BERLIN (13 Dec. 1902): The Foreign Office today announced the Kaiser and His family will journey to Munich to supervise the construction of a new bridge over the Isar. While in Munich, the Kaiser plans to meet with special envoys of the Austrian government to discuss the invasion of the Tyrol by Italian mercenaries.

Appeals are being sent to Rome and Switzerland, in the hope a peaceful solution will be found to the problem posed by the Italian insurgents, but the negative attitude of the

Italian government may mean eventual war.

BERLIN (14 Dec. 1902): The German General Staff announced plans to fortify the present line of troops extending through Holland and the Ruhr, in anticipation of French attacks. The General Staff further announced strategies for a naval bombardment of Belgium, should French attacks on Holland continue.

PASSAU (Special): A secret highly classified meeting took place here recently-between high efficials of the Austrian and German governments. However, I was able to obtain at great risk a copy of the minutes. I am releasing them to the press in the hope that the publicity will avoid an even greater conflict than now exists. The Germans have agreed in principle to aid the Austrians in expelling the Italians from Austrian soil. How this will be accomplished is being left to future meetings. I will endeavor to continue to inform the public when and if this occurs. — T.R.S.

In "Spring 1901" the English move "A Liv-Edi" was incorrectly printed as "A Yor-Edi".

CONSTANTINOPLE: Turkish Empire sends regards to Austria. We are very sorry to have betrayed you twice. But we have a thought that if one allies oneself with a very strong neighbor (as you would have been), he will soon devour one when no longer needed. Or at best Turkey would have been a second rate power throughout the game on your terms. This would not be pleasing to our emperor. Please try to understand.

BERLIN (21 Sept. 1901): Kaiser Gutgulf today informed the press of the mission of the First Imperial Fleet: to collect Swedish weed samples. The fleet was dispatched upon hearing rumors that the Swedes had developed a strain of grass to rival the infarous Bavarian Blue, a particularly potent variety of Cannabis sativa. Gutgulf said it was intolerable that anyone better his favorite blend.

OREBRO, SWEDEN (1 Oct. 1901): The special task force detached from the First Fleet to sample Swedish flora, lead by the Head, reported on the mission. According to the Head, "This Swedish shit is all right (pass the pipe, Falstaff), but nothing like that Bavarian we tried. Otto, bring me another six ham and cheese on rye."

ROME (Oct. 1901): The huge hippie force located in the hills of Piedmont have been ordered to sack Marseilles in hopes of raping the Girl Scout Troop there. First the grapes, and then the cherries, we say.

VERSAILLES (22 July 1901): Today the Health Ministry clarified the previous announcement concerning vaccination against "Hungarianpox". THE MINISTRY OF MISCELLANY

After much consternation and speculation, James Reston of the New York <u>Times</u> (14 January 1972) has finally identified the man responsible for all the information "leaks" out of Washington. No, it's not Daniel Ellsberg, Jack Anderson, Anthony Russo, or even Henry Kissinger. "The real source of the leaks is Chester Carlson, who invented the electrostatic copying or Xerox system which now dominates the Federal Government and influences the flow of information in every other big institution in the country."

Reston goes on to observe that every "department, agency, bureau, section, sub-section, secretary's office, assistant secretary's office and secretary to the assistant secretary has a copying machine, or access to one". This means, of course, that just one aide, secretary, or filing clerk who wants to make some secret papers public is able to - much to the benefit of the public's right to know and to the consternation of bureaucrats who find that they can no longer cover up their mistakes by stamping them "Secret Sensitive".

(Reston, as a charter member of the Cold-War Liberals' Propaganda Corps, is of course opposed to this development. Incredibly, he argues that this technique "is not encouraging

honest dissent, but blocking it.")

Most of the people who are upset about the leakage of US government documents will cite with glee the spread of this sort of thing in the Soviet Union. That nation's bureaucracy is also using Xerox-type machines heavily, and there as here dissenters are making unauthorized use of them. Samizdat, "self-published" material, circulates in most major Soviet cities. It is almost impossible to track down authors and publishers.

Even in the world of postal Diplomacy we see this development. Numerous publishers use Xerox machines or computer print-outs for their 'zines, and it is safe to say that not one of them has authorization from the machine's owner for this activity. Even aside from other considerations, the high cost of such printing methods (compared with mimeography or dittography) makes it profitable for these machines' owners to keep a tight control on their unauthorized use.

There is a likelihood that Xerox and its competitors may, under government pressure, manufacture their machines in such a way that it will be possible to trace the specific machine upon which a given copy was made. There has already been an attempt to track down the documents liberated from a Pennsylvania FBI center in this fashion. If this happens, one side effect may be to make it impossible to use Xerox machines to publish Diplomacy bulletins. Such publishers should have alternate means of publication available.

The latest recruits to the movement towards ethnic consciousness are Jews, particularly in the major centers of Jewish population in the US. At Brooklyn College, where I teach, the Jewish enrollment in the past decade has fallen from 85% to 60%. Some local Jews have concluded that as a result Jewish cultural identity is in danger of extinction.

Perhaps the most interesting evidence of this concern was in a publication called <u>Jewish Orthodox Youth Speaks</u> ("JOYS"), published by a nearby Orthodox Yeshiva. About a month ago the campus was virtually papered with copies of its January issue. On the front page were two articles that neatly expressed, between them, <u>JOYS</u>; views This is of the world. One of the articles complained bitterly that the Soviet Union was out to suppress Jewish cultural life in that country. The other demanded, O At in very strong language, that Israel forcibly suppress all Christian missions! P Great

The United States Postal Service is apparently going to raise the one-cunce domestic surface and air mail rates to 9¢ and 12¢ respectively, sometime later this year. An alternative suggestion has been made by two executives of Pritchard Advertising, a Cincinnati firm. (New York Times, 14 January 1972) They feel that the USPS, which is supposed to run the postal system at a profit, ought to sell advertising space on stamps. "If you're already gasping with horror at the thought, remember for a moment that metered mail already carries advertising, and it's not all that pretty."

Designs suggested by Pritchard include an 8¢ Hertz U-Drive, a 8¢ Hawaiian Punch, and a 12¢ Braniff Airmail. USPS has put the suggestion in the hands of an advisory committe. In case they reject it, GRAUSTARK subscription rates will rise to 7 issues for \$1 on the effec-

tive date of the rate increase. Back issues will go to 10 for \$1.

"A whole rigmarole of ritual and belief grew around the cannons ((belonging to the Sultan of Morocco)). They became, in effect, ambulant representatives of His Chereefian Majesty's person, possessing his power of baraka or blessing, his power to cure diseases, to receive petitions and offerings, and to grant asylum. Underground cartoonist Gilbert Shelton's new game Feds and Heads was reviewed in GRAUSTIRK #246, following its publication in Playboy. But Clay Georges reports in the Los Angeles Staff of 24 December 1971 that another simulation game based on dope dealing is now in production. It's called The Official Dealer McDope Dealing Game, and is based on the underground cartoon egaracter of that name. The designers of the game are Thomas El-

ton Patchett Jr. and Dave Sheridan.

Patchett got the idea in 1970, when he came across a game for juiceheads entitled Pass-Out. He tried to market his invention to <u>Playboy</u>, but they already had Shelton's game and weren't interested in another. Dealer MeDope (a character used by several underground carteonists including Shelton) is in game form now being assembled in San Francisco by last Casp Ece-Fannies; it is financed by Rip-Off Press, which prints most underground comics.

The Staff didn't include a picture of the game board, but it did show the currency used in it. The verious denominations of bills illustrate the following people:

35,000 - R. Reagan

\$50,000 - The Freak Brothers

10,000 - Spiro T. Agnow

\$100,000 - Ulysses S. McDepo

20,000 - J. E. Hoover

It is issued by the United Heads of America through the Department of Spare Change of the Bank of Mary Jane. Sheridan, another underground cartoonist, did the game's artwork.

Patchett has also allogodly invented "the Peanuts card game". Further details on his games will be reported if either of them ever gets this far east.

Moanwhile, Mike Willner says that he and Herb Barents want to start a postal game of Origins of World War II and are looking for a Gamesmaster. I would be glad to undertake this role as soon as my copy of the game arrives; it's now on order. I only want to run one game; it will be published in GRAUSTARK. See later for details.

Writer-Director Poter Watkins has brought out a war film which, to judge from the reviews, ought to be well-liked by Diplomacy fans. The Gladiators presumes that Sweden brings out a war-simulating computer which the world's powers use to simulate wars and accept its decisions. "The games, much in the manner of ancient gladiatorial meets, are intended to divert national aggressions." (Frances Herridge, New York Post, 22 October 1971)

Using picked champions or other surrogates to fight wars usually dosn't work, as was evident as long ago as the Pelopponesian War. (See Thucydides' report about what happened when Sparta and Argos decided to settle everything on a bout of 50 picked fighters per side.) And that's how it works out in the film, too. A review from someone who's seen it would be appreciated.

In case you haven't heard - there are no new games available in GRAUSTARK, and probably wen't be for over a year. But stand-by players are needed for some of the new games, at \$3 each. See #252 for information about stand-by status, and for the GRAUSTARK postal Diplomacy rules generally.
