## WESTERN POWERS PONDER TURKISH PLANS

The following establishments of new units were made in the Winter of 1905:

ENGLAND: No move received.      TURKEY: A in Con.

THE DEADLINE FOR SPRING 1906 MOVES IS SATURDAY 15 AUGUST 1964.

CONSTANTINOPLE: The Turkish government hereby announces the recruitment of sufficient quantity and superb quality so as to permit the establishment of a new armoured unit to assist the Army in the defence of the homeland. The new army unit shall presently be stationed at Constantinople. It is possible that they may see action in the coming months once they have perfected the world famous techniques of the Turkish fighting units that have preceded them.

It was once said by a president renowned for his "big stick" that "far better is it to dare mighty things, to win glorious triumphs, even though checkered by failure, than to rank with those poor spirits who neither enjoy much or suffer much because they live in the gray twilight that knows neither victory nor defeat."

This thought is continually borne by the men of the Turkish Armed Forces. They shall never concede ultimate defeat, for though they are small and humble they shall try to prove themselves as equals in a world of giants.
