When rumors of intervention in the Russo-Austrian war were brought up, he denied any plans to take either side. "The Kaiser just wants to make sure the war doesn't spill over into Germany. He's not a meddler."

MOSCOW (DAMN): The Kaiser's talks with the Czar produced a heat wave, causing

the city to be inundated with mud from the melting permafrost.
