## GERMANY DEFIES FRANCE, POPE DEFIES EXPLANATION

ENGLAND (Abbott): Builds F Lon, F Liv.

BERLIN: The German government is reasonable enough to consider any initial hostile contact in Belgium accidental and a situation which can be discussed reasonably and sensibly. We cannot however overlook the French invasion of Munich as anything but a direct act of war. We are sorry that France finds it necessary to force us into the English camp and thus create two enemies where there had been only one. We hope that the people of France will soon see the desasterous policy its government is following and arise before their land is in ruin. We appeal to the people to arise and let this reign of violence end quickly.

ROME (13 Oct. 1901): The scene is the Vatican where the college of Cardinals has assembled to receive from the Pope a statement of Papal wartime policy. To look at the assembled Cardinals one wouldn't surmise that there was a war going on, for they were merrily sipping wine, nibbling soda crackers, and shooting spitwads at one another. In due time the Pope joins the expectant crowd and a shroud of silence falls upon the congregation as a few poorly-aimed, last-second spitwads splattered harmlessly upon the walls and floor.

In these troubled times, besieged as we all are on every front, there is but one man in whom the world can place its faith hope and destiny, a man who has won more battles than he has fought. And then, having concluded his speech, Pope Genitaglio stalked out of the Vatican, jumped into his motor-operated wheelchair of brightest gole, and set out for Naples where the flagship Wheelchair waits to take His Holiness on a visit to Tunis across the wine-dark sea in the temple by the moonlight we dee do da.....

Substitute Gamesmaster Richard Miller, standing in for John Beshara while he is out of the country, reports that Sam Nierenberg has just won as Austria-Hungary. Following "1914" moves he had 17 supply centers, while Russia was unable to make a build due to lack of an open home supply center. This means that Austria-Hungary now has 17 out of 33 units on the board, and that therefore, by the 1961 Diplomacy rules which were in effect at the time this game began, Nierenberg has won.

The game's roster is to the right, and the supply center chart is below. An asterisk indicates a unit that was, for some reason, not built. An analysis of the game by the Gamesmaster will be printed in a future issue.

## 1972A - PRESS RELEASES

ATHENS (24 Dec. 1901): The King of Greece today deplored the Turkish aggression upon his nation, and swore lasting loyalty to his Austro-Hungarian ally to the north.

VIENNA (25 Dec. 1901): The Emperor of Austria-Hungary, upon reading the Turkish press release in GRAUSTARK #258, sent regards to the Emperor of the Ottoman Empire, Mark the Turk. He also stated that he will deeply regret delivering to Turkey the coup d'grace when the proper time approaches.

BUDAPEST (30 Dec. 1901): The Emperor's Secretary of State replied today to the French allegation that the Emperor of Austria-Hungary doesn't know enough to come in out of the cold. "That may be so," he said, "but at least he would know enough to come in out of the Reign."

CONSTANTINOPLE: This great power plans to have a delegate in that far-away power of America on the Thursday of the fourth week of November. We suspect that he will receive a warm welcome. With a country such as this as our ally, how could we possibly loose? ((sic))

ST. PETERSBURG (April 1902): After rejection by the Austrian-Italian alliance of our most recent and extremely generous alliance proposals the Czar has decided to form an alliance with the Turkish government. Gen. Borishenko was called back from Vienna after his latest communique informed the Czar of a breakdown of negotiations because "these fat Austrians are more concerned in filling their bellies with creampuffs than in waging war". THE DIPLOMATIC POUCH

JOHN A. McCALLUM, PO, Box 52, Ralston, Alberta (15 Oct. 1971): Another problem for the quiz to replace the 'Whose Little Girl Are You' contest. One of our great powers, A, was at war with another of our great powers, B, and some other countries. It was hard pressed and desired another of our great powers, C, to make a demonstration which would cause B some anxiety and so relieve the pressure on A. A woman, well known for her amatory activities, had great influence and power in the government of country C. The government of A chose for their ambassador to C a good looking man, reputed to have had considerable success with the ladies. The lady, of country C, replied to his advances with the words, "If I had been a younger woman, I might have been tempted," but followed the path of duty and refrained from involving her country in an adventure in which it was not immediately concerned. Question - What countries are A, B, and C, who was the ambassador, and who the lady?

(10 Nov. 1971): GRAU #251 here today, better time than usual. What with your mast head quote, your comment on 'Veritas Vincit' and so on, Grau is soon going to be as unreadable by the unLatined as Prisevs Ordo Seclorum is.

You quote a letter of mine and state that answers will be given in a later issue. So I suppose I had better submit some answers. I think in an earlier letter I mentioned the surname, but not the given name, of the person who was certainly Napoleon's mistress and was generally regarded as Wellington's as well. Her full name, Giusoppina Grassini. The given name must have been rather convenient to the Corsican, raised speaking both Italian and French, since if he murrured it instead of Josephine, or the reverse, he could always excuse himself by saying he was thinking in Italian, or French, as required.

The Embassy that was originally a morning gift was the British Embassy in Russia. It occupied part of the Saltykov Palace, the gift of Catherine the Great to her first lover, a liaison that has already been commented on at length in Grau. ((According to the Express's memoirs, this liaison produced her son and successor, Tsar Pavel. Every subsequent member of the house of "Romanov" is descended from him.)) It was an enormous place, much too large for a private family. Up until the revolution the Saltykov family retained the use of one half of it, the half overlooking the Champ de Mars, the St. Petersburg parade ground. The other half, facing on the Nevsky Prospekt, with the Neva beyond, was leased to the British government for use as their embassy.

((As for the other problem, I have a nearly correct solution for it. If A is Austria, B is France, and C is Prussia, the "ancestor" of the German Empire, then the ambassador could well be Metternich. The lady I am uncertain of; she might have been the Queen of Prussia. The situation was right after Austerlitz, with Prussia still neutral but inclining towards alliance against France. However, in this case the ambassador's mission did not fail, and Prussia declared war against France. The calamitous battles of Jena and Eylau were the results. This is an aspect of Metternich's career which is little noted, and might well explain part of Henry Kissinger's admiration for him and his policies.))

...Allan Calhmer's suggestion for a form for submitting moves would never work in the Pfennig-Halbpennig editorial office which is operated on the principle of a confused mess where I know where everything is. The one move that I ever lost - a retreat of Mike Goldfoin's last summer - was lost after I tried to introduce the slight systematization of having a separate file for letters with moves, as distinct from other pending letters. You will remember one of Parkinson's essays where he states that over organization is invariably a symptom of decay, I can see it all for Diplomacy: Players assigned to games by some vast central agency, all moves to me submitted on forms available from said central agency at 50 for a dollar, to be increased next year to 25 for a dollar, press releases written by professional authors, just state whether you want satiric, polemic, didactic, or lyric - and players disappearing by thousands. As you state the idea might be useful for a gamemaster running a great many games; but surely there is an easier solution to his problem, namely to reduce his games to what he can conveniently handle.

(undated): Speaking of that contest game, here is another question:

A diplomat (and 'Diplomacy' is the name of the game, after all) during his final illness and aware that he was dying, revised his will, mainly in order to make some provision for those who were tending him during the last period of his life. He took the opportunity, however, to insert the following paragraph concerning his wife's lover -

"The copy of \_\_\_\_\_'s picture of (my wife), in enamel, by \_\_\_\_\_, I give to my dearest friend, (the wife's lover), a very small token of the great regard I have for (him), the most virtuous, loyal, and truly brave character I ever met with, God bless him, and shame fall on those who do not say 'Amen!'"

As you can see, I have deleted name of wife and lover, and have replaced the name of artist and copyist of the portrait by dashes just in case there are some art historians in the crowd. The problem is to identify the three principals of the triangle.

Box 8342, San Diego, Calif. 92116 (4 Feb. 1972): Rod's letter in #257 notes that the last Wazir failed to mention my name in the context of the 'grand-daddy' southern stalemate. That is just as well; I did not 'uncover' it, I merely first publicized it. The true discoverers - plural - were Robert Cline and Daniel S. Barrows. This was for a Wild 'n' Woolly contest back in, I believe, 1966. If there is to be any naming, those are the names.

And Terry Kuch suggests that 'Bangle Dosh' properly translates as 'East Bengal'. You, John, offer 'Bengali State' as the most common version. I have enquired of a local friend, an Indian (to be sure, a Parsi, but nevertheless an Indian with knowledge of Bengali); and he supports Dr. Kuch. For my part, I am ignorant. But at least Terry now has one native vote.

To your review of 'Convention' ((in GRAUSTARK #257)) and more particularly to the comments you make on the outlook for The Presidency '72. Alas, I fear you overestimate the voting potential of the left side, alias the 'Peoples' Party', etc. You are right, of course, that the spectrum offered us by the principal candidates of both parties is about as wide as the white line in the highway, and at best in about the same location. ((And providing the same amount of safety to someone who occupies it.)) (There are exceptions; I consider McGovern, Chisholm, Ashbrook, and in certain very limited areas McCloskey and Yorty, to represent somewhat less 'centrist' views. But these are all minor names. And then there's Madman George Gorley - )

Well, I digress. As I started to say, I think you overestimate the Left. You say that the 'People's Party is moving in from the Left'. Is it? How fast, how far, and with what actual force? I cannot find any evidence that the push is making any more of a splash than in terms of headline 'scare banners'. ((Neither can I. I merely cited its existence. Unlike the Wallace candidacy on the other wing, it is spread over the country and thus not so concentrated that it can carry any state. But it may serve to deny some crucial states to a pro-war Democrat and thus bring a breath of political reality into the councils of that party. On the other hand, the People's Party may itself nominate someone with a pro-war voting record and a large element of hypocrisy in his make-up, like McCarthy, McGovern, or Lindsay.)) Now it is true that I live in a politically sterile area; nobody here gets terribly virulent one way or another. But the same can be seen in supposedly 'activist' centres such as San Francisco, Los Angeles, and particularly the black ghettos of all three cities. A depression has set in, not financial (though that may be true too) but emotional. The cry of 'rampant apathy' is quite valid. We will elect either Nixon or his Democratic reflection, and except for certain small-scale variations, there will be no change.

....Incidentally, now that I am combining Mongo into Costagana, your magazine once again properly bears the description 'oldest magazine of postal Diplomacy'. Congratulations. Since you've always had the de facto, you are really entitled to the de jure.

ROBERT BRYAN LEPTON, 556 Green Place, Woodmere, N. Y. 11598 (1 Feb. 1972): Although I enjoy the press releases, I feel that the space would be taken up more profitably by articles on Diplomacy in general.

((I agree. Would anybody like to write some?))

You may have heard me talk about the variation of Diplomacy 'Blackout'. Only two things have stopped me from setting up a game: One, it takes eight sets to play it; one

for each player, and one for the gamesmaster; two, I can find only one person who's willing to try it. If you're interested, here are the rules for the postal variation:

- 1) All countries and moves are set up as in regular postal Diplomacy.
- 2) Each person is told only his country, preferably by means of a non-duplicable method. Each player is also told how to contact the other players.
- 3) If a unit is dislodged, he is told the name of the player whose piece dislodged it. He is also told the name of the player who takes any supply center that he previously controlled.
- 4) He is never told by the gamesmaster who plays which position. This is

As you can see, this would tend to make all players somewhat paranoid in their playing. In fact, one person when I told him about it, suggested that it be called 'Paranoia'. Well, it's a good idea.

(2 Feb. 1972) Your anti-war standing is obvious, and the proponents of the war seem to be at a disadvantage, especially now, when we are withdrawing from the conflict (down to 137,000 now). ((By the authority of a government which has not only exercised, but also openly asserted, a "right to lie".)) However, I would think that your knowledge of the reasons of wars would lead you to understanding how we got in Viet Nam. ((sic))

Basically, we are in the situation that predated WWI: To wit, two superforces who are arranged against each other. This situation is inherently unstable, as each side does not know how important any given area is to the other ((and wouldn't believe it if told)), and, in attempting to make gains, finds itself in direct conflict (i. e. the Serbian situation that set off WWI). I think that the only things that have kept USSR and US out of war were first, the American isolationist tendency, and secondly, the fear that either side can completely destroy the other on attack, and be ruined in turn. There are no superpowers besides the US and USSR, and this causes the unstable situation. War might have broken out before WWI in the other situations where there were only two powers with non-overextended lines: Iran in '07, in Rumania in '87, etc. It was only threat by the other great powers who threatened war on other fronts that brought these conflicts to a halt.

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Our present era of two Great Power axes will end with the emergence of other countries to the rank of super-power. I predict Red China, Japan, South Africa, and perhaps West Germany. ((How about the European Common Market as a political entity? A country with a population of 260 million and an industrial potential nearly that of the United States certainly qualifies as a "superpower".)) The basic independence of these countries should lead to an equilibrium.

((The Blackout variant seems to be an attempt to place the Chess version 'Kriegspiel' in a Diplomacy context. Donald Miller has tried something similar in variations in his 'zines. In it, play proceeded regularly, with moves published each season, except that no one knew who was playing the other countries.))

JOE ANTOSIAK, 3637 Arden Ave., Brookfield, Ill. 60513 (17 Feb. 1972): About the "D. B. Cooper, Where Are You?" comment in GRAUSTARK #258: a Chicago Daily News columnist some time ago...mentioned the rise to hero-hood of "D. B. Cooper" and then remarked, "One thing these hero-worshippers seem to be overlooking is the fact that the answer to the question, 'D. B. Cooper, where are you?' may very well be, 'Hanging upside down from a pine tree somewhere in Oregon trying to offer a bear a hundred thousand dollars to get me down!'"

JEREMIAH B. MODEL, 3434 20th Avenue South, Minneapolis, Minn. 55407 (6 Feb. 1972): I find it somewhat regrettable that you started so many new games recently, since it means that you will have no new games beginning for some time. I would have preferred that you started one or two new games, started more in a couple of months.

((So would have I. But it's been my experience that entries come flooding in, once I open them, and that it's easiest to get it all done at once.))

...At any rate, I enjoy GRAUSTARK. My objections above are really very minor and special.

You may have noticed how much news has been passed in the last few weeks concerning a "major North Vietnamese build-up", possibly leading to a new "tet offensive". I'm sure Richard Nixon does NOT want to be caught flat-footed as did LBJ by such a devastating attack. If it happens, he wants to be able to say "we expected it all the time". If it doesn't he can point to how successful vietnamization is.

The one thing that worries Dicky most about Vietnam is the possibility of a really successful and violent offensive. Can you imagine what would happen if the U. S. suffered 200 deaths in a week, and a red flag were raised over Kontum, or a similar city?

((Easily. Nixon would simply drop nuclear bombs on Hanoi. The Chinese government, quite aware of this, is engaged in cutting the cords that tie it to Hanoi. This way, when North Vietnam goes down the drain, China won't go with it. Hanoi, in short, occupies that same position that Warsaw did on the day in August 1939 when Ribbentrop flew to Moscow.))

There is really only one "honorable" way out of this bloody war. That way is surrender. The U. S. command should ring up the nearest North Vietnamese or Viet Cong camp and ask for surrender terms. Surrender is the only honorable way out for a defeated invading army. It's been done before. Lots of British Expeditionary Forces have surrendered honorably. (It happened in America once, I seem to recall..)

Those against the war, or who think they are, should reexamine themselves if that word "surrender" seems somehow objectionable. "Getting out" is too easy; it doesn't force anybody to learn anything from the mess. Surrender is final, neat, honorable, and saves lives. It also obligates your enemy to deal with you honestly: after all, he has nothing to lose and everything to gain.

If anybody should ask me, how I feel about the war, I shall answer them, "The U. S. Army should surrender immediately."

My ideal presidential ticket would be: Chisholm and McCarthy. Eugene McCarthy is ideal for a Vice-President. It isn't much work, allows maximum literary freedom, and he could set a very mellow tone for the country through speechmaking.

Incidentally, those in New York who admire McCarthy ought to take some note of his lack of popularity in Minnesota. If he ran for Senator here, again, he would lose. After '68, he had the worst attendance record in the senate, which did not endear him to many constituents. His reasons, reasonably enough, center mainly around the fact that most votes are on trivia. He only votes the two or three times a month when anything significant is going to happen.

Also, as nice as Gene is, he is a bit lazy.

((That is an excellent recommendation where the presidency is concerned, after the administrations of three gluttons for activity like Kennedy, Johnson, and Nixon.))
