Inderlined moves are not possible. The French fleet in Picardy was not ordered, and hence holds its positions. The German army in Warsaw must retreat to Prussia, Livonia, Ukraina, or Galicia; the Russian army in Berlin must retreat to Prussia. These retreat orders are to be submitted with the "Winter 1904" builds and removals, which may be made conditional upon them. If thath dislodged armies are ordered to retreat to the same province; then neither can retreat and both are annihilated, pursuant to the rules of Diplomacy. The High ...
