In response to numerous requests the publisher of GRAUSTARK is opening a new postal Diplomacy game. The entry fee will be \$3.00, and the first seven people to send in their fees will be enrolled. If an eighth entry is received, that person will be an alternate unless he specifically states otherwise.

All players, and the alternate if one enters, will receive GRAU-STARK by air mail if any saving of time is thereby accomplished. The alternate will be asked to submit moves if any player fails to do so. If any player misses two consecutive moves, the alternate will take over his country.

The entry fee has been raised to \$3.00 as a result of the Gamesmaster's experience that a postal Diplomacy game is likely to last into "1911" or "1912" at least. The cost of stencils has also risen lately.

The players in this game will have countries assigned to them by lot. These assignments will be published in GRAUSTARK as soon as seven paid entries are received, and play will then begin.
