Underlined moves do not succeed. The German army in Silesia is forced to retreat into Warsaw.

ROME: The Italian Government reaffirms its support of the French Government and its friendship with the French people, and respectfully requests that the French government in no way consider the Italian troop movements hostile in intent.

In consistency with our last declaration, the Italian government declares that a state of war now exists between the Kingdom of Italy and the Bolshevik Republic of England. Victor Emmanuel reaffirms his support of his brother Edward in his time of crisis, and will, with Italian navies, restore him to his rightful position of dignity, honour, and prestige.
