#### WHAT IS TRUTH?

In recent months, the chronic disposition of the media to call into question the deeds of our Empire's leaders has become a veritable firestorm. Defending the news blackout on the recent war with Grenada, Secretary of State Shultz asserted that reporters were not on our side, but always against us. (New York Times, 23 December 1983) Specifically, Admiral James D. Watkins, chief of naval operations in the American conquest of Grenada, "publicly berated Richard Munro, president of Time, Inc., because Time printed a color photograph of a dead helicopter polit lying in a pool of blood on a Grenadan beach." (New York Daily News, 16 November 1983) Clearly, the government of the Great Eig United States of America has about reached the limits of its patience with the media, and will shortly begin to order them to shape up or shut up.

Americans, and all people, have to realize that truth is not something left to them to decide. Truth is what the government of the Great Big United States of America says it is. This is particularly, and overwhelmingly, true, when the spokesman is His Excellency the President, Commander-in-Chief, Alpha Male, and Supreme War Leader. Incredible as it may seem, certain willful newspaper columnists have actually been accus-

ing Ronald Reagan, holder of this awesomely high office, of lying!

Lars-Erik Nelson began it about a month ago, after the President spoke before a meeting of winners of the Medal of Honor. He told the story of a World War II bomber pilot who rode his shot-up plane to destruction rather than bail out and desert a badly wounded crewman. The pilot was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor. Nelson actually had the disloyal effrontery to claim that no such incident had ever happened!

If these strike you as pleasant fates, then join Nelson, Green, and McColl in questioning the President's words. But if you want to live peacefully, then you better accept everything that is thought, said, and done by our President, Commander-in-Chief, Alpha Male, and Supreme War Leader.

Of the five players who gave choices of country, three got their first choices, one his second, and one his third. Any player in 1984B who does not yet have a copy of the postal rules for Diplomacy should write for one at once.

With this game it is a particular pleasure to welcome Jim Goldman back to postal Diplomacy. Jim was a player in the very first postal Diplomacy game, 1963A (not "1962A" as I misprinted in the last issue). The game was organized among him, two other members of the East Paterson Diplomacy Club, and two science-fiction fans, an Angeleno named Dave McDaniel and a Torontan named Derek Nelson. In those days the two countries left out in a 5-player game were Russia and Turkey, together with Rumania and Bulgaria. Jim Goldman played Germany in that game too; it was won by Nelson as Italy.

Much has changed since then. "East Paterson" has been renamed "Elmwood Park", as its suburbanites refuse identification with largely black Paterson. Fred Lerner, then a high-school senior and player of France in 1963A, now has a doctorate in library science, is a major authority on the bibliography of science fiction, and lives in the wilds of Verment. McDaniel, who played Austria-Hungary, went on to write Man from UNCLE scripts as "Ted Johnstone" and is now dead. Nelson, a transplanted Ulster Prod, lost contact with s-f and war-gaming fandoms years ago. Stuart Keshner, who played England, has also dropped out of the hobby.
