed at that time to make the membership of the Board as geographically widespread as possible by writing to prominent Diplomacy players and Gamesmasters in other parts of the country and enrolling them. This Board would run TDA affairs until the first elections could be held.

On 6 March there was an across-the-board game at my home, which brought out about a dozen local players. John Beshara announced TDA then, and showed a copy of the official announcement which was published a week later.

Anent all this, Rod Walker claims that he was never informed in advance of TDA's founding. Yet John Beshara did in fact send him such an announcement, a week in advance of the general announcement through GRAUSTARK and other publications.

In an article appropriately entitled "The Lurker at the Threshold", Walker has disclosed an alleged "conspiracy" which might be more appropriate to the fiction of the author from which he has borrowed this title. In fact, the whole tone of Walker's writings on TDA remind the Lovecraft enthusiast of some old Lovecraftian New Englander, brooding in a garret about historic wrongs inflicted on his line in 1692, and meditating a supernatural disaster to be released upon his fancied foes.

The facts are rather more mundane. Walker's name was not even mentioned at the meeting at my home on 6 March, or at the earlier meeting at John Beshara's on 25 February. So much for the "conspiracy".

Since its founding, TDA and particularly John Beshara have been very busy in contacting people. A board of directors spanning the country, and representing points of view definitely independent of the New York founders, has been organized; its members are John Beshara, Walt Buchanan, Jerry Model, Brenton Ver Ploeg, and myself. New players have been sought out and brought into the mainstream of postal Diplomacy; these include nothing less than two entire clubs in local high schools. Most of the recent increase in the GRAUSTARK mailing list has been due to TDA activities, and I am sure that other publishers can say the same.

Wazir #1, the first issue of TDA's publication, has provided the sort of service which we had in mind when TDA was founded. Among other things of use to both beginning and advanced players, it announced the availability of photostatic copies of the rules from Walt Buchanan, dis-

cussed the forthcoming rulebook revision, published a list of new players and available game openings, and printed an article on strategy in Diplomacy.

(Wazir is available with TDA membership, which is \$1.00 from John Beshara, Apt. 1021, 155 W. 68th St., New York, N. Y. 10023. A new printing of Wazir #1 from the original stencils has been necessitated by the heavy demand for it.)

There has been some criticism of the slanging which has appeared in GRAUSTARK articles, letters, and press releases between John Beshara and Rod Walker. Since part of this controversy was a refusal by Walker to print Beshara's press releases, I don't want to get into this bag by censoring them. As for articles, Walker and the others who have taken issue with Beshara over his article "Coastal Crawl, Crawling Retreat, Cripes" in GRAUSTARK #235 have publications of their own. They can, and have, taken part in this matter in those 'zines. Let them.
