#### THE REIGN OF SENILIO THE GREAT - XXV

"And thus began the placket Reign
Of Aphra-dite, surnamed Behn.
Just as Senylio the Great,
Who Talk of Peace did deeply hate,
Triumph'd o'er Rebels in his State
E'en though he lost the fam'd Debate

(And as his Heir reviewed the Farce Of that Debate as 'kicking Arse')
So Aphra-dite, Heiress then
Of Giraldina, hated Men
And would the State to Madnesse throw
By making high what God made low."
Samuel Butler, Burningbras\* (1679)

When the old dynasty of Emperors of the Temporary Roman Empire died out in 1381, Senilio the Great ascended the imperial throne at the age of 97. Four years later, unrest ledtto a famous confrontation in the Senate, one of the many institutions which the Temporary Roman Empire retained in support of the claim of this tiny Balkan Massif nation that it was the sole legitimate successor to the Roman Empire. Objections to the policies of Senilio the Great had begun to center arround Senator Vallunius, who was widely believed to be an illegitimate offspring of the old dynasty. Moreover, the second in command of Vallunius was a woman, Giraldina of Trent, who was widely believed to be the condense of Trent and her lover, the heresiarch Fra Dolcino, who had been burned at the stake in Italy in 1308.\*\*

The disaffection of Vallunius and his co-conspirators came to a head in a debate before the Senate at a time when Senilio the Great was presiding. Vallunius accused the Emperor of harshness towards the poor; of debasing the coinage, and of spending too many denarii on the schemes of the wizard Caspar Magus to use magical weapons against the Kingdom of Pundschdruk and the Empire's other neighbors.

The emperor and his supporters replied to these calumnies. The Emperor compared Vallunius to the infamous Catiline, and referred to his own supporters as "Rome's Party - and, might I ask, to what nation does the party of Vallunius belong?" He then met objections to his own great age by challenging Vallunius to a turn with sword and trident in the Circus Minimus. The Emperor's heir, Preppius then threatened to kick Giraldina's podex, and Babsa, the wife of Preppius, invaded the Senate chamber and called Giraldina a "four million denarii bitch". Other Senators supported Senilio the Great. Dioguardius, the representative from Castra Occidentalis, said that the poor only had more babies so they could get more alms. Another Senator urged that alms be taked, a step which would make people less willing to take up begging as a profession. Helminthus, of Carolina Septentrionalis, urged a return to the worship of Jupiter. Finally, Senilio the Great concluded by saying that Vallunius was trying to disband the Legions and weaken the Temporary Roman Empire.

After this spate of accusations, Vallunius disclaimed all intent to revolt against the rule of Senilio the Great, and retired to private life. As he later told the chronicler T. H. Candidius, Senilio the Great and his supporters would not have made such sweeping, haughty, and demeaning statements unless they had been confident that they would never be called to account for them. "Against such confidence, no dissent has a chance of success."

\* - After the success of his poem <u>Hudibras</u>, satirizing the Puritans, Butler attempted a little-known sequel, <u>Burningbras</u>, which attacked Aphra Behn and other Feminist leaders of his day. The poem could not, however, find a publisher. A letter of dubious authenticity, from John Wilmot to Gilbert Burnet, boasts that Wilmot was responsible for this.

## THE MINISTRY OF MISCELLANY

The last two issues of GRAUSTARK, #497 and #498, were collated on Saturdays the 1st and 22nd of September respectively. However, several readers have informed me that they were not postmarked until the following Tuesdays! They were therefore late even by the standards of the United States Postal "Service". And, in fact, eight new game entries have come in since 1984HB was opened in GRAU-STARK #497. So why isn't a new game announced in this issue? Well, the geographical distribution is very irregular. These eight consist of four residents of New York City (one presently a student out of the city, and another a student from out of the city), and four people very widely scattered in the rest of the country. As one or two other city residents have also expressed interest in joining a new game, I am going to see whether an all-New York game might be organized. At any rate, a new postal Diplomacy game will be announced to its players in two weeks and to everyone else in three, and the deadline for its "Spring 1901" moves will be 24 November.

The entry fee for postal Diplomacy games in GRAUSTARK is \$18. This includes a subscription to GRAUSTARK as long as the game lasts, whether or not you are eliminated from it. If you do not have a copy of the postal rules of Diplomacy, which were last published in GRAUSTARK #437, write for one when you send in your game fee.

Subscriptions for non-players are 9 issues for \$6.00. Back issues from #467 are available at 10 for \$1.50; a few earlier issues such as #437 are also available.

GRAUSTARK is published every third Saturday by John Boardman (address below). Diplomacy was designed by Allan B. Calhamer, and is published by Avalon-Hill. GRAUSTARK #500 will be published in three weeks; it will be a particularly large issue including book reviews and the winning entries in the Silly Election Contest. (See GRAUSTARK #498 for details.)

On the first Saturday of every year, it is my custom to throw out all the back issues of the year before last. This means that on 5 January 1985 I will throw out all 1983 issues of GRAUSTARK that have not been sold by then. This also goes for back issues of EMPIRE, which carries postal games other than Diplomacy, and DAGON, my fanzine for science-fiction, fantasy, comic art, and various other odds and ends.
