ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

A few years ago, an author whose name slips my mind at the moment wrote a book entitled <u>One Week in March</u>. This book surveyed the first week of March 1933, when the United States and Germany inaugurated the regimes that were to bring those countries out of the Depression and ultimately into conflict with each other.

Eventually, somebody will do something of the sort with the week that has just ended - a week which has been full of enough major news stories to drive newsmen to distraction. We have just had:

- l. The tragic deaths of three Soviet astronauts, whose re-entry capsule apparently depressurized as they were returning from 24 highly successful days in orbit. It is to be hoped that this accident does not lead to the termination of the promising efforts to establish a manned orbital laboratory.
- 2. The U. S. Supreme Court, or to be precise a desperately foolhardy six-man majority thereof, has upheld the newspapers who have printed the "Pentagon Papers". These papers, which showed just how Presidents Eisenhower, Kennedy, and Johnson got the U. S. into the Vietnamese Civil War, will probably have no effect whatsoever in ending that war. However, their publication will probably have a very unpleasant effect on the newspapers who have defied our masters in Washington. For they are by no means in the clear, despite whoops of joy in their editorials. There will still be prosecutions against the newspapers and members of their staff for being in possession of stolen property - and since the stealing could be interpreted as involving espionage, the law under which Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were executed may be called into effect. Those people who put their trust in certain obsolete 18th-century guarantees will be painfully surprised to learn that they have ceased to be of effect. As those who have been aware of the Chicago 1968 and Washington 1971 situations are aware, the "First Amendment" is now a part of legal anachronism, along with ordeal by combat, mortmain, scandalum magnatum, and the constitutional requirement that war be declared only by act of Congress.
- 3. The attempted assassination of Joe Colombo, by a Negro hired gun or fanatic militant (accounts differ) who was himself shot to death. What this will do to ethnic relations in New York is anybody's guess.

4. The expiration of the Selective Service Act - and the SS's determination to go ahead as if nothing had happened to its legal authority.

5. The first Australian aboriginal to make an international reputation has done so - on the center court of Wimbledon. Irene Goolagong may do more than all the tribal leaders of her people to ensure equality of treatment in Australia's notoriously racist society. Parallels with Jackie Robinson and Learie Constantine (who died this week) come to mind.

6. Miss Bernardette Devlin, M. P., announced her pregnancy - which may have the same effect on Irish nationalism as did the love affair of Charles

Parnell and Kitty O'Shea some 80 years ago.

7. The first tentative contacts have been made between Israel and the USSR, towards an improvement of relations - with possible portentous consequences towards a Middle Eastern realignment. (See p. 4)

Peace is not a product of wishful thinking, nor + In other words, of happenstance. Like genius, it is 99% perspiration. In establishing peace, it seems to me that there are two cardinal rules.

1. The peace must be realistic. It must re-

fleet the actual situation and not imaginary ones. The Peace of Versailles failed primarily because it was based on the following utterly false assumptions:+ that Germany had started the war, that Germany had been defeated, and that Germany was now a secondrate power. The world later paid a heavy price for believing such ludicrous notions.

2. The peace must be enforced. It is not the terms of enough to declare peace, to sign treaties, and "send + the peace." the boys home".. There are always those who will seek+ to upset the peace, to make war again. They must be +

Why peace in the Middle East? First, because that unhappy area deserves a little peace. Fourth, the fact that Arabs and Jews will not cease to make war upon one another, until they have been deprived of the power to do so.

How do we achieve peace? It seems to me that only a thoroughgoing renovation of things, rigidly enforced by supernational agencies, will solve the problem. While some of the Arab states might not agree to the following plan of their own wills, they should be induced, by force if necessary, to do so.

l. Israel will be confirmed in full possession of all territories occupied as of 1 January 1971. That means all Palestine, the Golan Heights, and Sinai. Palestine is hers by right. The loss of the other territories will be apt punishment for the states who femented and premoted this war in the first place.

2. The peace will be supervised by an international Commission composed of the USSR, (West) Ger-In ormany, and Japan (decisions by majority vote). der to make this more palatable to the USSR, the NATO could be dissolved, or Germany released from NATO, to+ make her a neutral. Further, Japan could sign an alatance with the USSR as well as with the USA (thus establishing a salutary community of interests between the Pacific Powers). The USSR, as Chairman, would have her primacy over the Middle East confirmed. At the same time, Germany and Japan would represent the European and Far Eastern interests in + Middle Eastern bil (a commodity which the USSR does not need). France could, of course, be substituted for Germany, and India for Japan.

Those to + be resettled must be accepted by Egypt, Syria, Jor- + dan, and Iraq on the same basis. The decision, once + made by an individual refugee, is irrevocable.

The most important facet of such a settlement ist that it effects a radical alteration in the relation—the ships of the Great Powers. In a sense, it is accept—ting a development which has been threatening to take to place for some time, and is probably a case of the rape being inevitable leading to relaxing to enjoy it. Let me suggest some of the ramifications of this the proposal.

First, it will markedly reduce world tension.

A good deal of our difficulty with the USSR is our ridiculous determination to keep them out of everywhere, even places where they belong. They have long+ resented our large-scale influence in the Middle East, - just as we would resent Russian control in Mexico. + They regard it as unfair, with good reason. An American withdrawal would remove what I regard as the ma-+ jor stumbling block to amicable relations with the Soviet Union.

Second, it will tend to restore order to the Middle East. This is not only because the Arab-Israeli nonsense will be over, but because Russia will + be the Great Power guardian there. As the Eastern European experience has shown, the Russians are effi-+ cient, if ruthless, in this role. A firm hand from outside is something the Arab states apparently need.+ Hopefully, the arrangements proposed will allow the Russians to play this needed strong role under conditions which will discourage the more unwholesome manifestations of national interest which occurred in-Hungary and Czechoslovakia. It is of course doubtfult in any event whether the Russians would be as inter- + ested in putting tanks in Cairo as they were in put- + ting them in Prague.

Third, it will tend to alter the Soviet rele in + world affairs. This role has become far less aggressive over the past 20 years, owing to increasing Sov-+ iet security and enlarged Soviet responsibilities. Saddling them with such a large area, full of factious Arabs, should keep them as nicely tied down as 4

THE MINISTRY OF MISCELLANY

In GRAUSTARK #239 was a table of the new domestic postal rates. On 1 July new rates for overseas mail came into effect. (These new rates exclude Canada and Mexico, for which all rates, first and third class, surface and air, are the same as the domestic ones.)

Overseas air mail is 17ϕ per half ounce for western hemisphere countries, and 21ϕ per half ounce for the eastern hemisphere. Aerogrammes and air postcards are 15ϕ .

For surface mail, postcards are 10ϕ , while first and third class mail rates are as follows:

Readers may want further elucidation on the point, mentioned on p. 5, that the modern Lebanese are substantially the ancient Canaanites. When the Israelites conquered the southern half of Canaan in the 12th century BCE, it was inhabited by people who took their name from the reddish-purple dye produced by a local shellfish; this was "Kanalan" in their own language and later was "Thoenicia" in Greek. They spoke Hebrew, along with such neighboring peoples as the Moabites, Armonites, Aralekites, Edomites, and others who traced their ancestry to the eponymous "Eber". (It is not known what language the Israelites spoke at the time. Aramaic is as good a guess as any.) The southern regions, which fell under the rule of Yahweh-worshipping kings (Israel, Judah) were politically and culturally separated from the norther. Canaanite Phoenician city-states along the coast, though their rulers adopted the Canaanite language which we now call "Hebrew". Many centuries later the Muslim Arabs overran this whole region. The Caraanites, who had maintained their cultural identity under Asshurian, Khaldaian, Fersian, Greek, and Roman rule, took on the new language but generally managed to maintain the Christian religion and the well-known commercial acumen of the Phoenicians. To this day their culture is quite diverse from that of the Arab-speaking peoples of neighboring countries. It is "Arab" only in language.
