FRENCH REGROUP IN ITALY; TURKS TAKE ATHENS FOR THIRD TIME

The "Spring 1907" moves were sent out to the four surviving players on 20 April. In that letter the French moves "A Par-Gas; A Mar-Pie" were underlined, as was correct. The underlines were emitted in GRAUSTARK #89. This in turn makes the "Fall 1907" German move "A Bur-Mar" and the French "A Pie-Ven", both indicated as possible in the "Fall 1907" circular letter of 4 May, impossible.

The Russian army in Moscow, dislodged by an Austro-Hungarian attack in "Spring 1905", was ordered to retreat to St. Petersburg. Other players were invited to make their "Fall 1905" moves contingent upon this retreat, but none did so. This retreat, the Russian moves below, and subsequent Russian moves are made by Anders Swenson, 145 Ponderosa Lone, Walnut Creek, Calif. 94598. Swenson takes over from Charles Reinsel, who resigned as an expression of his preference for real wars over war games.

The Italian situation leaves your Genesmaster utterly confused. About three weeks ago, a paid-up entry for this gene came in from William Sullivan, at the address given in GRAUSTARK #89. In due course of time he was assigned Italy, and on 30 April he was sent the gene assignments.

Then the fun started. About the middle of last week, one of the other players informed mo that an offer of alliance he had sent to Sullivan had been returned, stamped "No such person at this address". "This address" proved to be a dorm at M. I. T. Inquiries among other players and Gemesmasters proved William Sullivan to be unknown to them, and no one had any idea how he happened to hear of postal Diplomacy or of GRAUSTARK.

At almost the last minute, when it appeared that Sullivan was not going to put in an appearance, Bob Lake was taked to substitute for him. (Lake was approached because his was the first entry fee to come in after 1966R was closed.) However, his reply has not yet arrived and, rather than either delay the game or ask Lake to take over Italy with a one-move handicap, the Gamesmaster will let the game go ahead. This will provide an unexpected opportunity to test Allan Calhamer's suggestion in GRAUSTARK #76, that Italy rather than Turkey should be removed in a six-man game.

In the meantime, if William Sullivan wishes to announce himself and take over Italy, he is welcome to do so. Otherwise, the first person to send in \$3.00 and a set of "Fall 1901" moves for Italy will be given that country. (Later entries will be returned.)

The deadline for "Fall 1901" moves is SATURDAY 28 MAY 1966.

Weeks of Swedish vessels in the Kattegat. Today they have been confirmed. The high command today announced that the Swedish ships Thor and Freya, both light cruisers, were sunk by the batteries of Semsö, after the Freya was discovered landing supplies and reinforcements for the Unionist guerillas. The fleet and army were put on war alert. All reservists were ordered to report to their local armory. All leaves have been cancelled.

KOBENHAYN (January 16, 1901): The King was forced to flee to the mainland, probably Kiel or Southern Jutland, due to the capture of most of Zealand by the Swedish invaders. Their army is pouring across the Oresund, and barring a miracle, this will be the last dispatch. All telegraph and telephone lines to the south are being cut, and aliens interned.

ST. PETERSEURG: In the fall of 1901, the Russian foreign minister attempted communication with the Austrian foreign minister. The It ian foreign minister refused to allow them privacy.

In desperation the Russian passed the Austrian a note. This was snatched by the Italian. At this point, a forceful endeavor was made to retrieve the still unread note.

The Italian countered by retreating half of his body out of a window and reading the note. The only way to stop him would have been to toss him out of the window. Partly because this incident occurred in the office of the Russian minister, also a graduate assistant at Brocklyn College, no such action could be taken. Thus Italy and Turkey found out about the secret Austro-Russian alliance before the fall 1901 campaign. Followers of the game will recall that poetic justice provailed. Austria immediately occupied Venice.

The moral question raised by this is, is vio mee allowable in Diplomacy?
MUNICH: Kaiser Max III was asked today about the Diplomatic dispute between
the Austro-Russian and Italo-Turk sh alliances. "Pful!" he replied succinctly,
laying down his pinochle hand and leaning back in his chair. "Dore iss nottings
wrong mit spying. Alvays iss it going on - except in der 25th Reich, vitch vages
var mit ciffilized manners."

As the Kaiser explained his theories, he slowly extracted a card from the Prime Minister's hand and melded a trump sequence. Unfortunately, the Prime Minister noticed this, and sprung at the Kaiser, letting fall a second pinochle hand hidden in his beard. As the reporter left, the third player, a visiting African king, was vainly trying to separate them.

MUNICH: Kaiser Max III, the Prime Minister, and the visiting King of the Squiji Islands today sat around a green baize table as the first bottle of captured Scotch from London was ceremonially borne in. A chamberlain opened it and poured the first glass for the Kaiser. He raised it to his lips, sipped - then sputtered and flung the glass to the floor.

"Call in Princes Johann and Friedrich!" he shouted as soon as he had recovered.

The Kaiser's suspicions were well founded. It later was revealed that his stepsons had intercepted the bettle, emptied it, and refilled it with a mixture of which werewood and ipecae were the least offensive ingradients. Although his royal guest recommended beiling in oil for the culprits, Kaiser Max contented himself with whaling the tar out of them with a barrol stave.

The Genesmaster reserves the right to publish the "Winter 1905" moves earlier than that date, if all moves come in earlier. The deadline for "Spring 1936" moves will be set when players are informed of the winter builds and removals.

Veteran postal Diplomacy players will note that this is the first game on record in which all seven countries have lasted five game years. Not only this, but all seven are significantly active in the game, none having less than 3 supply centers.

The French fleet in Brest is annihilated. The Russian army in Greece retreats to Albania, and the Gomman army in Rome retreats to Tuscany. Germany may build 3 new units, and Russia may build 2. Turkey must remove 2 units, and France must remove 1. Owing to the incorrect moves reported in GRAUSTARK #89, and to the replacement of Charles Reinsel by Anders Swenson as the player for Turkey, the deadline for these "Winter 1907" moves is postponed to SATURDAY 28 MAY 1966. However, if all four players either send in these moves earlier, or indicate that the "Winter 1907" moves they have already submitted are still valid, these moves will be published earlier and a deadline for "Spring 1908" moves will be set.



He declared a block—ade of Sweden "and her ally, Norway" by the forces of the Empire, and invited the other nations of Europe to join in.
