## LOOSE SCHEDULES AND LUSITANIA

The last mailing of GRAUSTARK carried with it a tentative issue of Lusitania #9, with the observations that no issues of that Diplomacy bulletin had been seen here for the past 3 months. My efforts to contact Gamesmaster Bernie Kling and get some idea of whether his game 19650 was still operating proved unavailing, as they had last year when Dave McDaniel suspended Ruritania and game 1963B without warning. Under the circumstances, I naturally assumed that the same situation existed with Lusitania as with Ruritania, and that someone else would have to salvage This is

SIGLConsequently, I was greatly surprised to hear from Kling, and from three of the five 19650 players, 0 that Lusitania was still in operation. The real Ρ Lusitania #9 had, in fact, come out in mid-February. E R This A Appears Kling, apparently, was distributing the 'zine only among his players until sufficient copies had accumulated to send bundles around to others. At the leisurely pace at which 19650 proceeds, this would nature. I. O' ally take some time.

Kling, naturally, was quite indignant, as was one N Nerves of the three players. (Of the other two, one praised the leisurely progress of 19650, and the other was harshly critical of Kling's Gamesmastership and hoped for a change.) My error, I see, was in assuming that Kling's lapse was of the same sort as McDaniel's. I should have instead privately written to the 19650 players to determine whether the game was in fact still in progress. I offer him and the players my apologies

for precipitate action.

However, I feel that no apologies are necessary for concern. with the possibility that a Gamesmaster may delay or cease publication and leave his players high and dry. Anyone who undertakes the responsibilities of refereeing a game of postal Diplomacy should. keep his publications coming along regularly.

Therefore, if unforeseen circumstances keep a Gamesmaster from continuing, I will be able to undertake refereeing any postal Diplomacy game in which I am not a player. And if any postal Diplomacy bulletin suffers a three-month lapse in publication, I shall write the players affected to see whether they wish the game resumed under my direction. Three months is certainly too long a delay to be attributed to a casual lapse.
