TWO GRAUSTARK GAMES SUSPENDED

As was anticipated in the last issue, a Canadian postal strike began on Monday 20 October. The United States Postal "Service" promptly placed an embargo on mail addressed to Canada. This affects Tom Kissner, playing Russia in 1974IA, and Laurence Gillespie, playing Germany in 1975Q. Their copies of GRAUSTARK #336, were mailed two days before the embargo, and have not come back, so presumably they are now lying in Canadian post offices. As soon as the embargo is lifted, I plan to write them to see if #336 reached them.

In the meantime, play is suspended in these games. The new deadline will be noon of the fourth Saturday after the embargo is lifted, even if that date is not a regular GRAUSTARK publication date.

In 1975Q a retreat is needed for Germany: I'll write the German player about this as soon as the embarge is off.

Also published here is EMPIRE, a forthightly bulletin for the postal play of -magames other than Diplomacy. Recent issues of EMPIRE have had the following features:

#21 (6 September): Four pages of articles and letters on the new simulation gaming sensation Dungeons & Dragons, plus a review of the Canadian best-seller <u>Ultimatum</u>, which predicts a US-Canadian confrontation over energy policy.

#22 (20 September): The postal rules for SPI's World War II game, an experimental game of which is now in progress in EMPIRE. Also reviews of Garrett Mattingly's Catherine of Aragon and Robert Aron's The Vichy Regime, plus postal games of SPI's Frigate, Legion, and Viking in progress.

#23 (4 October): The revised postal rules for Frigate and for the PRESTAGS games (Pre-Seventeenth Century Tactical Gaming System). All PRESTAGS scenarios from 3000

BCE to 1588 CE are listed in order of their complexity.

#24 (18 October): The Legion scenario of the Battle of Ctesiphon (363) is won, unhistorically, by the Persians (Bill Drakert). Also a review of Mattingly's The Armada,

Articles by the editor explore the claim that Monopoly's designer stole the game from somewody else, and speculate on what will happen to Dungeons & Dragons now that Sex Drive is a part of the characterizations.

#26 (15 November): Play begins at Casilinum, and in the experimental postal World War II game. Also, a new Dreadnought scenario involving the notorious <u>Göben</u> is introduced, and the first shots are exchanged in a Frigate game of Camperdown between Bill Drakert's British and Bob Eisen's Dutch.

In addition, a postal game of Avalon-Hill's Origins of World War II is now under organization in EMPIRE. The entry fee is \$5, and entrants should specify which scenario they would like, in order of preference. The game will be played according to the postal rules included with the set, at two-week deadline intervals. The above-mentioned free games remain free only until 31 December (for Frigate and Charlot) and until 31 January (for Dreadnought), so hurry up if you're interested.

Three weeks ago was one of GRAUSTARK's "Bundle Days".
