ENGLAND CAPITULATES!

REMAINING FORCES PLACED
UNDER TURKISH COMMAND

LAWLESS ITALY BECOMES
FRANCO-TURKISH BATTLEGROUND

ENGLAND: A Den-Swe; F Hel-Den; F Norwegian Sea-Norway; F Edi-North Sea; F Cly-Edi.

FRANCE: A Pie-Ven; F Wes-Tun; A Mun S A Ber; A Ber S A Kie; F North Sea-Den; A Kie S F North Sea-Den; F Hol-Hel; F Iri-Liv; A Yor S F Iri-Liv; F North Atlantic S F Iri-Liv; F Eng-North Sea.

ITALY: No moves received.

TURKEY: A St-P-Norway; A Arm-Sev; A Pru-Ber; A Sil S A Pru-Ber; A Vie-Bon; A Bud-Vie; A Ser-Bud; A Tri-Ten; A Rum-bal; F Nap; F Tun, & F Aeg hold; F Ion S F Nap.

Underlined moves are impossible. The French army in Norway was not ordered, and so holds. There are no retreats. The present positions of the Italian units are: A Tyrolia, A Rome, F Apulia.

The High Combatant Powers now control the following supply centers:

ENGLAND: Edinburgh, Sweden. (2)

FRANCE: Belgium, Berlin, Brest, Denmark, Holland, Kiel, Liverpool, London, Marseilles, Munich, Norway, Paris, Portugal, Spain. (14)

ITALY: Rome, Venics. (2)

TURKEY: Ankara, Budapest, Bulgaria, Constantinople, Greece, Moscow, Naples, Rumania, St. Petersburg, Serbia, Sevastopol, Smyrna, Trieste, Tunis, Vienna, Warsaw. (16)

Turkey may establish three new units. France may establish two new units. Italy must remove one unit, and England must remove three. THE DEADLINE FOR WINTER 1909 MOVES IS SATURDAY 2 JANUARY 1965.

COPENHAGEN: The Central Committee of the People's Party voted today, by a 99% majority, to accept the suzerainty of the benevolent Turkish Empire. Realizing that the heroic struggle against the bloody capitalists who have sacked western Europe can not be continued alone, the People's Party have agreed to place those forces, still able to resist, under the authority of the Turkish Northern Command. The destruction of the capitalists must be achieved before the proletariat will lay down their arms and accept peace. The only way that the French tyrant and his puppets can be defeated is to expend every effort to ensure the victory of the Turks. Therefore, the Central Committee has commenced to place those territories still controlled by the People's armed forces under the policing powers of the Ottoman Empire.

Long live the proletariat and their struggle against oppression and tyranny!

ST. PETERSBURG: General Roberts has given command of the People's armed forces to Enver Pasha. As a gesture of generosity, the Prince commissioned Mr. Roberts as General of the Army, Chief of Staff, Armies West. The Prince of Wales will command. The ceremony was very impressive, though the Prince of Wales and General Roberts appeared embarrassed wearing the unfamiliar regalia of Ottoman general officers.
