LONDON: Admiral of the Fleet Carey
regrets to report the failure of the
mission of the gunboat H. S. S. John
Birch to shell the home of John Board-
man, gangling Grand Comptroller of the
East Paterson Diplomacy Cinc, due to
extraneous political considerations more
adequately outlined in a statement of
Secretary-General Ward.

NEW YORK CITY (INS): The gunboat
sent to this city on loan to Mattel Toys
Inc. arrived yesterday only to be greet-
ed by the French Consul and ordered back
to Europe. Speculation was rife that
the Kangaroo allies had fallen out with
the company until a press conference
with the French Consul who said, "There
has been no falling out at all. It's
just that that damned blackguard Board-

TRYPHOME: With the outbreak of hostilities in Europe, Prime Minister Taxis told correspondents that the Kingdom of Tryphome would remain scrupulously neutral. Considering just these three, Soviets held 93 out of 174 seats, with 39 each of Liberals and Socialists, and only 1 Tory. Federal politics are irrelevant; a large Tory delegation from, say, Arkansas in Ottawa means little more than a predominantly Democratic delegation of Louisianians in Washington.))

LONDON: England has not attacked Germany; England supported the Russians in destroying the German Fleet at Germany's request. The German High Command's request appeared to be genuine, but further investigation proved to show the original German request to have England assist in destroying the German fleet. While England has denied supporting any secret German plan, it now appears that the German High Command's policies are unforced. England will therefore land her troops in Livonia and contribute to support a communist German.

AMERICA (a March 1967, April 1968) of five million indemnity assessed by English suggestion of a ready in the fleet of her German ally last fall. This reaction followed on English disclosure that the destruction of the fleet in Livonia was not undertaken as the result of a change in alliance, but a response by England to a German plan to assist an eastern insurrection.

"The United States of America stands ready at any time to negotiate peace among the parties to the present European war," Willquit said. "Furthermore, we will ensure, to any nation or individual wishing to get out or stay out of the war, the full support of the United States government."

This policy is also "firmly opposed" in London and Ottawa, which are already indignant over the refusal of the Americans to extradite Canadian draft dodgers.
