

## PLEASE STAND BY

I am willing to take over games that have been abandoned by their gamesmasters. So if you are a postal gamesmaster who is no longer able to publish, or if you are a player in a postal game of regular Diplomacy that has gone for two or three months without a move being published, please get in touch with me and with the Orphan Games Director, Michael Lowrey. (See p. 11 for his address.) If the game is to continue in Graustark, I would need the addresses of all active players, the current position, and a list of who owns which supply centers. If subscription money can be passed along to me, fine. Otherwise I will ask players to join a new game in Graustark, or to subscribe to Graustark if they do not already do so. Players who resign or drop out can be replaced by Graustark stand-by players.

It is best if this is done quickly, should it be necessary. If a game is abandoned for too long, some players may lose interest, and may not continue to play when it resumes under another gamesmaster.

Stand-by players are always needed for postal Diplomacy games in Graustark. If you volunteer as a stand-by, you may be called upon whenever a current player misses a move. If you send in moves for that country for the next turn, and the present player does not, you will take over play of that position. No game fee will be asked, though you should keep your subscription current, or enroll in a new Graustark game. No standby will be called upon in a game in which he or she has already played.

Stand-by volunteers who are willing to take on additional games of postal Diplomacy are listed below. A stand-by player who is already playing in a Graustark game is indicated by "\*". If you wish your name added to or removed from this list, please let

## DUNGEONS & CHRISTIANS - CLXXXVIII

In the United States, the legal problems for Dungeons & Dragons (D&D) and other role-playing games (RPGs) usually deal with claims that they promote murder, suicide, demon worship, or other anti-social activities. Mind you, none of these claims have ever been supported by a court decision, and lately Christians have gone on to attack other allegedly pernicious activities of greater notoriety such as *The Da Vinci Code*, the teaching of evolution, and attempts to end the persecution of Muslims, homosexuals, Neo-Pagans ("Witches"), and Atheists. Besides, if they try to generate opposition to RPGs, they must first attempt to explain what they are, and this might instead get people interested in them.

But in Germany matters are somewhat different, according to a long article in the May 2005 CAR-PGa Newsletter by Carsten Obst. This article, entitled "The Enforced Canceling of the German Fan-RPG 'Raumpatrouille': A Study about the Legal Problems of Fan-Activities, Merchandising, and Copyrights". As a game, Raumpatrouille ("Space Patrol") is a creation familiar to many American fans of Lord of the Rings, Star Trek, Star Wars, and the Harry Potter series. They enjoy these books, films, and television shows so much that they create continuations and spin-offs of their own, which could run into copyright problems with the originals.

For example, the late folk-singer'Fred Kuhn created a Star Wars parody variously called "Star Whores" or "Making Wookies", to the tune of "Making Whoopie". The copyright holders of "Making Whoopie" and Star Wars made legal noises at him, forcing the withdrawal of a hilarious parody. But one of the associates of Gene Roddenberry, creator of Star Trek, once complained to him about the way in which science fiction fans were creating their own stories, fanzines, and websites about Star Trek. Roddenberry wisely told him not to worry about it, since such activities only added to the interest in, and popularity of, Star Trek.

Some of these activities got a bit extreme. A few Star Trek fans began creating stories about sexual activity aboard the Enterprise, often between Kirk and Spock. These came to be called "K/S fiction" or, from the "/" symbol, "slash fiction". (Might I suggest calling it "K/Y fiction?") Most of these authors were women, which led Roberta Rogow to sagely observe that the characters in this fan fiction were actually "lesbians with male bodies". No legal strictures were ever attempted against "K/S fiction", probably because they would merely call attention to its existence.

"Slash fiction" extended into other television shows. I am informed by Don Del Grande, sometime publisher of the gaming 'zine Lemon Curry, that "slash fiction" exists about the animated show *As Told by Ginger*, involving the "'tween-age" Ginger and her friend Darren. I have no doubt that other examples also exist.

But in Germany, as Obst observes, fan-RPGs are now in some legal trouble. (There does not seem to be any slash fiction there. Yet.) However, "the holder of the corresponding copyrights may have the right to demand fees from the authors and publishers, to intervene in writing, or even to forbid a fan-RPG."

And apparently the fan-RPG Raumpatrouille is considered as infringing on the copyright of a popular television show Raumpatrouille: Die phantastischen Abenteuer des Raumschiffs Orion ("Space Patrol: The Fantastic Adventures of the Spaceship Orion"). Yet "it is the enthusiastic fandom, which kept and keeps the Raumpatrouille alive with lots of activities and many conventions". But Bavaria, the firm which publishes the TV program, does not seem to realize how important its fan base is, and is threatening legal action against publication of the fan-RPG.

"Dungeons & Christians" has been running in my gaming 'zines since 1984, when it began by reporting John Sapienza's demolition of Pat Pulling's campaign against D&D. It

has since chronicled the continuing campaign by Christian fanatics to ban D&D, other RPGs, live-action RPGs (LARPs), and collectible card games including Magic: The Gathering, Vampire: The Masquerade, Werewolf: The Apocalypse, and others.

Important sources of informa-







tion about game-bashers are the Game Manufacturers Association (GAMA) and the Committee for the Advancement of Role-Playing Games (CAR-PGa), "an international network of researchers into all aspects of role-playing games". This column relies heavily on reports from both of these organizations. CAR-PGa Newsletter is published monthly by Paul Cardwell Jr., 1127 Cedar, Bonham, TX 75418 at \$12.00 a year for domestic, and \$13.50 a year for foreign, addresses. It keeps us posted on attacks on D&D and other RPGs, and provides us with arguments and strategies to be used against attempts to censor or ban games. It also lists upcoming gaming conventions. And, when space and time permit, I am going to cite its reports of the latest such attacks, and hopefully the crushing rebuttals made to them.

By the way, any time I cite a website in this column, or elsewhere in **Graustark**, I am inviting readers who are on the Internet, as I am not, to investigate it and let me know what is going on there. And CAR-PGa has its own web page: <www.theescapist.com/carpga.htm>. There is also a CAR-PGa page at <members.aol.com/waltonwj/carpga.htm>. Americans are still trying to figure out just what the current war with Afghanistan and Iraq is about. The usual claim is that it is an attempt to control oil production in the Muddle East. Others claim, more generally, that it is an attempt to establish American hegemony over a part of the world that has vigorously rejected it. But are we willing to consider the possibility that it is actually a religious war?

We could see it coming as early as the Gulf War, more properly described as "Bush War I". In 1992, a year after his victory, Bush the Father claimed that "The teachings of Jesus Christ are the moral force behind the Gulf War." Bush the Son reiterated this theme in 2003, when he called his private and personal war against Iraq a "Crusade". It should never be forgotten that the original Crusades were a long series of religious wars, compounded out of fanaticism and greed, characterized by horrendous slaughter, and ultimately a huge failure.

The support given to Bush War II asserts its essentially religious character. America's Roman Catholic bishops supported it with only four dissenting votes. "Evangelical" Christians, traditionally bitter enemies of Catholics, have joined with them in this support. In the New York Times of 20 January 2006, Charles Marsh listed numerous evidences of support for war by Evangelicals, 87% of whom support the war against Iraq.

- PATRIOTISM is the assertion that Zacharias Moussaoui should not have been put on trial, since he is not a criminal but an "enemy". As such, he allegedly should simply have been imprisoned indefinitely without a trial.
- PATRIOTISM is the approval, by "a special secret court for domestic surveillance" of 2,072 "domestic electronic surveillance and physical searches" in 2005, an increase over the 1,754 in 2004. (Newsday, 2 May 2006)
- PATRIOTISM is the additional issuance in 2005 of 9,254 FBI "national security letters", which do not require court approval, "to demand bank, credit card, Internet and other business records". (Ibid.)

Graustark subscriptions for non-players are 10 issues for \$15 for U. S. addresses, and \$40 or 35 euros for others. Back issues as available # 2124 are 10 issues for \$5 for U. S. addresses. To foreign addresses, back issues have the same price as for foreign subscriptions.

Players who phone in their moves should call me at 718-693-1579. (The other phone number, which I have printed in previous issues, is no longer valid.) My answering machine has been fixed, so moves can once more be left on it if no one is home.

I want to again remind players that the U. S. Postal "Service" is not capable of reliably getting mail here in less than a week. Please take this into account in sending in your moves. If, a few times, your moves have arrived here by mail in less than a week, do not assume that this will always be the case.

Graustark readers who are interested in postal games which don't run here, are invited to write to the publishers of 'zines with which I trade, and ask what game openings they have. For their addresses, see all the readers indicated by "(T)" for "trade" in the Graustark Directory on pp. 8-9. Several of these publishers run a wide variety of postal games.

It is with deep personal regret that I have to report the death of Brian Burley, a friend of more than forty years standing from science-fiction fandom and gaming. Brian died on 26 April as a result of a faulty gas line.

In Graustark #762 I reprinted a set of alleged data that I encountered in Jim Burgess's postal Diplomacy 'zine The Abyssinian Prince #286. Jim cited a book and two periodicals as his source for these data, which purported to claim that the average IQs of people in the states which supported John Kerry were considerably higher than the average IQs of people in the states which supported George W. Bush. However, I have recently discovered that this material actually comes from the Internet. Had I known this, I would have suspected that it was a forgery. It has been my experience that, without more reliable corroboration, nothing that appears on the Internet can be trusted. This is why I am not, and do not plan to be, connected up with anything so unreliable.

I discovered the facts about this hoax in Alex Boese's Hippo Eats Dwarf: A Field Guide to Hoaxes and Other B. S. (2006, Harcourt, Orlando; \$14 tpb). (I can also strongly recommend this author's The Museum of Hoaxes: A History of Outrageous Pranks and Deceptions (2002, Plume, MY; \$12 tpb).) This claim originally was attached to the 2000 presidential election, and first appeared on a Mensa Internet group in 2002, from a person using the pseudonym "Robert Calvert". Obviously it was updated to the 2004 elec-

tion.

But while this claim was not factually true, it was as Aristotle put it "poetically true". Both of the presidential campaigns of Bush the Son appealed to emotions rather than to reason. And, as conservatives frequently inform us, the two groups most hostile to their program are university faculties and journalists — groups that are better educated, better informed, and more intelligent than the general population.

No sooner has the U. S. Postal "Service" given us one set of postal rate increases, than it has set us up for another. It is now rumored that next year the rate for a one-ounce letter will go up to 42c.

Furthermore, the USP"S" is allegedly going to try what several European countries have already done - sell stamps that will be good for whatever the one-ounce rate may be at the moment of use. No matter what you paid for the stamp, it will still be good after any future rate increases. This will encourage people to buy enormous numbers of the one-ounce stamp now, so that money will be saved on any future rate increases. Such a strategy will also give the USP"S" a big one-time cash flow. This will supposedly offset the losses they have suffered from people who abandon their increasingly expensive rates for e-mail.

There is, however, one problem with this plan - not for the USP"S", of course, but for ordinary postal patrons. The Universal Postal Union requires that all stamps for use in the international mails must be denominated in Arabic numerals. So a stamp which is merely labeled "First Class Mail", without any numerals, can be used only on domestic mail.

Flitting around the edges of our national dialog are a number of claims that the terrorist attacks of 11 September 2001 were arranged from within the U. S. government, in an effort to get public opinion mad at some Muslim nation, or at Muslims generally, and thus making it easier to generate a consensus for war, religious persecution, the suppression of domestic dissent, or all three. I can without hesitation denounce such suggestions as the work of a pathological handful of conspiracy geeks. This certainty comes from the fact that for about seventy years this same sort of conspiracy geeks were trying to get us excited about a Sinister Monolithic International Communistic Conspiracy (SMICC). These efforts were suspended only during World War II, when the U. S. government made the surprisingly sensible decision that anti-Communism was a worse menace than Communism.

The SMICC was described to us in horrendous tones. It was supposed to include apparently harmless people in our neighborhoods who were secretly pledged to, and working for, the horrendous beliefs that peace is preferable to war, that white and black kids should attend the same schools, and that workers had the right to form unions and bargain for better wages and working conditions. In addition, the SMICC threatened foreign conquest by vast Communistic armies with nuclear weapons, against which an enormously expensive system of world-wide military alliances had to be formed. Numerous documents were forged in order to get us all scared about the plans and objectives of this conspiracy: the Sisson Documents, the Zinoviev Letter, the Penkovskiy Papers, the Sudoplatov "Revelations", and I don't know how many others.

By 1990 this proposition was no longer defensible. What then collapsed was not a Russian menace, but an American delusion. After ridding ourselves of one such implausible conspiracy, we are not about to take on another. The attacks of 11 September 2001 were not the product of a conspiracy of American militarists, or of a vast world-wide Muslim conspiracy to conquer the world, or of an attack by Iraq, Afghanistan, or any other nation with a Muslim majority. They were brought about by a tiny handful of religious fanatics, headed by a rich Sa'udi Arab who has been repudiated by both his family and his nation, and who remains free only because he is worth more to the U. S. government as a bogeyman than as a prisoner. (Or do you imagine that nobody can locate a six-foot-six Arab attached to a dialysis machine, in a country whose language he cannot speak?)

The alleged Muslim conspiracy is obviously a last resort for people who still miss the SMICC. This is why the Rev. Cal Thomas, who was vice president of the Moral Majority when there was one, said that "The Right has been looking for an enemy to replace Communism since 1990. And maybe Islam is it."

So why do people want to believe in these conspiracies? The existence of a world-wide conspiracy of lurking, secret enemies, all plotting to destroy everything you hold dear, obviously flatters your own view of your importance. And if you don't believe in such a conspiracy, you have to take the responsibility for your own mistakes and failings. And who wants to do that?

While everyone else is dumping on Representative Patrick Kennedy (D-RI), who crashed his car while trying to drive to an urgent congressional vote that he apparently believed was scheduled for 3 AM, I am willing to cut him a little slack. He only tanked up on some mood-altering substance, variously reported to be alcohol or ambien or both. He did not, like Uncle Jack, get this country into a war that had no relationship to our national interests. He did not say anything as stupid as Uncle Bobby, who went to Saigon in 1962 and proclaimed that "We will stay here until we win!" As Kennedys go, he is practically harmless.

I will not be going this year to the Origins 2006 gaming convention in Columbus. I have discovered, two months before it begins, that no space is available in any of five hotels to which I made inquiries. It is apparent that Origins has outgrown the available space in Columbus, and should be moved to some city with more available hotel space.

However, if any Graustark reader did manage to get to Origins 2006, I would appreciate it if he or she could write an account of that convention for publication in Graustark.

The last issue of Graustark which I sent to Brad Martin at the address listed on p. 11 has just come back in the mail. Does any reader have a more accurate address for him?

Recently a car crashed into the house of a Brooklyn mailman, setting it on fire. The fire department found numerous bags of mail in the house, and upon inquiry it developed that the mailman had been stashing away large amounts of mail there, rather than delivering it. He claimed that his job was too difficult to get all the mail delivered, and proceedings are now under weigh to give him a different job, probably manufacturing license plates.

This mailman lived in ZIP code 11210 rather than 11226, but I rather doubt that he is the only employee of the USP"S" who sees his job this way. And some **Graustark** readers have noted that their moves sometimes seem to get here late or not at all. If you have this problem, phoning your moves in may be a way of dealing with the matter.

Some readers may have seen a forged issue of Graustark, numbered "#773a" and, like the genuine Graustark #774, dated April 1, 2006. It should not have been difficult to identify it as a forgery, possibly a renewal of the spate of forgeries from Gary Coughlan and others, that troubled the hobby in the 1980s. For one thing, the forger used type faces which I have never used in Graustark. For another, while I am not the world's best typist, I am not responsible for the numerous misspellings, bad grammar, rambling incoherent prose, and worse syntax which characterize the forgery. If its creator had a point in this act, which I doubt, it would be the expression of a belief that war is good and peace is evil.

This forgery is clearly the work of a mind which needs help, and I strongly recommend that he see about getting it. I know who the forger is, but will not go public with his name unless he does. That would be akin to poking fun at the mentally ill, something to which I am opposed.

Nebuchadnezzar of biblical fame". It. Gen. Boykin of the Pentagon has called Muslims "idolaters", and believes that the U. S. Army is the "Christian army" of a "Christian nation", waging a "holy war" in the Muddle East. When he ordered the Fallujah Massacre of November 2004, Lt. Col. Gary Brandt told his troops that "The enemy has got a face. He's called Satan. He's in Fallujah. And we're going to destroy him."

It is clearly believed, in the U.S. armed forces and in the government that sends them to war, that the present campaign in the Muddle East is a campaign of Christianity asserting its supremacy over any other religion. If you wonder whether such a policy will be tried in America as well, you will find more details in Michelle Goldberg's new book Kingdom Coming: The Rise of Christian Nationalism (2006, Norton). She concentrates on what its advocates call "dominion theology", whose adherents "think they have the right to rule nonbelievers". They believe that this "right" is authorized by Genesis 1:26, which in the King James translation asserts "let them have dominion". These ideas seem to have been first asserted by the late Rousas John Rushdoony in his 1973 book Institutes of Biblical Law, a title which is clearly designed after John Calvin's influential Institutes of the Christian Religion. Rushdoony's views are sometimes also called "Reconstructionism"; what is going to be "reconstructed" is American civil society, which presently guarantees a secular state and freedom of religion. This the Reconstructionists hope to replace. Rushdoony's son-in-law Gary North explicitly states that one of their first actions in power would be "to remove access to the franchise and to civil offices from those who refuse to become communicant members of Trinitarian churches". Goldberg observes that "This doesn't mean that nonbelievers will be forced to convert. They'll just have to learn their place."

Collectible card games have also been condemned, often by the same people who believe that RPGs are in some way "evil". Amy Dickinson's advice column, in Newsday of 2 May 2006, dealt with a letter from "Furious Stepmother" about her stepson, who came home from school with "a stack of Yu-Gi-Oh! cards which he traded for a \$50 PlayStation we bought for him." She went on to say that Yu-Gi-Oh! cards are "not allowed" in his school. Neither her complaint nor Dickinson's reply addressed the question of why these cards are forbidden by the school.

Another connection between RPGs and the Real World has just emerged with a new development from Entropia Universe, an online science-fiction game with about a quarter million players. (Seth Schiesel, New York Times) The game's internal currency is Project Entropia Dollars (PEDs, at 10 to a U. S. dollar), but Entropia Universe is introducing an ATM card that will enable players to withdraw PEDs as the equivalent in real-world money. Entropia Universe is published by MindArk of Göthenberg, Sweden.

Dan Brown's novel *The Da Vinci Code* has already excited opposition from Christians, particularly from Roman Catholics, and this can only intensify later this month when a film based on it is released. It is apparently feared that the Roman Catholic Church, which has survived persecution by Roman emperors, the Great Schism with the eastern churches, the later Western Schism when rival popes in Rome and Avignon excommunicated one another, the Protestant Reformation, religious freedom and other things condemned by Pope Pius IX in the *Syllabus of Errors*, the expropriation of the Papal States, and the artworks displayed in the Brooklyn Museum, will come crumbling down if people are exposed to Brown's preposterous assertions about a married Jesus who left descendants.

However, Christians are not in agreement about how to handle this alleged menace. Some demand boycotts of theaters showing this film, which will premiere at the Cannes Film Festival on 17 May. But others want people to see the film, under circumstances which will allow Christians to see it as a "teaching moment" or even "an opportunity for evangelism". Still others want people to specifically go to some other movie so that it will outdraw The Da Vinci Code. One film suggested is based on the comic strip Over the Hedge. (Its previews indicate that it contains "fart jokes".) "Legal actions" against the film, or even against the book, have been suggested, although no Christians are getting specific about just how this is to be done. Some Christians are trying to meet this alleged threat by countering it with home discussion groups, websites, pamphlets, or documentaries. They obviously know that demands for a boycott or suppression, whether or not they are successful, will only drive more people to read the book and see the movie. And Sony, the film's producer, has resolutely refused to add a "disclaimer" to the film.
