WHERE IS EVERYBODY? - Part III (From Bushwacker - July 1985)

The July 1985 ANALOG contains an article on 23 possible reasons why we have not yet detected any intelligent life in our part of the Galaxy. These include everything from the physical makeup of the galaxy to the psychology of alien races and "berserkers." These are neatly compiled into a chart, which is herewith reproduced. The categories at the bottom are some of those used in the famous "Drake Formula" for calculating the number of technological civilizations currently existing in our Galaxy. To these have been added "v," expansion velocity of colonies with interstellar travel; and "A," the approach-avoidance factor of ET's toward us. The chart indicates how each possibility affects each factor in the Drake equation.

The article tries to explain how the combinations of all of these various difficulties probably reduces the number of other intelligent races in the Galaxy to a very low number. Two points not raised in the article, but of utmost importance, are: 1. There is too much radiation in the nucleus of the Galaxy for life as we know it to form. (This probably applies to star clusters as well, or any other place where the stars are closely packed). 2. The uniqueness of the Earth-Moon relationship. Without the tides raised by our satellite, life might never have left the oceans. Nor would there have been the eclipses which so startled ancient man and caused him to pay attention to the skies. Item one probably eliminates at least 80% of the stars in the Milky Way in one fell swoop. Any Galactic Empires will exist out here on the rim, not in the center.

The article concludes with one optimistic note; that intelligent life similar to our porpoises and whales may exist on "water worlds," where there isn't enough land to encourage them to crawl out of the sea and develop fire and machines. However, the author seems to not realize that the ancestors of whales and porpoises lived on land, and only returned to the sea after their brains had developed.

The conclusion seems to be that we must think the unthinkable, that we are the first, destined to be the Elder Race of our Galaxy. This sounds terribly egocentric, almost on a par with Ptolemaic astronomy or the idea that we lived in the center of the galaxy. However, it appears that we are going to have to at least think about this possibility. In which case, it behooves us more than ever to make sure that life on Mudball III doesn't get wiped out by some petty quarrel over which retarded child owns which marbles.

Germany-SS&S: "Build, build, build", eh? Thanks for the advice - I almost decided to play two short, but you convinced me otherwise.

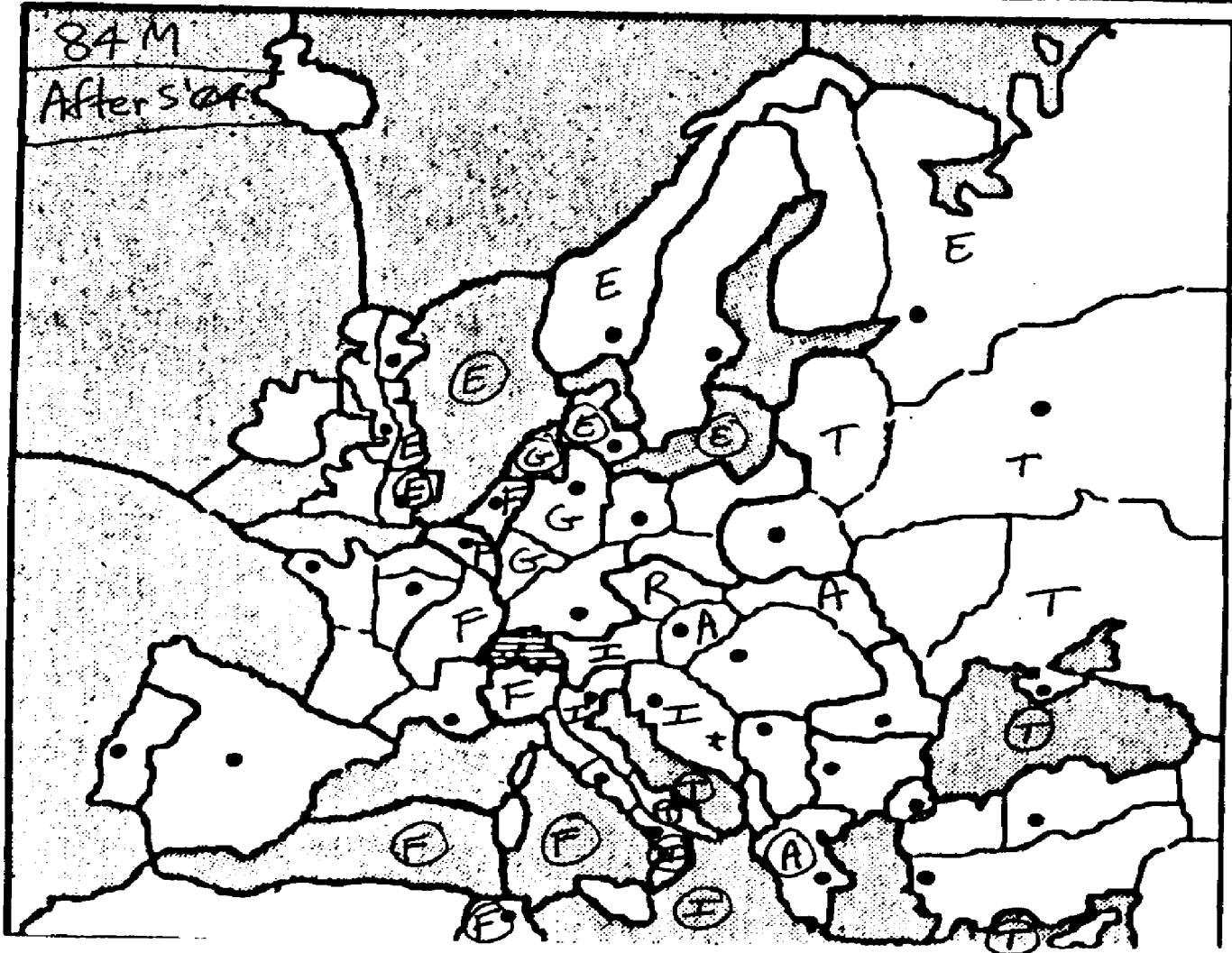
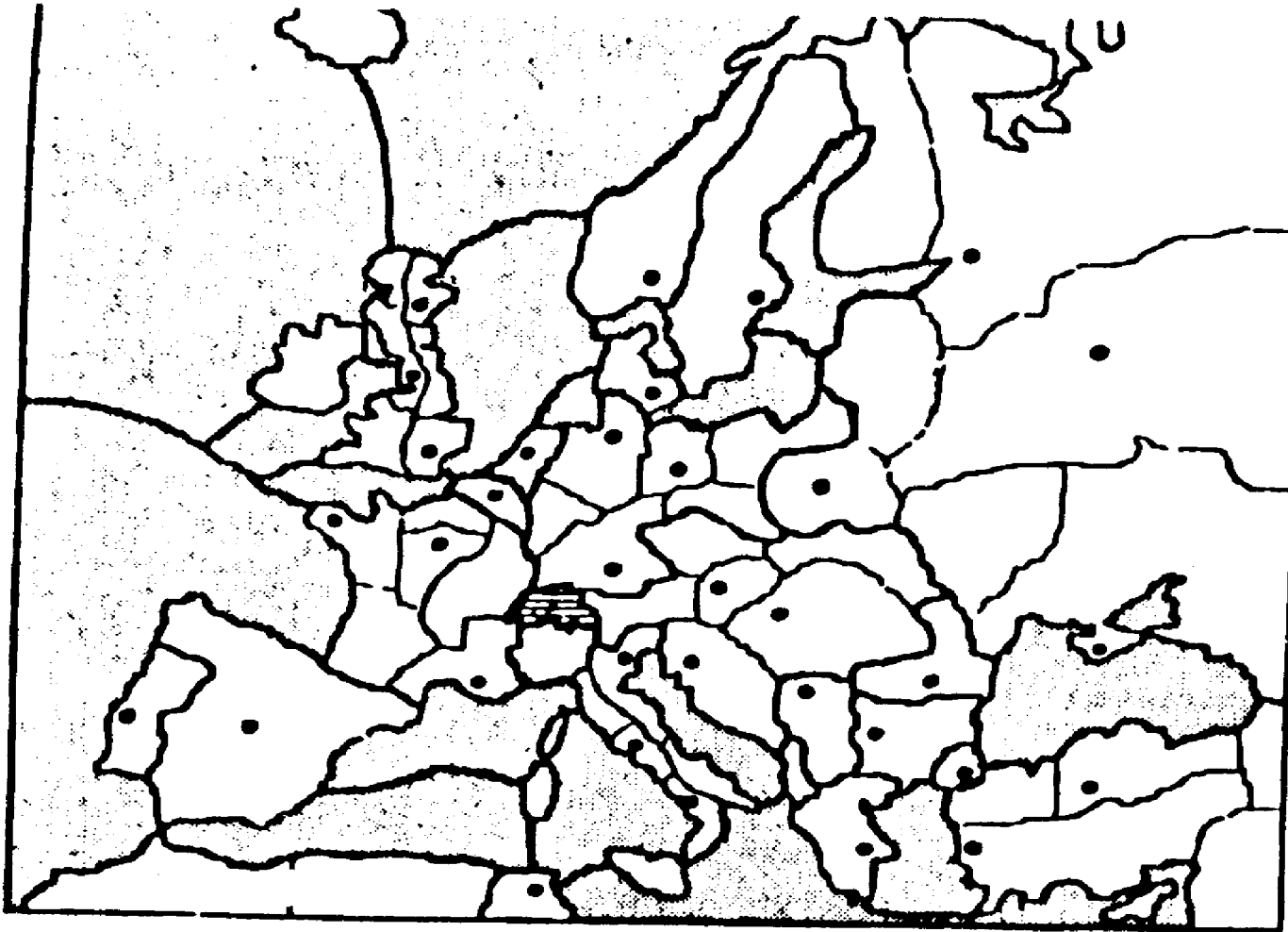

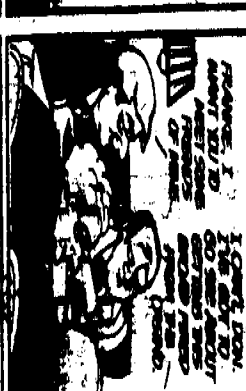
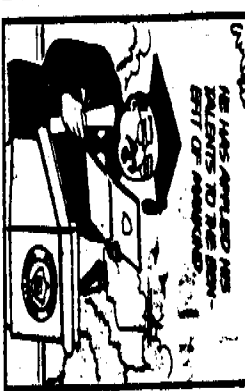
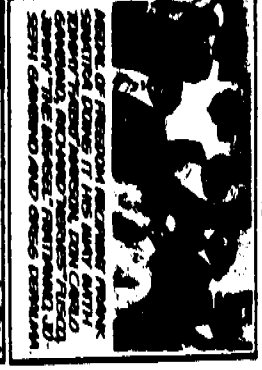
CHART OF POSSIBILITIES

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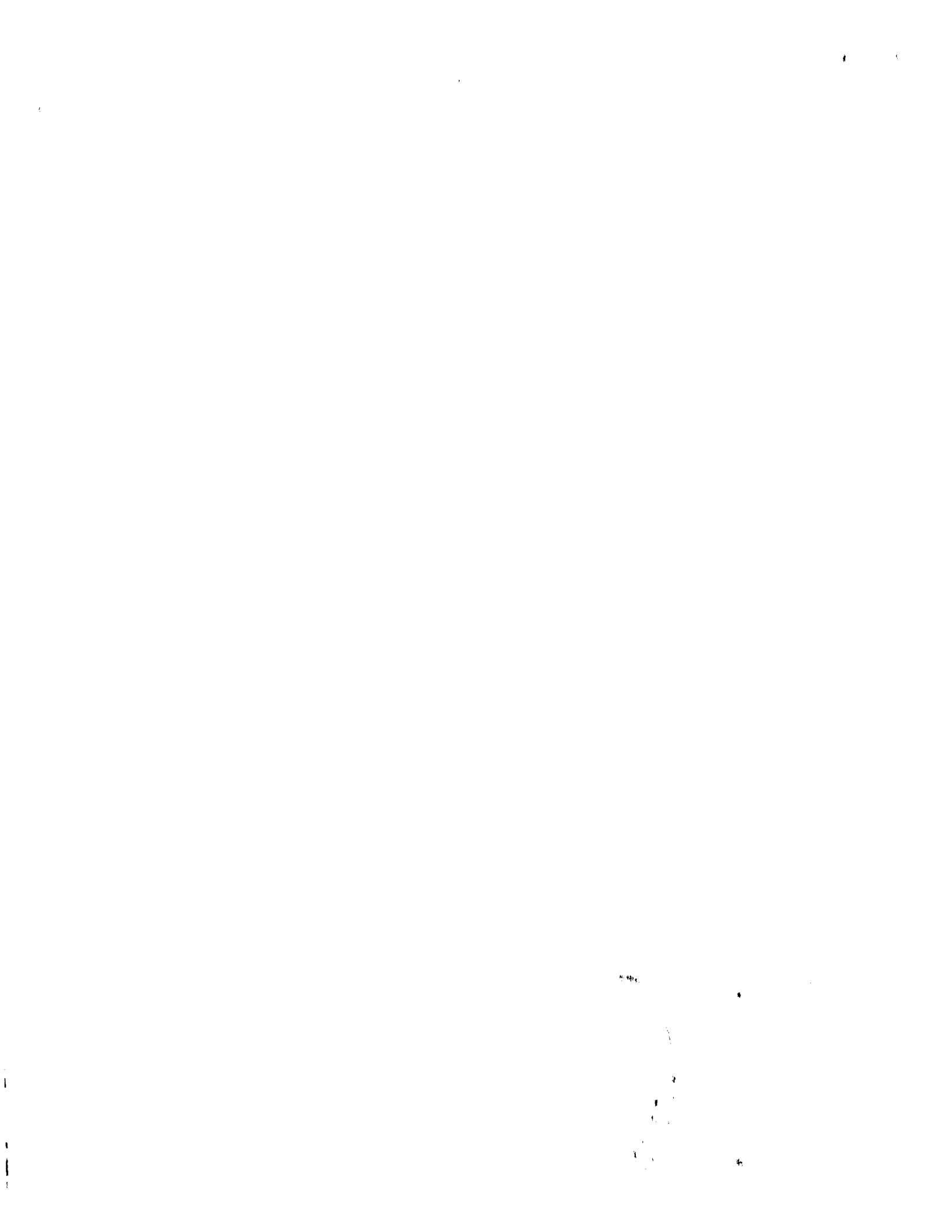
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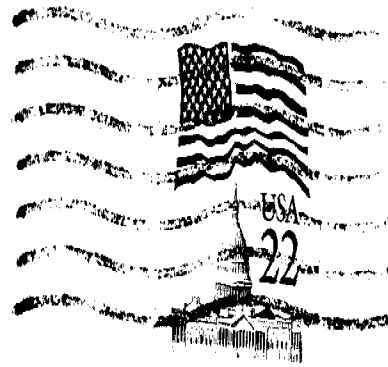
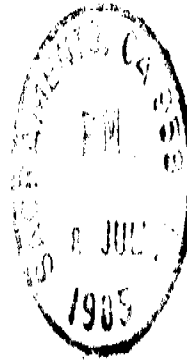
