Shalom Everyone,

This issue turned out to be far larger than expected, a few things had to be left out to keep the page count down to 28, to avoid paying the extra postage. Among the things cut from this issue is quiz #5. Don't despair, it will be in the next issue and Brent McKee is thinking of not participating to allow someone else a chance at winning free issues.

In Israel, on the south slope of Mount Zion, archeologists believe they have found the gate through which Jesus left Jerusalem after the Last Supper. Volunteer researchers and students found what they believe to be remnants of the gate while excavating a site along the walls of Jerusalem's Old City. Ancient coins and pottery scattered near the gate prove the ruins date to the time of Christ.

All along the outside of the Old City, the National Park Service has turned archeology sites (once excavations are finished) into parks to allow access to the ancient city.

The Israeli elections have come and gone and as expected the deadlock between the two major parties remained. With the Israeli public virtually divided into equal two camps, one favouring a harder line against the Palestinians (the right wingers) and the other favouring negotiations (the left wingers), any other result would have been a major surprise.

If there were any surprises in the election, it was that both major parties (Labour & Likud) lost support while their respected allies made gains, the right wing religious parties gaining the most. As has been the case in every election since the creation of the state, the smaller parties hold the balance of power and therefore a disproportionate amount of influence in relation to their size.

A fire bomb, two days before the elections, which killed four Israelis, was probably enough to tip the scales in favour of Shamir's Likud Party edging out Peres and the Labour Party, for the right to try and form the next government. If Shamir succeeds in forming a government with the other right wing parties then the hardlines will get their way in bringing in new and tougher policies against the Palestinians. Hopefully he will fail and the two major parties will once again through necessity form another national unity government, which would mean we can expect no major changes (which is better than a shift to the right).

The Canadian elections are only a few weeks away and yours truly is still undecided on how I am going to vote. All I know is that it will be anyone but the Conservatives. Right now, I don't care who gets in as long as the Conservatives do not win a MAJORITY. Actually to be honest I don't want to see any party be in the position of forming a majority government. I don't trust any of the parties to govern alone. I really think the best thing for Canada, right now, is a minority government to prevent the repeat of the abuses of the last couple of governments.

Not being Canadian, I really have no direct business getting involved with the CDO discussions and related topics. Still, I'm going to put my foot in it for a moment. It seems to me that Canadian players are entitled to do whatever they wish about hobby organization and similar items, and if they wish to limit their participants to Canadians only, that's fine. If you want to rehouse your own orphans, well and good; if Rod thinks he has some authority to override any actions you may take on your own, that is garbage, but I suspect he intended to convey merely that his activities are not necessarily restricted to south of the border. The impression I get is that you are talking about nationalized services because the response from the States is so consistently poor. If so, then perhaps it is the level of services in general that ought to be addressed, rather than any national implications. One example: I find the MNC services to be superb these days, and I note that "The Home Office" scored beautifully among Canadian voters in the RP. So whyever would you want to override this? On the other hand, DW's lack of Canadian coverage is bemoaned; I agree, it's terrible. So who wants to be DW's Canadian correspondent, and guarantee a worthwhile column delivered to Larry in time for each issue - he in turn to guarantee that he'd cut something else if he had to in order to print it.

((As a member of the CDO, you have every right in getting involved in CDO discussions. The current outlash against the American services is not because of poor service but of insensitivity towards Canadians. For example, I firmly believe that even though DipCon is the North American Championship, it will never be allowed to come north across the border.))

You've asked me to clarify my feelings on negotiations with terrorists and in particular on giving in to their demands. It depends upon the demands, the terrorists, the situation...in short, there is no pat answer. Quite obviously some demands cannot possibly be allowed; imagine if you will a demand to drop a nuclear bomb on New York. On the other hand, one common demand that is routinely agreed to already is that to provide safe passage after the hostages are released. Most demands fall somewhere in between, and it is entirely possible that giving in to some of them sometimes will be thought the best course. What's wrong with that? Obviously negotiators will take into account such things as whether acquiescence will encourage similar acts, as they do now. But the real point, I think, is that in true political terrorist actions it is not the success or failure of the mission that makes any difference, it is the statement made by the attempt.

((I've conceded that negotiations is an option that shouldn't be discarded lightly but I still firmly believe that if you do give in you are only encouraging further acts of terrorism.))

Very quickly on the issue of using Holocaust data for scientific purposes today. It seems patently obvious to me that we use it for all it's worth. If we wish to make a memorial to those who were tortured in the process of data collection, fine. But to waste the data is absurd; what are we supposed to do then, research all over again, torturing different types of animals this time?

((It may be absurd to waste the data but if a relative of yours was one of the ones experimented upon, and use of the data was giving legitimacy to the methods used to obtain it, you ~~wouldn't~~ think it was so absurd!))

I personally think the Olympics are ruined, and that it is just a symptom of the state of the world today. Everyone seems to be getting paid to compete in the Olympics and that so much money is involved that the athletes are willing to take drugs. But you really can't blame them! It's only human nature to do the things they do under the pressure and stress that is put upon them to WIN. So the Olympics are ruined, but everyone is to blame.

((For me the start of the downfall of the Olympics was when politics took over. Even though the money involved in winning a medal has contributed to ruining the Olympics, I am in favour of professional athletes competing in the Games. After all, the Eastern Bloc "amateur" athletes are professional in everything but name so why should our professionals be banned.))

To Tania

Your love for your country comes through your letter and from what I've heard South Africa is extremely beautiful. However, love can be blind. The major problem I see in South Africa is that the majority of the wealth is in the hands of the whites, along with the political power. The blacks, who provide the labor in S. Africa and therefore the wealth & power of the whites, are by and large poor and have little real power in their own country. That is the problem.

Building some schools and houses and educating a few blacks is just not going to solve anything. Not that I'm against schools, housing, education. But its no substitute for the sharing of wealth & power in a country blacks as well as whites have laboured hard to build.

As for the ANC and the Western Powers wanting to divest: After years of having your people used, being poor, and not having the chance for any substantial upward mobility, there is going to be revolution. Check your history. Happens every time. And it becomes violent if no REAL progress is obtained. Now, for the U.S. & the Western Europe. Well I'll stick to the U.S. The U.S. for years hasn't done anything substantial against the South African economy until about four or five years ago. That was due partly because of internal pressure here and partly because of other reasons I'm not entirely sure about. However, since then S. Africa has been largely off the U.S. television news and U.S. national newspapers, Americans have very short memories and by now I believe U.S. pressure on South Africa and on companies doing business with S.A. is low.

Will this type of pressure (disinvestment) succeed in forcing the gov't of South Africa to liberalize faster and end apartheid? My belief is that most people dislike, HATE, to be "forced" to do anything. They will resist if they are able. And for now, the gov't of South Africa is very capable of doing this. All in all, the South Africans, black & white, will have to solve their own problems and come up with a South African solution acceptable to BOTH parties. Disinvestment has become a symbol of not supporting the current apartheid system. And, right or wrong, will probably be the method used by other countries (not critically tied to the South African economy) to voice their disapproval to the current entrenched system: white-controlled power & wealth in South Africa, with the exclusion of virtually all non-whites to political power in their own country.

Whew. Now, I'll just have to duck and take cover!! And I didn't even begin to talk about how screwed up the U.S. is.

((Before power can be passed into the hands of the Blacks, they need to be educated, hence the the money that is now being spent on education.))

((By disinvesting, a company loses any influence it had in trying to improve things. Whites pick up factories/companies at bargain prices and its the Black who suffers the most. But this is what the radicals want since it will bring their goal of revolution that much closer. Sanctions have only made White South Africa stronger. They are closing ranks and the moderates are slowly losing to the right wing parties as more and more Whites realize that while their government is making reforms, the West is ignoring them and increasing the pressure.))

((You are 100% right in stating it is up to all South Africans to come up with a South African solution to a South African problem.))

((Tania, just because I made a few comments, you shouldn't let that stop you from replying.))

I took another look at Tania Smuts' article after your phone call, and decided I should respond briefly.

She says that "most entertainment businesses have opened their doors to all races." Which ones haven't, and why?

She says "there is no discrimination in who gets the job." If this were true, South Africa would be the most forward nation on Earth. There is plenty of discrimination in Canada. I was reading in this morning's Globe and Mail that major corporations in Canada are NOT improving their record in hiring visible minorities -- women, natives or the disabled. For instance, at Air Canada, one in ten males makes over \$70,000 per year, while only one in 1,600 women makes that much. I read some time ago that in a survey of major media corporations in Canada, only 30 out of 1,700 employees were of a racial minority or disabled -- no wonder the news is slanted, when virtually all journalists are white and middle class.

Tania points out that "a lot" of companies are giving bursaries to blacks to further their education. Somehow I doubt that "a lot" would amount to even 1% of companies -- the overwhelming majority of all companies (in Canada, at least) do nothing to train their employees or encourage further education. And where is the government in this? Are you suggesting that a few companies are doing more than the government?

"The blacks that do not want to work or study or try to better themselves are making the biggest noise." Is this a racially motivated comment, marking back to once acceptable theory that blacks are inherently lazy? How come I've never heard anyone say the same thing about Polish Solidarity? Or any other white radical group? The fact is, when discrimination is so rampant that it is impossible to progress within a system unless you deny your own heritage (assimilate), you have anger and frustration -- at being held back. The racial minority making the biggest noise in Canada today are the aboriginal Indians, and so they should -- they have been ignored by successive governments for 111 years, and the impact of

oil megaprojects on the environment of northern Alberta has destroyed their traditional lifestyle. These people are not lazy -- they are facing genocide, and must stand up for themselves as a matter of survival.

I simply don't believe, Tania, that things get better without recognizing problems and pushing hard to change them. What has it been, 20 years since the Women's Liberation movement began? And the vast majority of women, a generation latter, are still kept in low-paying clerical or service jobs. It's only expected that the men who control management are resistant to change, but women will wait forever if change is allowed at the pace men set. The problem is not a lack of education. I read yesterday, in a book written 15 years ago, that 63% of the students at an important journalism school in Toronto (Ryerson) were female, and yet today where is the women editor of a major daily newspaper? Where are the women editors of any newspapers? The problem is not education, it's not that women or any other minority lack the ability -- it's discrimination.

((I believe that far more than 1% of the companies in South Africa help further educate their workers. Companies are making big effort to further educate their employees, especially blacks since they know their future are intermingled. The government is getting help from the work place in helping educate blacks because the government doesn't have enough money. You must remember that blacks don't pay income tax so the gov't loses out on a lot of potential revenue.))

((I think the point Tania meant when she said there is no discrimination is that a qualified black will not lose out to an unqualified white, which use to happen. Did you know that as of 1986, there is no wage gap between the various races in the nursing profession.))

Whoops, I knew that would happen, Ran ... "brief" would turn into a speech -- oh yeah, I forgot to mention: VOTE for ED BROADBENT (it's the only way to stop Alan Stewart from abandoning Praxis to take up a juicy patronage job a week after the election ... what, you didn't know that Mulroney has already lined up hundreds of well-paying patronage positions to award the party faithful after another majority is returned. That's the cycle -- do what ever disgusting immoral thing you want in the first half of your term, it will be forgotten by the time the next election rolls around. The Tories learned their lesson well after watching the Liberals do it for years, and don't doubt that they will be back at the public trough for another gluttonous feed.

Sorry , Ran, there I go causing trouble again -- I suspect you're as devoted a Liberal as Stewart is a Conservative and I am an NDP'er. But don't you think the difference between the parties in terms of spending has really been eliminated? One of the big bogies thrown at the NDP year after year has been that their social programs would bury us in debt. And yet the Liberals and Conservatives have been throwing money and promises around (our taxes) like there is no tomorrow ... they're laying it on so thick that I find it hard to believe that Canadians will not wake up and realize they are being bought (ie. sleazy bribe) with their own money. I'd rather have someone who was going to spend us into everlasting debt with integrity, than someone who wants to do the same thing to hold power.

((My politics is weird and your wrong about me being a starch Liberal. Back in the old days (before Israel), I usually supported the NDP in provincial elections and the Liberals in federal. In Israel, I am a card carrying member of the Labour Party but in the last election (and this one if I was allowed to vote), I supported a small left wing party (Citizens' Rights Movement). I support Maggie Thatcher and if I was an American I would be voting Republican (at least for President). If my MP (Ron Stewart) was running for reelection I would be voting Conservative but since he isn't, I am still undecided between the NDP, Liberal & Christian Heritage Party. Oh yeah, I support free trade.))

Rule clarifications:

The Ring is found simply by moving into the province in which its located. The GM secretly informs only the player or players in the province. Since the Ring's location is randomly determined, yes, a unit could have started with the Ring.

If the ring-bearer shares a province with another unit, the GM will only inform the other player about the Ring if the 2nd unit is Gandalf. However, I am checking with a GM in England to confirm this.

The ring-bearer after moving, can pass the Ring into another province but not over mountains.

The mountains around Mordor do not extend to the edge of the map. Therefore movemet is allowed between South Rhun/Ered Lithur and Nurn/Khand.

If Gandalf destroys the Balinog, everyone is told. Also checking with England to confirm! The number of turns missed by him afterwards is randomly determined by the GM and only the Gandalf player is informed.

When the Nazgul moves with a unit and adds its strength that that unit, it for feels the second part of itsa movement cease.

I am not sure what happens when the Ranger unit takes the Paths of the Dead and emerges in Lamedon as a DR, since the first centre it takes cannot be a Lamedon zone centre. I am trying to get this clarified and will let you know.

WHY ISRAEL SHOULD OFFER TO NEGOTIATE UNCONDITIONALLY WITH THE PLO

In my last article, I made a case for the Palestinian Arabs taking a bold step to advance their own interests. This time, I'll do the same for the Israelis. Israel should say, "Arafat, come to Jerusalem for Peace Talks. No Conditions."

There are generally two arguments raised against this. The first is that Arafat does not recognize Israel, and indeed, wishes Israel did not even exist. All true, of course --- but that hasn't been a barrier in the past.

David Ben-Gurion was a man whose devotion to Israel could not be questioned by anyone. But he publically urged Gamel Nasser, the leader of Egypt, to negotiate with Israel. Nasser was a bitter and determined foe of Israel, and he supported terrorist acts against Israel before there even was a PLO. Or take Menachim Begin, a classic Israeli hardliner. Yet after the Camp Davis accords, he urged Assad of Syria to do what Sadat did. "You're next", he said in effect. Now, Assad is a man who has criticized Arafat for being too soft on Israel. He is a ruthless, brutal man, and even by the standards of the Middle East, he's a real son of a bitch. He has a lot of Israeli blood on his hands, both from the 1973 war and from the campaign in Lebanon. But Begin invited him to come. Even Sadat --- he touched off the 1973 war. He hadn't recognized Israel when the invitations went out. Likewise Hussein of Jordan: This man does not recognize Israel.

Arafat isn't even in the same league as these guys. Compared to them, he is a street thug, a bureaucrat, a figurehead. Those other guys with their air forces and standing armies posed a real threat to Israel. Arafat with his rubber dingies and hang gliders can blow up a bus here or there, but these are just bee stings. Arafat isn't even secure in his own position. In short, Israel has been willing to negotiate with people more hostile than Arafat.

The second argument is that negotiating with Arafat is not in the best interests of Israel. I disagree --- it's the most cunning move Israel can make.

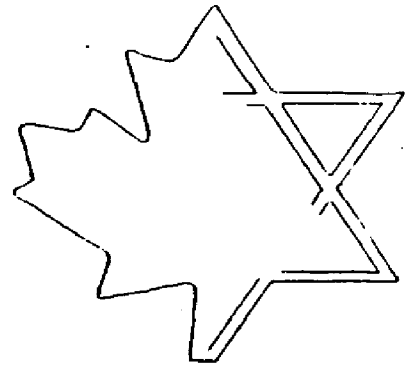
Will Arafat come? Don't be so sure that he will. There will be two powerful groups opposed. The first are the hardliners. They want only the dismantlement of Israel, and they know that no country will negotiate away its existence. Sitting down at the table will give Israel a degree of legitimacy that they absolutely reject --- and for what? To try to get that which they know Israel will never negotiate away. The other group are the bureaucrats. While we (rightfully) associate the PLO with terrorism, much of what they do is essentially governmental, providing funds for community organizations, putting out press releases, etc, paying soldiers who don't fight, etc. These people don't want change. A compromise settlement in Jerusalem, leading to their own country at peace with Israel will put them out of business. For their business now is preparing for armed struggle with Israel. The current status quo is just fine.

A decision by Arafat to go would cause a major split within the PLO --- indeed, just having to make the choice will cause a split. I suspect that most of the Arabs in Gaza and the West Bank would be urging Arafat to go, to reach an accomodation with Isarel. Israel would be split on the issue too, but therein lies the difference. Israelis settle their differences thru strikes and debates and elections. But, at least since the days of the Palmach and Irgun and Haganah, they don't use guns. Not so the Arabs in the Middle East. Their tendency is usually (not always) to settle major matters thru force. We are familiar with this in Lebanon, but lets not also forget Hassad's horrifying supression of the revolt in Hama, Hussein's obliteration of the PLO inside Jordan (those who would not leave were killed), civil wars in North and South Yemen. A decision by Arafat to go to Jerusalem would probably trigger a civil war within the PLO which could easily lead to its destruction. Israel would have much to gain by that! A decision not to go is less likely to trigger a civil war. However, such a choice would go against Arafat's instincts of trying for center stage. It would also greatly dissappoint those in Gaza and the West Bank who realize that a deal in Jerusalem would surely improve their political independence. And it would be a huge propaganda victory for Israel. Look at all the bad press Iran gets from not talking to Iraq.

If Arafat does come, Israel will give him a cruel choice by posing the impossible question: "What do you want?" Arafat's approach has essentially been two faced. To Arabs, he says that he seeks the elimination of Israel. You will return to your farms in the Galillee (or your father's or grandfather's farms), your orchards in Jaffa. Things will be as they once were. But when he faces the rest of the world, he talks of justice and freedom, and a country for the Palestinians to call their own. Israel's refusal to talk to Arafat means that he has not been called to account for this conflict. If he asks for a Palestinian state in place of Israel, then he will demolish the credibility that he has slowly built up over many years, especially in Europe. Futhermore, he then knows that he will have gotten nothing, since Israel will not do that. That is, he will have paid the internal political cost of talking with Israel, with no prospect of any gain from it. If he says he wants a new state alongside of Israel, he will infuriate his backers. His negotiating team will have real fears for their personal safety. With Arafat out of Tunis, there is the good likelihood of a revolt from the hardliners in Fatah, who have taken up guns against Arafat's faction before (in Lebanon). It's a lose-lose choice for Arafat. I'll bet he prays to Allah every day not to be invited to Jerusalem. Such an invitation will likely lead to either the destruction of the PLO, or alienating it from its Gaza/West Bank and European supporters.

These two essays then give dynamic strategies for either side. But who will take the first move? Who will implemet their winning strategy, first? The first side to grab the opportunity, I believe, will prevail.

TRAITORS - #2: MAJOR ESTERHAZY

Major Esterhazy was an artillery officer in the French army, up until the fall of 1894. He was a staff officer, stationed at his regiment's headquarters in Paris.

Esterhazy was an alcoholic and gambler, minus any kind of scruples and in order to supplement his expensive tastes, he became a spy for a foreign power.

There were no political principles involved, nor did he feel any sense of loyalty for the country on whose behalf he obtained classified information. His actions and objectives were based purely on financial gain. Worse yet, he allowed an unfortunate fellow officer to take the blame and punishment for his treachery!

On a certain night at the outset of 1894, a French scrub woman, employed at the German Embassy in Paris, happened on a screwed up, discarded document in a waste paper basket. Her suspicions were aroused on noticing the papers were in French and she decided they were of some consequence. Whereupon, she smuggled them out of the embassy and delivered them to the French authorities. The papers in question, proved to be blueprints of the latest French howitzer gun.

With respect to scrub women, it is hard to conceive, how an uneducated cleaning woman of the 1890's (and she certainly would have been uneducated) would have recognized the difference between a blueprint and the embassy staff's laundry list. The story of a patriotic scrub woman makes for romantic reading, but a more plausible explanation is expounded by historians. The lady concerned was in actuality, a French counter-espionage agent, planted in the German Embassy.

Why the blueprints involved were not destroyed, instead of being junked in such a careless and lackadaisical fashion, defies explanation. One can be sure some hapless embassy official or clerk, suffered dearly for this blatant stupidity!

The French authorities immediately embarked on an investigation in an effort to unearth the espionage agent within their very bosom. These investigations wound up on the doorstep of the staff officers of Esterhazy's regiment.

For some inexplicable reason, no suspicion was cast in Esterhazy's direction, despite the fact, at the height of the investigations, he chose to resign his commission and leave for England! Instead, total suspicion fell on another staff officer, 35 year old, Captain Alfred Dreyfus. Apart from the glaring obvious Esterhazy, Dreyfus was, at the outset at least, a logical candidate.

Captain Dreyfus's character and military record were exemplary, and he was an expert artilleryman. Despite this, he did not fit one's conception of a

professional soldier. He was withdrawn and kept himself aloof from his comrades, to the point of being unfriendly. He seldom associated with his fellow officers and rarely dined at the officer's mess. Rather than accompany them to the super clubs and bawdy night spots of the gay 90's Paris, he would much prefer to spend his evenings at home with his wife and family.

Dreyfus was not a popular man, mostly on account of his obvious reluctance to socialize with his colleagues, also perhaps, because he was an independently wealthy man and this may well have provided for some envy among the less financially fortunate officers.

It is understandable why the question was often posed, why did Dreyfus, a wealthy man, choose the life of a soldier? True, the army officer of yesteryear enjoyed many benefits, but the benefits of a "well to do" businessman, surely outweighs those of an officer and without the harsh discipline, regulations and restrictions, plus the fact, one was always subordinate to somebody!

Once the case became public knowledge, there were those who claimed, Dreyfus had been planted in the French army many years previously, for the express purpose of spying for Germany and he was in reality, a professional agent. This proved to be untrue, but one could be forgiven for concluding otherwise.

Dreyfus was part owner, along with his brother, of a long established and highly lucrative family business. The company's head offices were in Germany and in the course of business, Dreyfus made numerous trips to that country. His brother ran the German side of the operation and in fact, was a German citizen. It is hardly surprising, none of these circumstances went in Dreyfus's favour.

Dreyfus proclaimed his innocence from the outset, but the French were still smarting from their defeat in the Franco-Prussian War, some twenty years previously and an example had to be made!

It is easy to see how his civilian enterprise placed him in the dock as a likely suspect and it must be said, he would have found himself in this situation irrespective of his religious affliction, but it is equally certain, the trial would have been conducted differently with a possibly different outcome had Dreyfus not been Jewish!

Dreyfus was a modern emancipated Jew, but unlike many of his young co-religionists of the 19th century, he did not convert, nor was he a total assimulator and he married in the faith. However, it is clear he would have preferred not to have been Jewish. his real religion was the army.

As the trial was set in motion, anti-semitism crawled out of the shadows and any chance of a fair hearing was dashed to smithereens.

The right wing political parties, together with the powerful Roman Catholic Church and the military, began to attack Dreyfus for his Judaism, as much as for his suspected espionage activities. In fact, French Judaism was put on trial!

The Jesuits and the anti-semitic press, conducted a smear campaign against Dreyfus and his co-religionists. In the forefront was the anti-Jewish periodical, *Psst ...* and amongst its many cartoons and articles, issued a vile front page cartoon, depicting a stereotyped looking Jew, selling off the French tri-colour at an auction.

The dynamic French novelist, Emile Zola, came to the defense of Dreyfus with his famous newspaper article headlined "I accuse". Jewish groups and the socialist party rallied round Zola, but they could not defeat the influential forces of reaction.

After a sham of a court martial, Dreyfus was found guilty and sentenced to be transported to the notorious French penal colony, Devil's Island! He also

had to suffer the utter humiliation of being drummed out of the army.

"Drumming out", is a particularly nasty practise used by most European armies and was common in the 19th century (it has also been used this century). The unfortunate disgraced officer appears before his regiment, a fellow officer tears off the victim's rank insignia, decorations and buttons and his sword is broken in half. The former officer is then marched out of the barrack gates under escort, followed by a drummer.

The wealthy Dreyfus family tried everything in their power to obtain a retrial and hired the best lawyers, but to no avail. Dreyfus was to linger on the fever infested colony for ten years.

Meantime, Zola and others kept up their campaign for a new trial, but the High Command of the army would not waver. Many of the General Staff honestly felt Dreyfus to be guilty, still others, in retrospect, were beginning to have doubts as to that guilt, but were not in favour of reopening the case. To do so, would be to admit the army may have committed an injustice and the army was paramount!

In the end, Zola and his allies moved the conscience of the nation. There was a public outcry and the government ordered a new trial. Zola served as Dreyfus's advocate and the latter was found "not guilty"!

Dreyfus was reunited with his family and returned to his regiment with Captain's rank and no loss of seniority. During the 1914/18 War, he served on the French General Staff. He died in 1935 at 76 years of age. (One cannot help but wonder, what kind of man he was, that could forgive the army after they had abused him so?)

During the new trial, the French authorities contacted Esterhazy and requested he attend. Esterhazy refused to leave England and was to remain there for the rest of his life. We know little about Major Esterhazy, the real culprit and main actor in the drama, since Dreyfus and Zola, jointly, took over centre stage (which would hardly have bothered Esterhazy to any degree).

There are those who would suggest, Esterhazy had friends in high places who tipped off when the howitzer blueprints were first unearthed. It is hard to imagine, how a fellow who could hardly meet his mess bills, could cultivate such friends (unless of course, they were also spies). Others say, the German Embassy alerted him. If either of these circumstances be true, why on earth did he court danger and discovery by hanging around whilst the investigation was in progress to officially resign his commission? Why didn't he quietly steal away on the first available night ferry steamer for Dover?

In referring to the "Dreyfus Affair" the American (Jewish) writer, Howard Fast, said, "if anything good came out of it, it was the fact, it forged Jewish solidarity and proved a vital force for French socialism!"

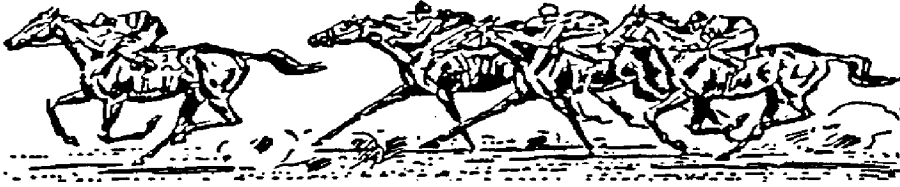

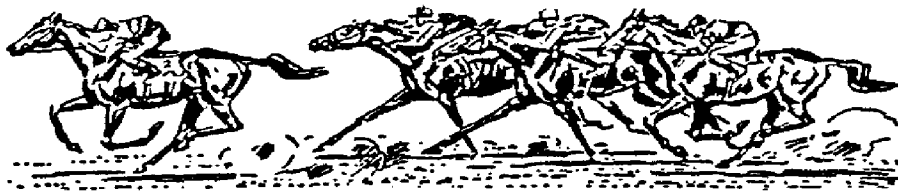
