



players, the current position, and a list of who owns which supply centers. If subscription money can be passed along to me, fine. Otherwise I will ask players to join a new game in Graustark, or to subscribe to Graustark if they do not already do so. Players who resign or drop out can be replaced by Graustark stand-by players.

It is best if this is done quickly, should it be necessary. If a game is abandoned for too long, some players may lose interest, and may not continue to play

when it resumes under another gamesmaster.

Stand-by players are always needed for postal Diplomacy games in Graustark. If you volunteer as a stand-by, you may be called upon whenever a current player misses a move. If you send in moves for that country for the next turn, and the present player does not, you will take over play of that position. No game fee will be asked, though you should keep your subscription current, or enroll in a new Graustark game. No standby will be called upon in a game in which he or she has already played.

Today's Terrorism Alert Color Code is Snow; White, the color of the ground when the first presidential caucuses and primary elections are held in states with traditionally cold January weather that will keep down the vote count, and small populations not representative of the country at large.

Graustark is the Very First bulletin for the postal play of Diplomacy. published every fourth Saturday by John Boardman, 234 East 19th Street, Brooklyn, NY 11226-5302. Diplomacy is a board game of negotiation and conflict for the period of World War I. It was designed by Allan B. Calhamer and is now published by Hasbro. Another new postal Diplomacy game is now being organized in Graustark, at a game fee of \$35. (For Canadian and Mexican addresses the game fee is \$50, and for other foreign addresses it is \$100, or 75 euros in cash.) This game fee includes a subscription to Graustark for as long as the game lasts, whether or not you are eliminated. With your game fee send in a list of the countries you'd like to play, in your order of preference, and I'll try to put you as close to the top of that list as I can. If you do not already have the postal rules for Diplomacy, which were last published in Graustark #749, let me know when you send in your game fee, and I'll send you a copy.

N Nerves Graustark subscriptions for non-players are 10 issues for \$15 for U. S. addresses, and \$40 or 30 euros for others. Back issues as available # 2142 are 10 issues for \$5 for U. S. addresses. To foreign addresses, back issues have the same price as for foreign subscriptions. Players who phone in their moves should call me at 718-693-1579. An answering machine is attached to this phone.

I want to again remind players that the U. S. "Service" is not capable of reliably getting mail here in less than a week. Please take this into account in sending in your moves. If, a few times, your moves have arrived here by mail in less than a week, do not assume that this will always be the case.

Graustark readers who are interested in postal games which don't run here, are invited to write to the publishers of 'zines with which I trade, and ask what game openings they have. For their addresses, see all the readers indicated by "(T)" for "trade" in the Graustark Directory on p. 6 of this issue. Several of these publishers run a wide variety of postal games.

Prior to the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, whose 66th anniversary was recently observed, American public opinion was decidedly divided about World War II, with a majority preferring to remain neutral. However, almost all comic art took it for granted that the Allies were right and the Axis was wrong. The villains were thinly disguised versions of the Axis powers, particularly Germany.

One of the new comic strips which thus reacted to World War II was Frank Tinsley's Yankee Doodle, which began in October 1940. On 7 June 1942 this strip was taken over by the McNaught Syndicate, which changed its name to Captain Yank, and made its hero a Marine aviator. As such, flying at night, he found himself short on fuel, and saw an aircraft carrier as his only possible landing site, despite the fact that he could not

- PATRIOTISM is referring to sleep deprivation as torture if Vietnamese did it to Americans in Hanoi, but not if Americans are doing it to Muslims at Guantánamo. (Richard Cohen, Newsday, 6 November 2007)
- PATRIOTISM is American snipers in Iraq who "placed fake weapons at 'bait' to attract and kill enemy fighters. (New York Times, 6 November 2007)
- PATRIOTISM is the orders given to his men in Iraq by Captain Matthew Didier "that their rules of engagement had changed to allow them to kill even unarmed men fleeing a battle in a rural area with American or Iraqi Army forces." (Ibid.)
- PATRIOTISM is three killings of prisoners or fleeing men, ordered by Staff Sgt. Michael A. Hensley of the 25th Infantry Division under these orders, "occurring with the knowledge and encouragement of his superiors". (*Ibid.*)
- PATRIOTISM is the discovery of the cable channel MSNBC, that "shows that criticize the administration with the same vigor which Fox News's hosts often champion it" are "ratings gold", and that "MSNBC is managing to add viewers at a moment when its hosts echo the country's dissatisfaction with President Bush." (New York Times, 6 November 2007)
- PATRIOTISM is the U. S. government's acceptance of reports by an Iraqi named Rafid Ahmed Alwan ("Curveball") that Saddam Hussein's government had built mobile biological weapons labs. - PATRIOTISM is President Bush's repeated insistence, as recently as 2006 and perhaps even later, that Saddam Hussein had weapons of mass destruction, even "after endless searches had found no sign" of them. (Anthony Lewis, review of Robert Draper's Dead Certain: The Presidency of George W. Bush, New York Times Book Review, 4 November 2007)
- PATRIOTISM is President Bush's attitude that he "knows he is right. When facts turn out to get in the way, he brushes them off." (Ibid.)
- PATRIOTISM is a 2005 "opinion" which "gave the Justice Department's most authoritative legal approval to the harshest agency techniques, including head slapping, exposure to cold and simulated drowning, even when used in combination." (New York Times, 5 October 2007)
- PATRIOTISM is the congressional grant of "amnesty to officials who may have violated the torture and war crimes provisions of our laws; allowing a defense for future abusers if they relied on legal advice; authorizing the president to redefine cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment; and permitting the use of evidence derived from the use of torture or coercion." (Michael Ratner, Center for Constitutional Rights, quoted by Nat Hentoff, Village Voice, 24 October 2007)
- PATRIOTISM is the statement of William Kristol, editor of the Weekly Standard, that "Whenever I hear anything described as a heartless assault on our children, I tend to think it's a good idea. I'm happy that the president's willing to do something bad for the kids." (New York Times, 5 October 2007)

recognize its signals. He assumed it was British, and came in for a landing. But when he landed, he found that he was on a German carrier.

While his mistake made for exciting adventure, there were in fact no German aircraft carriers in World War II. One had been planned, and it was to be called the Graf Zeppelin after the designer of the famous German dirigible airships. However, its keel was laid in 1939, and it was still unfinished when the war ended. In this state it was captured by the Russians.

However, a German aircraft carrier Graf Zeppelin may be found in a board war game, Avalon-Hill's War at Sea (1975). This World War II game is set in European waters, and is a relatively simple game, designed for beginners. Its rules do not mention that the Graf Zeppelin did not actually fight in World War II.

When World War II ended, Captain Yank, was retired. I do not know whether Frank Tinsley, its creator, was related to the annoyingly didactic comic artist Bruce Tinsley, creator of the comic strip Mallard Fillmore. In his pro-Bush strip, Bruce Tinsley mentions that his father served in World War II, as if it were relevant to Bush War II, but has said nothing about him or any other relative being a comic artist.

In a recent issue I suggested that readers should look up the details of the new postal rates in the 2008 World Almanac. Unfortunately, upon buying that almanac I discovered that the details aren't there. The higher rates for "large envelopes" aren't even mentioned, and of course "large envelope" is not defined. Nor does the almanac state that the rates it gives (41c for the first ounce and 17c for each additional ounce) are valid only if the envelope weighs less than $3\frac{1}{2}$ ounces.

So apparently you are just going to have to pester a postal clerk to get rates for

anything other than a small one-ounce envelope.

The 2008 presidential campaign seems concentrated on two issues — the Christian orthodoxy of the candidates, and who can attack immigrants most viciously.
