SUPREMACY

One of the permanent effects of the hijacking of the Achille Lauro, and the subsequent U. S. seizure of four of the hijackers, is a new relationship that now exists between the Great Big United States of America and the lesser nations. Precedents that go back to the remotest antiquity have been overturned, and a new condition of international relations now exists, by command of Our President.

At one time a sort of theoretical equality existed among different nations. Under the slogan "national sovereignty", each nation respected certain privileges that others were regarded as possessing. For example, in those days a crime against an individual outside his or her own country was considered the responsibility of the country in which the crime took place. If, for example, an American was robbed in Italy, the search for, arrest, and trial of the thief were considered the responsibility of the Italian rather than the American government. These ideas extended to ships, which were considered parts of the territory of the nation in which the ship was registered.

Under these now obsolete notions, for example, the hijacking of an Italian ship was a crime under Italian law. If the hijackers committed a murder, this was a crime under Italian law. If they escaped to another country, Italy had the responsibility of extraditing them for trial. If they were arrested, they would go on trial in Italy for their crimes. And if one of them could wangle diplomatic status from any nation, this status was universally regarded as a protection against arrest. "Diplomatic immunity" was then regarded as so important for the normal conduct of international affairs that nations were willing to let pass any violations of law committed by people with diplomatic passports, as an evil that was overweighed by the need for keeping diplomats. Trom being harrassed by countries who had disputes with their own. Even when the poverty-stricken Liberian government sold its diplomatic status to Europeans who then used this status to carry huge amounts of counterfeit money across borders, diplomatic immunity had a sacrosanct character. Historians would tell us that it could be traced all the way back to the immunity enjoyed by heralds delivering messages in remotest classical antiquity.

Now, of course, all that is changed. It was not Italy, but the Great Big United States of America, that demanded that the Egyptian government surrender the four hipackers, who were citizens of four different Arab nations. When these men took an Egyptian plane out of the country, it was U.S. fighter planes that diverted it to a IMTO base in Sicily. Also on this plane was a certain Mohammed Abbas, who had been indulged in such capers by Yasser Arafat of the "Palestine" Liberation Organization because Arafat needed Abbas's vote to stay in control of that faction-ridden group. Ever since the Israeli conquest of southern Lebanon, a faction supported by the government of Syria has been trying to take over the "P"LO. Syria's bitter rival Iraq seems to have given Abbas an Iraqi diplomatic passport in an attempt to counteract this Syrian power grab.

Because of this diplomatic status, and a belief in the obsolete concept of "diplomatic immunity", Italy did not arrest Abbas, but allowed him to go to Yugoslavia. The Great Big United States of America tried to get him from both countries, but was stymied by this notion. He is believed now to be back in the "P"LO headquarters in Tunisia.

Among the prominent political figures who no longer accept this notion of "national sovercignty" and "diplomatic immunity" is Governor Mario Cuomo of New York, a potential future President. He has demanded that the hijackers be sent to this country for trial. (Newsday, 16 October) Columnist Murray Kempton properly identifies this as "the idea of America as a land so chosen by God as beyond the judgment of any other". So embarrassed was the Italian government by the decisive action by the U.S. armed forces that its head was forced to resign. When the captured Egyptian airplane landed in Sicily, it was surrounded by a detachment of Italian carabinieri. This was in turn surrounded by the true masters of the situation, a specially trained U.S. anti-terrofist unit. (Joseph Kraft, New York Post, 19 October) The government of the Great Big United States of America insisted on its superior status and demanded that the hijackers be turned over, to stand trial in the U.S. For a while it looked as if it might come to gunfire, but Our President decided to give our subject allies in

Italy a chance to demonstrate their loyalty to their American suzerains.

This represented a change in the original plan, according to a report in the <u>Hew York Post</u> of 19 October. The original intent of Our President was to take the prisoners on to Fort Bragg, and only then announce their capture. Their Only trial would have been on U. S. soil - assuming, as Kepmton observed, that "we didn't meet them at the airport with a rope." (This may well be a future U. S. option.) But the plane had to refuel in Sicily, the local air traffic controller got suspicious, and the government of our subject ally in Rome had to be informed.

So it appears that these four Arabs will go on trial in Italy for murder, piracy, and other crimes. But they will still be alive at the end of this trial, since the Italian government has pusillanimously written into its very constitution a ban on capital punishment. Then the Great Big United States of America will command their extradition to stand trial here. Either this will be granted, or it will be discovered how high the going rate is for bribery of Italian prison officials and port officers.

For only one explanation can be given for the U. S. position that these men must be tried in the Great Big United States of America. They have committed a crime against an American citizen and, for the first time since the Roman Empire, an Empire exists in the world which takes jurisdiction over all crimes committed against its eitizens, no matter where or by whom. This is explicitly stated in the Federal Crime Control Act of 1984, according to Director Willam H. Webster of the FBI. (New York Times, 13 October) "We have jurisdiction," the Director said, "and we have not vaived it."

The Italians have realized this too. In late October they made a preposterous decision to look into "possible crimes committed by United States military forces during a standoff with Italian soldiers...on the night of Oct. 10." This ridiculous action by a subordinate government, which can only be compared with the preposterous petition against stationing nuclear weapons in New York harbor, was slapped down by higher au-

thority the next day.

As a result of all these military and legal shenannigans, it is now firmly established that the government of the Great Big United States of America has superior jurisdiction over all the other governments of the world. This, in brief, is what it means to be an Empire. We have no doubt that, should the government of the Great Big United States of America have a chance to seize Mohammed Abbas on the territory of any other nation, it will pay no attention whatsoever either to that nation's so-called "sovereignty" or to Abbas's "diplomatic immunity". Anyone wanted by Our President for crimes against the American Empire and its citizens, anywhere in the world, is subject

to the Empire's powers.

This is also true of such actions when they are performed under U. S. authority by a loyal subject ally. When Israeli jets blasted the "P"LO headquarters in Tunisia on 1 October, this action was warmly velcomed by Our President, who called it an act of self-defense, and who through a State Department spokesman said, "As a matter of principle, it is our view that it is legitimate self-defense to respond appropriately to acts of terrorism." "As long as you pick out the people responsible," He later qualified these words. (Newsday, 2 October) This was certainly also the case with regard to the terrorist ship Rainbow Warrior, which the personal agents of the President of France (another loyal subject ally) blew out of the water in New Zealand on 10 July. Ambassador Kirkpatrick denied that the destruction of the Rainbow Warrior was an act of terrorism (New York Times, 26 September). In another counter-terrorist action, the offices of the Arab-American Anti-Discrimination Committee in Santa Ana, California, were blown up on 11 October, killing the regional director, who only a few hours before had gone on TV to praise Yasser Arafat's role in the hijacking. This is what opposition to Cur President will continue to get, both here and in the Empire's subject donains overseas.

The imperial supremacy of the Great Big United States of America, and its high imperial destiny of world domination, must be driven home at home as well as in the lesser nations. A group of Pacifists learned this last week, as a result of a campaign against the basing of the USS Iowa and a support group in New York harbor. They were opposed to the fact that the Iowa is armed with nuclear weapons, and thought they could set their private wills against the supreme sovereign authority of the Great Big United States of

America. So they passed around positions to get a referendum question placed on the ballot for next Tuesday's New York City election. This referendum would have made it illegal for any city authority to cooperate in the basing of these ships here.

On the record these Pacifists should have known better. Back in 1967 they tried to place on the ballot a city charter amendment that would have the practical effect of expressing a judgment against the war with Vietnam. The Board of Elections did not challenge the validity of the signatures on the petition, but simply told the petitioners that it was not going to put their little plan on the ballot. And the courts, with

their superb record of support for the American war effort, upheld the Board,

Mayor Koch a strong supporter of the "home-porting" of the <u>lowa</u> here, referred to the recent New Zealand action in banning nuclear weapons as "disgusting". Although the Pacifists got over 100,000 signatures on this petition, the courts once again came through patriotically, and the question was thrown off the ballot. Furthermore, in a neat legalistic twist, New York's highest court decided the matter by reference only to state law, thus preventing a Pacifist appeal to the federal courts which would only have inflicted further defeats upon them.

A lesson has been given to the Pacifists - one which may save their lives if they take it to heart. As I have observed for many years in these pages, certain subjects have long since been removed from the arena of public discussion in the Great Big United States of America. Among these are whether and what nuclear weapons the U.S. will build, where they will be stored, and against whom they will be used. These matters have been taken out of the fumbling hands of the dirty ignorant rabble and lodged with the supreme authority of the President, Commander in Chief, Alpha Male, and Sup-

reme War Leader of the Great Big United States of America.

Our President knows how Communism came to power in Russia. There, 68 years ago, Pacifist agitators created a great var-weariness in the Russian people, just as they tried to do here during the first phase (1954-1974) of the war with Vietnam. Unlike our own Presidents, the Russian imperial government did not crack down sufficiently hard on these Pacifists. So this war-weariness caused the Russians to put into power a government committed to take the nation out of the war. This was a Communist government. Nothing could more clearly indicate the intimate connection that has always existed between Pacifism and Communism.

These sentiments still dominate the Soviet Union. For decades they have slobbered about "peace" while the Great Big United States of America resolutely prepared for a war against the Soviet Union. From the Stockholm Peace Petition of the 1940s to the "Star Peace" notions of Foreign Minister Sheverdnadze today, Soviet policy has always squealed for peace and an opposition to nuclear weapons. They have even pledged themselves to no first use of nuclear weapons - which means that they are dead meat as soom as any U.S. President decides to scour them off the face of the earth with our nuclear arsenal.

But it isn't going to happen here. Peace candidates are slammed down by both political parties, and wind up either coming over to the noble pro-war ideals of our established political leaders, or in ending their days contending for one of those ridiculous little parties that ray sometimes be found on the right side of the voting machine, but never in the media reports of campaigns. And if instead of candidates the Pacifists try referenda, their propositions are just not allowed to go before the pub-

lic in the first place.

The U. S. political system is based on the assumption that, if the general public is given a formal chance to decide between two candidates, they will feel they have a stake in the system and will thereafter accept the vill of their government no matter how close together the candidates' policies were. But the rabble must realize that it will be indulged in this privilege only so long as it is not misused. If it should ever appear that the electorate may use its privilege for the purpose of reducing the force with which the Great Big United States of America holds the rest of the world in terror, this privilege will be yanked away from it, as it already has been done with regard to the anti-nuclear referendum whose petitions have just been left out for the trash collector.

So far none of the signers of this "referendum" have been sent to prison. This may be regarded as the biggest victory they are likely to get.

GERMAN ROOF FALLS III

Kaiser Pupette of Austria and Tsar Ansel of Russia immediately granted diplomatic recognition to the new government.

ISTANBUL (CONSTANTINOPLE): The Russian Southern Fleet antered the Turkish capitol today for a friendly visit. The current itinerary calls for similar friendly visits

to Mediterranean ports of interest.

Every attempt in over 50 years to form a centralized s-f fandom organization has failed, and s-f fans have gone on merrily enjoying their hobby, holding conventions, and running feuds compared to which Brux and Coughlin have been minor nuisances. Diplomacy World is (on the admittably debatable assumption that Peery can be trusted) dying. Goody.

1982IM - GAME REVIEWS

ALLEN PEARS (Austria-Hungary): As with any activity involving seven individuals, each views the situation from his own perspective. I had the opportunity to read a ccuple of the other endgame statements for this game that were printed with the concluding season before I wrote mine. After reading those I almost wonder if we were

playing in the same game.

It was my recollection that the game started off rather predictably - England and France hitting Germany, Italy grabbing Tunis, and Austria (me) siding with Russia against Turkey. In 1902 I received a good offer from Turkey to change sides and hit Russia, for which Bob Bragdon took exception. After it appeared Germany was going to be blown out of the game, I took it on myself to save Randy by talking Italy into attacking France to take some of the pressure off Germany. So I convinced Italy to go out on a limb for Germany, and I completed my switch to Turkey's side which should take Russia off Germany's back. And what happens - Germany decides to purpose to E/F while the powers who came to his aid (A/I) are left out to dry.

Bob Bragdon indicated that Randy came in for some hostile press when he made this switch, and I agree because I wrote as much as possible trying to convince Randy to come back to the Central Powers Alliance that he had abandoned. So as Randy prospered as a puppet, Italy and I were eliminated. It was only justice that Randy left the game next. "A coward dies a thousand deaths, but a brave man only dies one."

I have no real regrets in the game except for one. I would have liked to ally with Russia and seen how well it would have worked out. My shift away from him was

meant to save Germany, but obviously that was a mistake.

I do have a final complaint about this game and probably all Diplomacy games - which has to do with endgame statements. It seems that always the writer is innocent of all hostile actions, stabs, or anything else. Writers are always "amazed" at the treacherous, lying, deceiving actions of the rest of the players. I received some criticism for the normal actions of a Diplomacy player while the other writers were as pure as the driven snow - or so they would have you believe. To these players in all games, I suggest you consider how ludicrous your statements sound; you are just deceiving yourself since everyone else knows what to expect from all diplomacy players.

Finally, John Ferguson played an excellent game. He stuck with his plant and chipped away at enemies and allies alike, taking the win after eliminating one enemy (Italy) and two allies (England and Germany) while stabbing a third ally (Russia).

He played it like a real Diplomacy player.

LARRY CHAFETZ (Turkey): I want to congratulate John Ferguson on a well deserved

win. His play in the north was excellent.

It is truly unfortugate that the U.S. mail service is not reliable and played a part in this game. NMR's are ruinous to allies & detract from an opponents win.

I would like to make a suggestion that players consider it a three week deadline, giving themselves one week for the mail. Moves can be revised by phone or a later letter.

When I joined the game in 07 I did not really know what was going on but it seemed that is was everyone against me.

I played to consolidate my position & I outguessed Russia and succeeded. The French-German stab allowed me to form an alliance with Russia.

I believe that a Turk-Russian statemate line could have been formed. However my ineptness & distrust of Russia caused my F Rumania to become ineffective. To be truthful it was mostly my ineptitude.

Unfortunately I have little or no sympathy for Randy Ellis. Once your in you should play to survive or inflict the most punishment on your enimies. You should not give your bases to an allie just because you can not win.

At least that is my philosophy.
