Big news from the Ignobel Prizes...

"IT'S MORNING AGAIN IN AMERICA!"

Two days before Christmas, as is traditional, the Ignobel Prizes were awarded before a large crowd of citizens of the Four And A Half Kingdom and tourists from all over the world, in the Salon du Grand-Duc in the Hotel de Wogastisburg et Metropole. These prizes, established by the will of the famous master spy, war profiteers, and currency manipulator Alfors Ignobel. (1838-1937), go annually in five fields which he did his best to promote during his lifetime.

These awards have become a regular feature in the jet set's annual December tour of The Four And A Half Kingdoms, beginning with the Winter Solstice Festival in the ancient matriarchy of Skandalutz, and continuing on to the annual Circus Bowl game in the Circus Minimus in the Temporary Roman Empire. The Winter Solstice Festival culminates in the Sacred Lottery among all men, Skandalous or tourists, to determine who will be the next King of Skandalutz. Another feature of the Festival is the Sacred Feast, at which last year's King is sacrificed to the mother goddess, cooked (usually by a recipe from his native country) and eaten.

Last year's King, the North Korean Kim Kip Ling, was served with bok choy and kim chi, and eaten with chopsticks. (A cultural attache from Taiwan had spent a couple of weeks teaching members of the Skandalous Court, including the Queen, how to use these implements.) Shortly before his sacrifice, this younger son of North Korean Preaident Kim Il Sung explained the strange press reports that had come out of his country a month ago. "I fled to Skandalutz," he told reporters, "because North Korea is on the point of becoming the first hereditary monarchy in the Communist world. My older brother, Kim Dae Jung, wanted to make the succession completely secure by putting me out of the way. One of his toadies set loose a rumor that I had returned to Pyongyang. Kim Dae Jung panicked, and opened fire with an AK-47 on a palace janitor who is actually our half-brother and therefore resembled me. When Kim Dae Jung appeared at a diplomatic reception with a smoking gun, crying 'The reactionary dog Kim is dead!', what were people to think?" Later Kim Kip Ling remarked that he had lived longer than he would have if he had stayed home.

The winner of the 1906 Sacred Lottery was the American actor Silvio Scumbaggi, who rose from obscure schlock movies to make a reputation in famous schlock movies. His first film was Dirty Mary, in which he played the lover of the world's female mud-wrest-ling champion. (It had been intended as an X-rated film, but so much was covered by mud that it was able to get an R-rating.) He then made the Rocco series, in which a poor boy from a Philadelphia slum rose to become the greatest mob "enforcer" the world had ever seen. (In successive Rocco films he killed the entire membership of a rival Irish gang that had ruled the West Side of Manhattan since the Potato Famine, a special Senate committee on the rackets, an entire Federal Circuit Court, and the whole population of a South American country which tried to ban the export of certain vegetable products.) However, Scumbaggi was best known for his 'Bumbo' films, 'in which he restored America to greatness by conquering six tropical nations especially invented by his studio for the scries.

Present when Scumbaggi was chosen was his wife, the Icelandic actress Eirika Raudha, who is chiefly famous for having legs so long that there are two knees in each of them. Eirika seemed highly enthusiastic about this honor conferred upon her husband,

and informed reporters at great detail about her own career in films. Eirika's most famous role is the Viking heroine Hallgerdh Longlegs, whom she brought to the screen in Divorce Icelandic Style. This great success was followed by Divorce Icelandic Style II: Foster-Father Dearest. Soon to be released is Divorce Icelandic Style III: Not with My Hair You Don't.

These events still had the crowd burzing when it assembled in the capital of the Grand Duchy of Wogastisburg-Schlämpenbüttel to hear the reading of the Ignobel Prizes by Aloys Ignobel, 80, son of the prizes' founder and of Mata Hari. The War Prize is traditionally awarded first. Though speculation about the Middle East, the Persian Gulf War, and the continuing conflict in Southeast Asia was rife, the War Prize went

to President Ronald Reagan for the U.S. war with Libya.

At this announcement, loud cheering was heard from the many American present. It was the first award of the War Prize to an American since President Nixon's victory in 1969, and some Americans had despaired that such a thing could ever happen again. In making the award, Herr Ignobel praised the innovative approach of the American President to war. "We need not think of war only as a continual conflict, begun by a border crossing, and continuing without pause until one side caves in," he told the assemblage. "There is a place still in the world for this sort of war, as the 1980 War Prize to President Hussein of Traq showed. But President Reagan is boldly proceeding with new initiatives in this ancient art. Moving in for one tremendous bash, and then acting as if nothing had happened, may well be the coming style." The War Prize was accepted for President Reagan by Lt. Col. Oliver North, who mumbled something inaudible about "the shores of Tripoli".

The Espionage Prize also went to an American, Edward Lee Howard. "This was much easier than last year's Espionage Prize," said Herr Ignobel. "This year, unlike 1985, there was one candidate whose merits stood out far above the others. The foolish idealism of years gone by is now no longer a part of the ancient and noble profession of espionage. Now espionage, like war, is a strictly cash business without bothersome sentimentality." Almost every Espionage Prize has been awarded in absentia and this one was no exception. Howard's prize was accepted for him by Victor Louis, a Soviet journalist who is so shadowy that he disappeared before he left the dais.

A third American won the Genocide Prize: John Gotti, Honorary Mayor of Howard Beach, New York. "In a day and age when the pacifistic notions of 'brotherhood' are rampant throughout the world," Herr Ignobel said, "John Gotti and his fellow residents of Howard Beach are determined, at whatever cost in blood, to keep their own ethnic group dominant in their community." The award was accepted for Mr. Gotti, who regretted that family business kept him away, by P. W. Botha, who called him "an inspiration to all of us who are engaged in this common effort." However, Pete Hamill was heard to mutter over the punch bowl to Mike Royko that "this is the first time the Genocide Prize was ever awarded to anyone who offed a whole lot of his fellow-ethnics."

The enthusiasm of the Americans present, already high, mounted further when Lt. Col. North was called back to the dais to receive the Provocation Prize. "His deeds as agent provocateur," said Herr Ignobel, "are bearing fruit, in that the American. Congress and press are already trying to investigate his conduct, and that of the man whose orders he has faithfully followed throughout. These investigative efforts will provide the U.S. government with the excuse it needs to clamp down on pacifistic op-

position to its policies, once and for all."

But when the Military Science prize was awarded, pandemonium broke out among the Americans, since this also went to one of their countrymen. (This is the first time that one nation has made a clean sweep of all five Ignobel Prizes since Germany did it in 1939.) The award went to Doubledoctor Jerry Pournelle, the brilliant American war theorist, and science-fiction wrater and editor. "Doubledoctor Pournelle," said Herr Ignobel, "has taken a small but influential American subculture, that once was a hotbed of Pacifism, and turned it into enthusiastic advocates of nuclear war. In the larger society of which he is a member, he has promoted the development of many marvelous new weapons of great killing potential, and even greater potential for fin-

ancial profit. The American economy is already bounding upward again as a result of the heavy expenditures made in the construction of that fabulous new weapons system, the -" At this point Herr Ignobel broke off and asked an aide, in a soft whisper, "What is proper to call that thing this year?"

The aide, believed to be his son Albrecht Ignobel, returned in a whisper which we can pass on because, right in the front row, were 3 CIA, 2 KGB, 2 MI-5, and one Surete agent all trained in lip-reading. "They don't like it to be called 'Star Wars' any more - 'Peace Chield' gets people thinking about peace, which is a bad idea - nobody knows what 'SDI' stands for - 'Astrodome' leads to confusion ""

"Aha! I've got it!" said the elder Ignobel. "When I was younger, there was a plan just like it." He continued to address the crowd. "That marvelous, profit-

able military plan, the Great Big Maginot Line in the Sky."

"And so, for his efforts in promoting this and other weapons systems, the Ignobel Prize for Military Science is awarded to the man who will certainly become Secretary of Defense when America gets its first Yuppie President - Doubledoctor Jerry Pournelle!"

Doubledoctor Pournelle was unavailable for the award, since urgent government business had called him to the Hull Ranch in Costa Rica. The award was accepted for him by a man who was so drunk that nobody caught his name. The same front-row espionage agents claimed that he spoke English with a Finnish-American accent, and mumbled something about "if I only had my Galaxy back again."

By this time, scarcely anything could be heard owing to the pandemonium created by the Americans, most of them 'Yuppies', who were snake-dancing through the salon, squirting champagne at the crowd, and chanting, "We're Number One! We're Number One!" This last chant seemed to mystify Aloys Ignobel, who said to his son, "When I was a boy, my father sent me to school in America to get away from World War I. I learned there what 'Number One' means..."

The celebration went on until the small hours of the morning, and ended only when the last sommolent bodies were swept out by the janitor into a gutter, where they were jack-rolled by small children on their way to school.

There is an interesting application of the rules in the situation in the Balkans. The Turkish "A Bul-Ser" was supported by the Italian A Tri and therefore succeeds. This dislodges the Austro-Hungarian A Ser and therefore cuts the support it was delivering into Bulgaria to the Austro-Hungarian move "A Gre-Bul". That move was therefore stood off by the Turkish "F Bla-Bul(e.c.)" Since the support given to that move by the Turkish A Con was cut by the Austro-Hungarian F Aeg. See Rule X for details.

VIENNA to WORLD: As our gracious Emperor had feared, his valiant attempts to instill peace among our brothers has resulted in a knee-biting back-stab. The Emperor must now announce the end of Austrian neutrality, as he joins with the French in

crushing the Italians.

BERLIN: Germany does not intend to annex any of the areas currently occupied by German forces. We only wish to remove those governments that have committed hostile acts against the German Empire and to restore authority to the legitimate rulers of these countries. We have no wish to defy any Great Power at would be happy to submit to outside arbitration. In particular, we encourage the United States of play an active role in leading the European powers to a peaceful settlement. - Chancellor

been valid.

NO NEW RULES!

In nearly 24 years of running postal war-games, I have from time to time found examples of the player who thinks that the first step in playing a game is, negotiating the rules. If I comprehend such a person's frame of mind correctly, he (I've never found a female one yet except Margaret Gemignani) thinks that Allan B. Calhamer once published a set of suggestions, on which an interesting board game called "Diplomacy" might be based if you didn't pay very close attention to them. Aside from Gemignani (who once submitted moves for "Summer 1901") the names of W. Elmer Hinton, David Braunagel, Buddy Tretick, and Stanley Johnson come to mind.

We've got another one on our hands, it appears. I will pay more attention to his reputation that he himself does, by not giving his name. But it was he who objected in the situation I described on p. 11 of GRAUSTARK "528. To repeat, this was the situation and the adjudication according to the rules, with impossible moves underlined:

PLAYER 1: A Tri-Bud; A Vie S A Tri-Bud; A Ven-Tri.
PLAYER 2: F Alb-Tri; A Bud S F Alb-Tri; A Rum S A Bud.

The key to this situation is our contentious friend's claim that the support order "A Bud S F AlbaTri" has been cut by Player 1's order "A Vie S A Tri-Bud". In his exact words, "A Vie is clearly attacking the army in bud by its support of A Tri to Bud."

Let's see what the actual rules say, a matter which apparently does not bulk very greatly in this individual's mind. Rule IX.1 begins "A unit may give up its move in order to support another unit trying to hold or enter a space." (My underlining.) A support is, therefore, not an attack. Rule X says, "If a unit ordered to support in a given space is attacked from a space different from the one into which it is giving support, or is dislodged by an attack from any space, including the one into which it is giving support, then its support is cut." (My underlining, again.)

If this claim is allowed - and it is nowhere supported by the rulebook - a support becomes an attack at the same time. This would profoundly change the character of the game. What we are having proposed to us is a change of rules, giving us a situation not to be found anywhere in the rulebook. In the above example, there is no order which cuts the support given by Player 2's A Bud to his attack F Alb-Tri. The order "A Tri-Bud" does not cut this support, since the A Bud is being attacked from the space into which it is giving support, and is not dislodged because A Bud is in turn supported by A Rum. The order "A Vie S A Tri-Bud" is not an attack, and therefore cannot cut a support.

There are some other questions about how support orders should be written, which have come up in the adjudication of the "Fall 1905" moves on 1985CY on pp. 9-10. Players curious about the actual adjudication of support moves should someult those situations.

GRAUSTARK players are assured that present and future games in this publication will continue to be adjuticated by the rules (as revised in 1971 by the game's designer, Allan B. Calhamer, and published in 1976 by Avalon-Hill, its publisher), and not by such innovations as the one attempted above. In fact, if you are in doubts about the competence of a postal gamesmaster, put the above situation before him or her. If you get any adjudication other than the one given above, you should seriously question whether you should play in a 'zine so badly managed. The same thing goes for the situations disussed in this issue in the adjudications of 1985CY and 1986AV. Pose these as problems to any gamesmaster of whose competence you have doubts, and then judge for yourselves.

Scott Skellie asks about a variant called "free set-up Diplomacy". The only difference from the original game is that each player gets to decide what units he wants to begin with, and is not restricted to the set-up mandated in the rules. (For example, Germany could begin with a fleet rather than an army in Berlin, or Austria-Hungary could abandon a naval strategy altogether and begin with 3 armies.) Any player who knows about whether such games are currently being organized by mail should let me know, and I'll pass it on to GRAUSTARK's readers.

John Kandara similarly asks about a global version of Diplomacy in present-day politics. Does anyone have any information about whether such a game exists?
