YOUNGSTOWN POWERS GAIN AT SEA, LOSE ON LAND

Underlined moves are not possible. The French fleet in Picardy was not ordered, and hence holds its position. The German army in Warsaw must retreat to Prussia, Livonia, Ukraina, or Galicia; the Russian army in Berlin must retreat to Prussia. These retreat orders are to be submitted with the "Winter 1904" builds and removals, which may be made conditional upon them. If both dislodged armies are ordered to retreat to the same province, then neither can retreat and both are annihilated, pursuant to the rules of Diplomacy. The High Combatant Powers now control the following supply centers:

ENGLAND: Belgium, Edinburgh, Holland, Liverpool, London, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Sweden. (9)

England may build 2 new units, and Austria-Hungary and Russia may each build one. France must remove 1 unit, and Italy must remove 2. In the event that the dislodged units are annihilated, Germany and Russia may each build an additional unit. Provision for this should be taken in sending in "Winter 1904" moves. The deadline for these moves is SATURDAY 5 FEBRUARY 1966.

MOSCOW: The Second Anti-War Cantata Contest, planned for Dec. 25, 1904, will be held "somewhere in Western Europe". Rumors that it will be held in Trypheme are quite unfounded. According to General Ivan Ivanovitch: "Where the hell is the place? We may have to tear apart all of Italy and Germany to get a clue - and that confounded Giglio keeps popping in and out - maybe Austria-Hungary is Trypheme!"

TRYPHEME: The invading army in Trypheme has requested to remain on permanent occupation duty in that delightful country. Baron Munchhausen, Army Commander, announced that all excess materiel "guns, uniforms, field artillery, and such impedimenta" will be sent back to

FRESH ARMIES RAISED IN MIDDLE EUROPE

After the "1902" moves, Germany establishes an army in Munich, Austria-Hungary establishes an army in Trieste, and Russia establishes an army in Warsaw. The deadline for "Spring 1903" moves is SATURDAY 5 FEBRUARY 1966.

Charles Reinsel, playing Russia, has pointed out that the changes of players following Lake's dropping and Nelson's resignation should not move John Koning around from England to Austria-Hungary. Hence, the present players in 1965Q are:
