EXCIDIO ROMAEE

LEN SCENSNY: Can a unit move directly from ThB to AsA? [Yes; the  
Errata state this explicitly.] What happened to the three revolting le-  
gions in game IV? [Since they were already in ItA when they revolted,  
they just stayed there. Legions which rebel in the "Western Empire"  
march on Rome whether ItA is controlled by the Empire or not.

BRENTON VER PLOEG: The term "force" [in 5.22] is open to alternate  
interpretations. If you interpret "force" to mean the entire Roman (or  
non, though it wouldn't come up except when there were volitional moves)  
contingent in the particular area, then I cannot, say, move PART of a  
"force" out of the area, even when I have a superiority of 1½ to 1, or 1  
even 3 to 1. If force is defined as an integrated whole, then it either  
all has to go or none of it may. "Force", on the other hand, may be de-  
fined in the more limited context as comprising potentially different  
groups of Roman troops, militia and Legion, in the same area, and each  
"force" could then be considered separately for the purposes of rule  
5.22. If the "force" seeking to move out had numerical superiority over  
the enemy forces, could they move under the cited rule? Or would the  
whole force(s) have to leave the area? If the latter, cannot the rule  
be circumvented by moving all forces out, and then some back in? The  
rules are not terribly explicit on the matter, but I am giving it a lib-  
eral interpretation. [The former interpretation is correct. See 5.32.]  
...Can you refuse to marshall all the militia? [No. The militia must  
appear whenever the province is invaded; see 10.0.]...As a related effect  
can you demobilize militia that are not needed even though enemy troops  
remain which compel the presence of some militia? [No.]...What I am say-  
ing has possibly significant implications in the case of revolts, where  
the whole number wouldn't go over in a rebellious province, and where  
the difference might be substantial. [Loyal militia cannot be used to  
put down rebellious militia.]

KENNETH SCHER: What happens when attrition reduces barbarian forces  
to less than 1B? [It can't. Attrition is always rounded up, and there  
are no fractional strength points in this game.]

LEN SCENSNY: Does rule 7.11(d) mean that if a barbarian force does  
not equal the [victory] point value of a province, then it will suffer  
attrition? [Yes.]

"FR" indicates a player in the Fall of Rome tournament. If a player's subscription runs past the end of a game, the number of additional issues he will receive is indicated following a "+" sign. Paid subscribers not presently active in a game have after their names the number of the issue in which the subscription expires. "T" indicates a trade copy, and "C" a complimentary copy.
