This information has already been sent to the players. Any player who does not have a copy of the postal rules should let me know, and I will send one. The deadline date for the "Spring 1901" moves is NOON, FRIDAY 28 APRIL 2006.

Five players got their first choices this time. No one selected England or Turkey as a first choice, so their players got respectively their second and third choices. If we count a first choice as six points, a second choice as five points, and so on, preferences are France 35, Italy 24, England 24, Russia 22, Germany 20, Austria-Hungary 14, Turkey 7.

Since I have not needed a Boardman Number for a new game for almost two years, I am not certain who is currently assigning them. Please refer to this as "the New Game" until I publish its Boardman Number in Graustark.

These votes are again submitted to the players, and should come in with the "Spring 1911" orders. As always, an abstention will be counted as a negative vote.

Following "Spring 1906" moves, France had to retreat or remove the dislodged F Tyr. I asked for this retreat by immediate return mail, but the French player was not at home to receive this request. He eventually retreated F Tyr-Lyo. I could not pass this information on to the other players, but apparently this did not matter to them, because they all sent in their "Fall 1906" moves anyhow.

The last English unit is removed, and England is out of the game. Turkey may build three new units, and Germany may build one. Italy must remove one unit, and Russia must remove two. The deadline for these "Winter 1906" orders is NOON, FRIDAY 28 APRIL 2006.

PLEASE STAND BY

I am willing to take over games that have been abandoned by their gamesmasters. So if you are a postal gamesmaster who is no longer able to publish, or if you are a player in a postal game of regular Diplomacy that has gone for two or three months without a move being published, please get in touch with me and with the Orphan Games Director, Michael Lowrey. (See p. 11 for his address.) If the game is to continue in Graustark, I would need the addresses of all active players, the current position, and a list of who owns which supply centers. If subscription money can be passed along to me, fine. Otherwise I will ask players to join a new game in Graustark, or to subscribe to Graustark if they do not already do so. Players who resign or drop out can be replaced by Graustark stand-by players.

It is best if this is done quickly, should it be necessary. If a game is abandoned for too long, some players may lose interest, and may not continue to play when it resumes under another gamesmaster.

Stand-by players are always needed for postal Diplomacy games in Graustark. If you volunteer as a stand-by, you may be called upon whenever a current player misses a move. If you send in moves for that country for the next turn, and the present player does not, you will take over play of that position. No game fee will be asked, though you should keep your subscription current, or enroll in a new Graustark game. No stand-

- PATRIOTISM is the principal cause of war.

- PATRIOTISM is arresting an Irish professor who had been invited to lecture at Philadelphia, trying to shake him down for a \$265 bribe, and then strip-searching and jailing him, and deporting him the next day. (*Ibid.*)
- PATRIOTISM is immigration officials impersonating occupational safety officials in order to catch undocumented immigrants who complain about safety conditions at work.

If you do not already have the postal rules for Diplomacy, Inflame which were last published in Graustark #749, let me know when you send in O Optic N Nerves your game fee, and I'll send you a copy.

Graustark subscriptions for non-players are 10 issues for \$15 for U. S. addresses, and \$40 or 35 euros for others. Back issues as available # 2124 are 10 issues for \$5 for U. S. addresses. To foreign addresses, back issues have the same price as for foreign subscriptions.

Players who phone in their moves should call me at 718-693-1579. (The other phone number, which I have printed in previous issues, is no longer valid.) My answering machine has been fixed, so moves can once more be left on it if no one is home.

I want to again remind players that the U. S. Postal "Service" is not capable of reliably getting mail here in less than a week. Please take this into account in sending in your moves. If, a few times, your moves have arrived here by mail in less than a week, do not assume that this will always be the case.

Graustark readers who are interested in postal games which don't run here, are invited to write to the publishers of 'zines with which I trade, and ask what game openings they have. For their addresses, see all the readers indicated by "(T)" for "trade" in the Graustark Directory on pp. 8-9. Several of these publishers run a wide variety of postal games.

The United States Postal "Service" has finally broken down and released to the general public a full list of the new postal rates. I actually got one from a postal clerk, but I won't say where, as I don't want to get her into trouble for unwittingly giving information to a mere patron. Later, I was sent a list by Don Del Grande, sometime publisher of the gaming 'zine Lemon Curry.

Here are the rates in cents, by ounce. All domestic mail between 13 and 16 ounces in weight must go at the priority male rate of \$4.05. The foreign rates are for air mail; lower surface rates apply only to weights of greater than one pound. Special temporary rates for Micronesia and the Marshall Islands are not included.

Postcards are 24c within the U.S.A., 55c to Canada and Mexico, and 75c anywhere else. (The card itself costs another 2c.) Aerogrammes are 75c to all countries.

If the postal definition of "western Europe" hasn't changed since the last postal

rate increases in 2002, it includes Finland, Sweden, Denmark, Germany, Switzerland, Italy, Greece, and all European nations west of them, and, by a new exception, Israel. "JANZ" stands for Japan, Australia, and New Zealand. Other rates may be obtained from

Jim Burgess has informed me that Tom Howell is still the Boardman Number custodian. Expect the Boardman number of the new game on p. 3 to be published in the next Graustark.

Readers have probably noticed that I am accepting game fees and subscriptions from overseas in euros, provided that payment is in euro currency notes. Recently this most solid of currencies got another boost, thanks to the Arabophobes who run American foreign and economic policy. The successful attempt to prevent a Dubai company in the United Arab Emirates from buying the firm which administers five American ports has naturally been resented in Dubai, whose rulers had thought that they were one of America's few Arab allies. So Dubia is now accepting payment for oil only in euros rather than in dollars. This change has sent the value of the euro upwards with respect to the dollar.

I am trying to check out a twentieth-century rumor about military training in nations which anticipate that they might have to fight American troops. Sometimes this rumor is attached to Germany and sometimes to Russia. Allegedly their military academies teach American football to officer candidates. It is claimed that they believe American officers model their tactics after football, and so teaching this game to their own officers will enable them to understand how American officers formulate field tactics.

This hypothesis is superficially attractive. Opposing teams form lines against each other, and offensives originate from behind these lines, in attempts to break through, evade, or go over them. But it strikes me as being rather too facile. Can any reader throw light on this rumor?

You really have to be an expert in Washington trivia to be familiar with the accomplishments of Representative Marion Zioncheck (D-WA), the "Mad Congressman". He flourished briefly, some seventy years ago, and at this late date I am not sure how he manifested his alleged madness. But it seems to have made a terrific impact at the time, and was the subject of many bad jokes. There was even a card game named for him, a free-swinging variant of Rummy which my wife's family played under its alternative name "Crummy Rummy".

But now Representative Zioncheck's title has been challenged by a new contender. He is Representative Charles Rangel (D-NY), and the particular bee in his bonnet is a revival of the military draft. Nor should we regard the bill which he has introduced in Congress as a mere revival of the military draft as it existed during the war with Vietnam, or even in World War II. He wants women as well as men to be drafted, and the age of eligibility would be from 18 to 42! (Our Town, 30 March 2006)

Of course, there is always the possibility that Rangel is against the American attempt to conquer and annex Iraq, and indeed he has voted against his own draft bill. Although his real motivation is thoroughly opaque, and probably not the product of a sane and rational mind, a draft would turn campus opinion on war from mild annoyance to loud, full-scale resistance.

Or maybe it has finally been realized in Washington that the announced plans of Bush the Son for the Muddle East cannot be accomplished with an all-volunteer army, particularly if those plans include the conquest, occupation, and annexation of Iran. (They're supposed to have "weapons of mass destruction", too, just as Iraq did. And we all know how that worked out.) And even if Rangel has taken leave of his senses, his plan for such an extensive military draft will fit the agenda of Bush the Son and his handlers.
