CONSTANTINOPLE (Sept. 2, 1901): The Sultan was reported "horrified" by the news that the peacefull people of Galacia had been enslaved by the Slavic Imperialists. In a speech before the Supreme Council, the Earthly Representative of Allah stated that full support shall be "extedned to our stalwart allies, the Austrian people." A Declaration of War against the Czarist aggressors was approved unanimously.

TSK-TSK DEPT: Two players have missed moves this turn. So, in accordance with the Rules, Jim Goldman is requested to send in postcard announcing his willingness to play Russia (as determined by a flip of the coin).
