WHAT ABOUT ALL THOSE PRESS RELEASES?

At present 18 postal Diplomacy games are running in GRAUSTARK. This means that if I don't want to pay an extra 17¢ per issue in postage, and keep the mailing weight uncer 1 ounce, I simply cannot put all press releases in the current issue. The best I can promise is that a press release will be printed no more than one issue late. I am sorry to disappoint several players who insist that the attached three or four long press releases absolutely have to go into the current issue, but the job of an editor is to edit.

THE DIPLOMATIC POUCH

ALIAN B. CALHAMER, 501 N. Stone, La Grange Park, III. 60525: I have been looking at your article on Pandin's Paradox in GRAUSTARK #535.

Considering that your accuracy is almost invariably 100%, I am surprised to find that I disagree with two of the results. I may also have something to add to the dis-

cussion of the other three.

To have a Pandin's Paradox, you almost have to have a convoyed army attacking a supporting fleet. That bare minimum doesn't exist in your cases II. and III., where the convoyed army attacks an attacking fleet. In case II., the army moves, contrary to your indication. In case III., I agree with your result, it just doesn't involve a paradox.

In cases I. and IV., you use the 1971 Rulebook, which is indeed open to Pandin's Paradox, and seems to offer no solution. You and your readers probably should be aware,

though, that there is a 1982 Rulebook, which can decide both these cases.

1982 Rule XII.5 says, "If a convoyed army attacks a fleet which is supporting an action in a body of water; and that body of water contains a convoying fleet, that

support is not cut."

Thus in case I. the German support of its action in the North Sea would not be cut, Germany would gain the North Sea, and the Russian Army would not proceed to London. The English support of English Channel would also not be cut, so England would hold the Channel.

In case IV. the English support of North Sea would not be cut, so the convoyed Germany Army would move, incidentally ousting the English Fleet, even though its support would still be good. This result might be considered a paradox of sorts, but it

does not leave you without a solution.

Case V. is, as I think you recognize, not a Pandin's Paradox, and the 1971 Rule-book gives a solution, however surprising. The 1982 Rulebook would give a different solution, since 1982 Rule XIII.4 says, "...The army is not prevented from moving due to dislodgment of fleets, unless all the routes are disrupted."

The computer programs may implement the 1982 Rulebook, in which case there may not be any Pandin's Paradox to trouble them. There is always an outside possibility that it will pop up again in some yet more complicated form, but I think the known forms of

it are quashed by 1982 Rule XII.5.

I have thought that this result was an argument in favor of the 1982 Rulebook.

Congratulations on topping 500 issues. Your quality and reliability have been extremely high, from your founding of the postal hobby through to the present day.

Congratulations again.

((Thank you. Praise from Caesar is praise indeed.

((Would you believe that this is the first I have heard of the existence of the 1932 Rulebook? It had been my understanding that the 1971 James Research Rulebook had been taken over in toto by Avalon-Hill, and was still valid. I have been using the 1971 Rulebook for adjudications ever since it came out. This, however, is characteristic of the contempt for the postal hobby which Avalon-Hill seems to show.

((With the changes cited in the 1982 Rulebook, this seems to resolve all the cases

cited in my article in the last issue, except for case II. The moves are:

ENGLAND: A Edi-Hol; F Nth C A Edi-Hol; A Bel S A Edi-Hol; F Eng S F Nth.

GERMANY: F Hol-Nth; F Nwy S F Hol-Nth.

I would say that England is attacking from the North Sea into Holland with one support, and Germany is attacking from Holland into the North Sea with one support, so the moves stand each other off. But, then, I do not have a copy of the 1982 Rulebook.

((I have not heard anything from Eric Raymond, or from anyone else who has written, ir writing, or owns a computer program for adjudicating Diplomacy. Hopefully, further comments will come in to a future issue on this topic. Further comments on the adjudications presented in #535, and on other difficult cases, would also be welcome.))

O, CANADA

Alan Stewart writes that there may be a postal strike in Canada, beginning on 16 June. There may be a last-minute settlement, but if there is not, then the pending deadlines in all postal Diplomacy games involving Canadian players will be postponed until the fifth Saturday after the announced end of the strike. The postal Diplomacy games that will be affected are 1985H, 1986AF, 1986AZ, and 1987AD. In addition, the new game announced above will go ahead with a different French player, and Alan Stewart will be entered in a later game.

If the strike goes ahead, notices to that effect will appear in the media and be

posted in post offices.

If a postal strike ever takes place in the U.S., all pending deadlines will be postponed to the fifth Saturday after the announced end of the strike.

CAME FEES WILL INCREASE

. It now seems fairly probable that postage rates will rise next year to at least 25¢ for the first ounce, and 20¢ for each additional ounce. (Post cards will be 16¢.) Since most of any upcoming postal Diplomacy game will be played under the new rate, I am regretfully increasing the game fee to \$25. This will become effective on Saturday U August 1987, the publication date of GRAUSTARK "538. As always, the game fee will include a subscription to GRAUSTARK as long as the game lasts. On 8 August, the subscription rate for non-players will rise to 12 issues for \$10. Back issues will go to 10 for \$3. There was no rate increase when the postage rate went from 20¢ to 22¢ per ounce, but I fear that now one is unavoidable.
