Underlined moves are not possible. The Italian fleets in Tunis and the Ionian Sea are dislodged and, since no Italian moves were received, annihilated. The other Italian units are an army in Piedmont and a fleet in the Adriatic.

The High Combatant Powers now control the following supply centers: This is

ENGLAND: Denmark, Edinburgh, Liverpool, London, Norway, Sweden. (6)

FRANCE: Brest, Marseilles, Paris, Portugal, Spain, Tunis. (6)

GERMANY: Belgium, Berlin, Holland, Kiel, Munich. (5)

ITALY: Naples, Rome, Venice. (3)

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY: Vienna. (1)

RUSSIA: Budapest, Moscow, Rumania, St. Petersburg, Serbia, Sevastopol,
Trieste, Warsaw. (8)

TURKEY: Ankara, Bulgaria, Constantinople, Greece, Smyrna. (5)

England, France, and Italy may each establish one new unit. Russia may establish two new units. Germany must remove one unit. THE DEADLINE FOR WINTER 1903 MOVES IS SATURDAY 1 MAY 1965. If all the Winter moves come in before then, the publication date of GRAUSTARK #52 will be advanced accordingly.

Following are the revised "Spring 1908" moves in postal Diplomacy game 1964B. The position of the English forces in "1964B" was revised by ruling of the Gamesmaster as announced in FREDONIA #25.

FRANCE: F Tyr-Wes; F Mid S F Tyr-Wes; A Spa holds; A Mar-Bur; A Bel-Ruh; A Hol S
A Bel-Ruh; F Cly-Norw; Sea; F Eng-North Sea.

GERMANY: A Mun-Ruh; A Kie-Hol; A Den-Swe; A Ber holds.

ITALY: No moves received.

AUSTRIA-HUNGARY: A War-Liv; A Mos S A War-Liv; A Gal-Ukr; A Bud-Gal; A Vie-Boh;
A Tyr-Mun; F Aeg-Con; A Bul S F Aeg-Con; A Rum-Sev; A Rom-Nap; F Tri-AMB;
F Ion-Eas.

TURKEY: F Smy-Con; F Con-Ela; A Arm-Sev.

Underlined moves are not possible. The Italian fleet in the Western Mediterranean is dislodged and, since no Italian moves were received, annihilated. The other Italian unit is a fleet in Tunis.

No press releases were received this issue, except for a brief comment from Turkey that "I want to be sure poor old Abdul gets in his few remaining moves before he has to fold his tents and depart. To be sure of entrance into the Moslem paradise I have to fall in battle after all."
