



Foul Play?


To the Editor:


















THE 2005 IGNOBEL PRIZES

While the rest of Europe shivers in the winter weather, the annual tourist season draws thousands to the Four And A Half Kingdoms, high in the Balkan Massif. The region's hot springs, geysers, fumaroles, and steam vents maintain a warm climate, and tourists are also attracted to the many festivals which take place at this time of year.

The first stop on most tours is the Winter Solstice Festival in the ancient matriarchy of Skandalutz. This orginatic festivity probably dates from the Old Stoned Age, and features the selection of a new king in the Sacred Lottery, in which the names of all adult males, Skandals and tourists, are entered. After the Sacred Feast, the winner is married to the Queen, who is also High Priestess of the Mother Goddess.

This follows the sacrifice of the previous year's king to the Mother Goddess, after which he is eaten at the Sacred Feast. This does not notably deter male attendance. As John Lennon said to Janis Joplin at the 1967 Festival, "Only one bloke gets chosen king, but everyone gets laid!"

Last year's king was chosen under the name of Abu Musab al-Zarqawi, although there is some doubt as to whether he really is the al-Qaeda leader of that name. The American Yippie leader Julius Orange, who has been hiding out in the Balkan Massif ever since the Chicago riots of 1968, claims that several people have been using that name. When asked about this in 2004, the king replied, "I am the dread terrorist Abu Musab al-Zarqawi. Ask about a franchise in your area."

Whatever his actual name, this king was sacrificed on schedule, and made his final appearance at the Sacred Feast as a pilaf. The new King of Skandalutz is Michael Brown, formerly director of the U. S. Federal Emergency Management Agency. Almost as soon as his name was announced, he received a message from President Bush, proclaiming that "Brownie would do one heckuva job" in his new post. The speed of this message led Julius Orange to declare that "Everyone knows the Sacred Lottery is fixed," an accusation that over the centuries has been frequently made but never proven. Later, Orange cited the events of 998 AD, in which the horse of Pope Formosus II bolted and carried him over the border just in time for him to be entered in, and to win, that year's Sacred Lottery.

From there, those tourists still capable of motion went on to the awards of the Ignobel Prizes in the Salon du Grand-Duc of that elegant Gilded Age hostelry, the Hôtel de Wogastisburg et Metropole in Wogastisburger-Neustadt, capital of the Grand Duchy of Wogastisburg-Schlämpenbüttel. (This is the "half kingdom" of the region's popular name, since it is technically a feudal dependency of the Holy Roman Empire.) As usual, the five prizes were presented by Aldo Ignobel, grandson of their founder Alfons Ignobel (1838-1937), the notorious master spy, spy master, smuggler, counterfeiter, currency manipulator, arms merchant, confidence man, and caterer of coups d'etat. The terms of his will, which was probated in Wogastisburg-Schlämpenbüttel by the Court of Last Chancery, provides that the prizes are to be awarded annually by a self-perpetuating seven-member board which must include a descendant of Ignobel and a representative of the Bank der Sieben Zwergen, which administers the Ignobel fortune. There are present Aldo Ignobel and the distinguished Zürich gnome Rumpelsoftware. The identities of the other five members are traditionally kept secret. Two entirely different lists of them have been given on line, one from the Internet reference site Ickypedia, and the other from the notorious "conspiracy theory" website <www.bohdan.iknowsomethingyoudon'tknow. nyaa.nyaa.nyaa.dot.com>.

The 2005 War Prize went to Senator Hillary Clinton (D-NY) for her loyal support of the American conquest and annexation of Iraq, and of the concept of an "Axis of Evil" which, as Ignobel said, "Can be confidently expected to generate still more profitable wars." He went on to say that "This can be regarded as complementary to the earlier award of the War Prize to President Bush, since without the loyal support of Democratic members of Congress he would have been unable to present his war as the unanimous effort of the entire American people." The award was accepted for her by her colleague Senator Charles Schumer (D-NY), another faithful supporter of war.

The Espionage Prize also went to an American, John Negroponte, who was appointed Director of National Intelligence by President Bush. This, according to his award,

PLEASE STAND BY

I am willing to take over games that have been abandoned by their gamesmasters. So if you are a postal gamesmaster who is no longer able to publish, or if you are a player in a postal game of regular Diplomacy that has gone for two or three months without a move being published, please get in touch with the Orphan Games Director, Michael Lowrey. (See p. 11 for his address.) If the game is to continue in Graustark, I would need the addresses of all active players, the current position, and a list of who owns which supply centers. If subscription money can be passed along to me, fine. Otherwise I will ask players to join a new game in Graustark, or to subscribe to Graustark if they do not already do so. Players who resign or drop out can be replaced by Graustark stand-by players.

Graustark subscriptions for non-players are 10 issues for \$15 for U. S. addresses, and \$40 or 35 euros for others. Back issues as available # 2118 are 10 issues for \$5 for U. S. addresses. To foreign addresses, back

issues have the same price as for foreign subscriptions.

Players who phone in their moves should call me at 718-693-1579. (The other phone number, which I have printed in previous issues, is no longer valid.) There is an answering machine which can take your moves if I'm out. I do not have an e-mail address.

I want to again remind players that the U. S. Postal "Service" is not capable of reliably getting mail here in less than a week. Please take this into account in sending in your moves. If, a few times, your moves have arrived here by mail in less than a week, do not assume that this will always be the case.

Shortage of space and time requires a postponement of the "Dungeons & Christians" column to the next issue, by which time I hope to get caught up on information provided by Paul Cardwell Jr. and other writers in CAR-PGa Newsletter, published monthly by Cardwell, 1127 Cedar, Bonham, TX 75418 at \$12.00 a year for domestic, and \$13.50 a year for foreign, addresses. It keeps us posted on attacks on Dungeons & Dragons, other role-playing games, and collectible card games, most of which are grounded in wacky interpretations of Christian doctrine.

Meanwhile, the creationists of Dover, PA, have suffered a crushing defeat both in court and at the polls. They dominated the local school board, and with the encouragement of Fundamentalist Christians across the country had voted to include allegedly rival theories to evolution by natural selection in the curriculum. They were ready to

fight any test case bought in court against this notion by scientists.

Then elections took place, and all eight anti-evolution Republicans were replaced by Democrats who vowed to throw out this notion. This was quickly followed by a court decision that firmly ejected the essentially religious notion of "intelligent design" from the school curriculum in Dover. The new school board voted not to appeal this very sensibly written decision, and to eliminate "intelligent design" from the curriculum. The judge's decision eloquently described the distinction between science and religion, and connected "intelligent design" to the openly religious notion of "natural theology" proposed two centuries ago by a Church of England theologian. His decision also noted that the proponents of "intelligent design" did not intend to ensure "fairness" between two allegedly equally valid theories of human origins, but to teach Christian doctrines in the public schools, and that these proponents had lied about their intentions.

Needless to say, some Christian were furious. Rev. Pat Robertson, fresh from his comic-opera attempt to incite the assassination of the President of Venezuela, grumbled that if a natural disaster hits Dover, its residents might try calling on Darwin rather

than Jesus for help.

Now the struggle shifts to Kansas. In 1999, a conservative majority on the state school board voted to teach creationism in that state's public schools. In 2000 this plan was endorsed by George W. Bush, Al Gore, and every other candidate for the presidential nomination of either party except for Senator Bradley (D-IL). But later that year, the people of Kansas voted that conservative majority out of office.

The creationists got back in in 2005, and "made Kansas the most aggressive challenger to evolution in the nation, by adopting standards that redefined science itself so that it is not explicitly limited to natural explanations." (New York Times, 1 January 2006) But, as Arkansas discovered a quarter century earlier, this not only makes the state a national laughingstock, but also hampers efforts to attract computer programmers and other high-tech specialists to work in a state where their children will be taught biology out of Genesis. And major universities would be unlikely to admit students who present Kansas high school diplomas which signify that they are not equipped to deal with science.

However, it will not come to this. Kansas's openly religious definition of "science" will cause courts to reject this new curriculum, citing without further ado the well-known U. S. Supreme Court decision in Epperson v. Arkansas. Some Christians will persist in their belief that evolution by natural selection has been foisted on the educational system by a sinister little conspiracy of atheistic scientists, instead of being the fundamental organizing principle of the biological sciences, which are incomprehensible without it. But they will have no more influence than the people who claim that the Earth is flat, and that the whole space program is a governmental hoax.

Indeed, there are so many rival religious theories of creation, all of them unprovable assertions, that they have been made the base of parody. There is an Internet joke about a "flying spaghetti monster" which created the universe, and this is no more

provable or disprovable than the two accounts of "creation" in Genesis. (Yes, two. One begins in Genesis 1:1, and the other in Genesis 2:4. Obviously, two separate stories were conflated.) But the numerical value of 39c is not printed on the stamp, which is labeled only "First Class Mail". This stamp should therefore not be used on mail directed outside the United States. The Universal Postal Union has this pettifogging regulation that only stamps denominated with Arabic numerals are valid for use in the international mails.

*

I had originally intended to print in this issue my review of John Maddox Roberts' SPQR IX: The Princess and the Pirates, the ninth book in his SPQR series of the detective adventures of Senator Decius Caecilius Metellus Junior (b. 90 BCE). However it got crowded out by the annual report of the award of the Ignobel Prizes, and the time pressure under which this issue was prepared. It will appear in the next issue.

And there seems to be a problem in the numbering or chronology of the books in this series, possibly arising from the fact that its more recent books were printed in German translation by Goldmann before the original English editions appeared from St. Martin's Press. For example, SPQR VIII, set in 53 BCE, was Die Rache der Flußgötter in German and The River God's Vengeance in the original English. (It was reviewed in Graustark #762, with a query about why the German translator had turned the river god from singular to plural.) But the next German translations were listed as:

SPQR IX: In Namens Caesar ("In the Name of Caesar")

SPQR X: Die Schiffe der Kleopatra ("The Ships of Cleopatra")

SPQR XI: Mord am Vesuv ("Murder at Vesuvius")

(These English re-translations of the titles are my own. I am not at present certain what the original English titles are.)

However, the latest book in this series to be published in English is *SPQR IX: The Princess and the Pirates* (2005), set in 51 BCE. At a guess, this is the book published in German as *SPQR X: Die Schiffe der Kleopatra*. What became of *In the Name of Caesar* I do not at present know.

And, while we're on the topic, it has been almost three years since I last published, in Graustark #746, a bibliography of crime novels with historical settings. I plan to update this bibliography in the near future, probably in May for the 43rd anniversary issue. Readers who know of such novels which may have escaped my attention are invited to send in bibliographic information about these books. Readers are also invited to send in their own reviews of such books.

Some time ago I cited some cases of people presenting "million-dollar bills" for purchases or currency exchange. I have just discovered where these alleged bills came from. They are advertisements, printed in Reisterstown, MD, whose fronts bear a strong resemblance to U. S. currency but carry tiny print asserting that "This note is not legal tender for any debt, public or private". They depict the Statue of Liberty, which does not appear on any real U. S. currency. What is superficially a Federal Reserve Bank seal actually reads "Reisterstown Millionaires Group", and the green seal reads not "The Department of the Treasury" but "The Department of Big Bucks". But those pitchmen

makes him "the most powerful chief of espionage ever in the history of a nominally 'democratic' country, with complete control not only over espionage operations of all his nation's agencies but also over which of their findings reach the President." Later, allegations of Negroponte's complete control were challenged by spokesmen for the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the espionage agencies of each of the U. S. armed forces, Section 10-10 of NASA, and the National Security Agency, whose official spokesman denied that any such agency exists. The award was accepted for Negroponte by George Tenet, who had won it in 2004.

The Genocide Prize went to Representative Tom Tancredo, who recently managed overwhelming approval in the House of Representatives of a bill to round up, arrest, and deport an estimated 11 to 20 million undocumented aliens in the United States, but without specifying who is going to do this. The award was accepted for him by Noh Kan-du, Third Assistant Graffiti Remover of the Great Wall of China. Comrade Noh

expressed his appreciation for Representative Tancredo's understanding of China's historic immigration policy, but ventured doubt that, a thousand years from now, tourists would come from all over the world to see the Great Wall of America.

The prize for Provocation, in the sense of the French term agent provocateur, went to General Paul Bremer, former U. S. military governor of Iraq and winner of the 2003 War Prize. General Bremer recently stated that America cannot keep order in Iraq with fewer than 500,000 troops on the ground. Such numbers could be obtained only with military conscription, which would provoke resistance so strong that President Bush will feel justified in canceling those civil liberties that have thus far escaped his attention, producing a very profitable civil war in America.

The prize for Military Science usually goes to the invention of a radical new weapon of war. This year, however, it was awarded to U. S. Secretary of War Donald H. Rumsfeld as the source and inspiration of orders authorizing the use of a very old weapon, torture, in interrogating prisoners of war and suspected terrorists in America. "This radical restoration of a practice formerly held in disfavor, if not actually banned, in the traditions of Anglo-Saxon law," Ignobel proclaimed, "is a credit to the ingenuity of the high office-holders of the Bush Administration, and a blow to those who are so foolish as to believe that a nation can allow civil liberties and still be governed efficiently."

The next stop on the winter tourist itinerary in the Four And A Half Kingdoms was the annual Circus Bowl game in Roma Temporaria, traditionally held in the Circus Minimus, the only Roman arena still in use. This year's score was Lions 10, Christians 1. The only Christian score was made by Rev. Pat Robertson, who called down a curse on one of the Lions, causing it to suffer a fatal stroke, and deluging the arena with seven inches of rain in 35 minutes, a downpour later named "Hurricane Anne" for Anne Coulter.

The last and newest event was a rock concert in the Kingdom of Pundschruk, traditional since the monarchy was restored during a riot at a rock concert in 2001. As usual, King Otto VIII performed on lead guitar. Before the restoration, he had been notorious as a computer hacker, virus designer, and leader of the rock group Your Motherboard Wears Army Reboots. Other, still exiled, royals were also among the performers. This year, five exiled and probably illegitimate Stuarts, performing as "The Young Pretenders", won riotous applause with a rap version of "Charlie Is My [Expletive Deleted] Darling".

in Reisterstown are just pikers. A new children's book, Mr. Chickee's Funny Money by Christopher Paul Curtis, features an annoying genius child who discovers a "one quadrillion dollar bill", a "genuine" currency note "accidentally slipped into circulation". The author's inspiration was probably the \$100,000 bill, which is used for transactions among Federal Reserve Banks but not in general circulation. However, one quadrillion dollars is approximately the value of the entire united States and everything in it.
