Smythe retains control of Germany. The deadline for "Spring 1907" moves is noon, SATURDAY 16 JULY 1966.

CHARLES WELLS, Fifty Lakes, Minn. (for the next couple of weeks): People should not be searching for the One Perfect Rating System since one rating system cannot take into account all the factors. There is really no way of deciding with finality who is the best player, the second best, and so on.

Your system of center-years I believe will be one of the most important - without any artificial bonuses for winners - since it is "natural", just as in baseball
such statistics as most home runs in a season are natural. Other natural statistics
are the number of games wen and number of games in which the player lasted to the
ond. Also, running statistics where the numbers obtained are divided by the number
of games played or the number of game years played will be used.

Now I can prodict with confidence that these natural statistics will be used, but it's much harder to say whether artificial systems like Reinsel's will last. Reinsel's system is not illogical, but it does make an a priori judgment about what

number of points.

Your comment that persons who take over countries in midstream cause difficulties is valid. Scheday, when the International Diplomacy Federation starts conducting tournament games maybe we can base statistics on those games only, instead of the present day mishmosh of games conducted under all sorts of various rules. Presumably people will be much less likely to drop out of tournament games. Particularly if the tournament has rules that people who drop out for insufficient cause (like contracting cancer) will be barred from to mament games for a year.

In fact, we can never have a system that gives us a World Champion Diplomacy player until we do have tournaments conducted under a rict rules and uniform procedures. Until then we will be in the same sort of mess as the boxing world.

For example, if the official Tournament scoring is your conter-year system plus some bonus for winners, and if in all the previous Tournaments Italy won one third as many games as France, then the bonus for winning with Italy would be three times as big as the bonus for winning with France, And if the cumulative number of center-years for all Italys is, say three-quarters that of France, then each center-year the Italian player gets will count four thirds as much as the ones the Italian player gets.

Senothing like this will, I think, be necessary, since it will be impossible for a Tournament to be organized so that each player plays each country an equal number of times - that would require too many games.

One last cornent: You criticize other people's proposals by applying their proposal to the games so far played and then pointing out that the results simply do not correspond to reality. (I. c., good players rank low and vice versa.) This is not valid. You cannot test ANY system with as few games as we have played so far. When 50 games have been completed in which no more than 500 players have participated, then you can begin to have some idea of how good the system is.

LONDON: We'll have it known that the King's beard is immaculate and will

tolorate nothing to the contrary.

LONDON: The ice-free channel through to Murmansk and Archangel was not as large as it was reported to be. In fact, the channel is so narrow that it only allows room for passage of one Superdreadnought. (But then our dreadnoughts are the largest in the world.) Should any vessels be met coming from the opposite direction, they will either have to back water until they are clear of the channel, or esle face the might of English 14 inch naval guns. Additional forward turnets have been added on the docks of the lead ships in case any such meetings should take place.

SILVER SPRING, MD.: Help: I'm a prisoner in Postal Diplomacy!

BERLIN: The recent statement of the British Prime Minister concerning German aid to the Danes in their defense against English agression were greeted with interest by Kaiser Frederik IV and Chancellor Buley, as well as the Reichstag. "I hardly see how he can criticize our aid of the Danes," said the Chancellor, "when the British Empire has been aftempting to subjugate the people of the Orange Free State and Transvall. All they have gained is another enemy, and the condemnation of all the free people of the world."

DURBAN, CAPE COLONY: The last of defending British forces surrendered today to the forces of Piet Cronje, General of the Army of the Orange Free State. These were the last organized British troops left in the whole of South Africa. President Kruger has lifted the declaration of martial law which has been in effect since November, 1900. He also said that, although the Boers and their allies seek only a route to the sea, and freedom from the harassment of the British, due to the situation in Europe, he has no choice but to occupy the Cape Colony on behalf of their German allies.

LONDON (February 3, 1902): The British Cabinet is privately happy over the resolution of the Boer War "in spite of the loss of face involved", as the Minister of War put it. The runor is a reulating that the reason no new forces were available for the Spring campaign was the South African situation. The British Ambassador is runored to be negotiating a prisoner-of-war deal with the Roleh preparatory to a break with France.

LEMBERG, GALICIA (March 20, 1902, IRNS): Grand Duke Fyodor ordered the II Army into Budapost, Col. Vasili Nikitin, Governor-General of Dacia, announced today, in order to break the back of Austrian expansionism in the Balkans.

CHENSTOKHOV, POLAND (March 20, 1902, PNA): Gon. Count Wsicviod Jakimiuk, Conmander of the III (Polish) Army, agreed to the Kaiser's request for aid in repelling the French invaders, and is expected to have a sizable force outside Munich by April.

STOCKHOIM, SWEDEN (March 21, 1902, IRNS): Adm. Risto Svinhufvud, aboard his flagship Bothmia, left here with the I (Baltic) Fleet to engage the English forces in Norway. The Admiral wishes it made known that the government and the navy recognize English sovereignty over Norway but the naval build-up in the North Sea area constitutes a danger to Russian territory. Upon reduction of English forces in the area to those suitable fot a normal defense of the area the fleet will leave.
