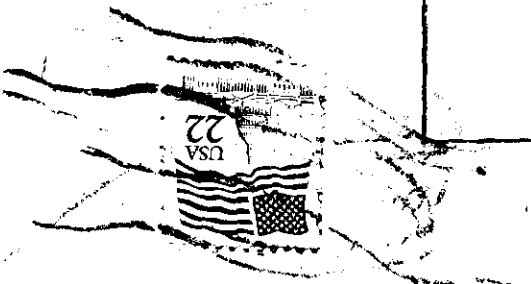

HANSARD

Houserules for games in Hansard

General

The publisher is the final judge of all questions and reserves the right to be arbitrary on questions of misconduct.

Preference lists will be used when provided.

Except where provided for in the houserules for a particular game (e.g., Parlement), if you miss your moves, the gamemaster will not call collect to get them.

Under extraordinary circumstances, such as postal strikes, or 2/5 of the players in a game missing moves, the gamemaster may delay a game.

Pax Britannica

Orders are submitted for the Movement/Status Change Phase. In the event that Negotiation, Congress of Europe, or War requires player action, the players involved will receive reports and submit orders twice a month (with an additional postage charge for the midmonth reports). The gamemaster will handle all dice-rolling, and make War Phase moves for the Ottoman Empire and minor powers when they are without allies.

The British player may submit set-up orders for the Canadian fleet during his first move; otherwise it will be set-up on the North Atlantic coast.

It is possible for Chinese Armies to remain in existence and for enemy Units to remain in Formosa. The Chinese Armies cannot move through the North or South China Seas to fight the enemy Units in Formosa. In such a case, the Chinese Rebellion can be ended during any War End Determination Phase upon demand of the Chinese enemies. They retain Status markers in Formosa; markers in the Chinese Empire and the other Vassal Areas are removed. All Chinese Armies are removed from the map, and the Chinese Resentment Index is reduced to zero, and then adjusted if Formosa is newly ceded.

After a minor power fights (and wins) a war, fleets may remain in the areas they began.

On the map, Cape Horn and Cape of Good Hope have been mislabeled. Cape Horn is just below South America; Cape of Good Hope is just below Africa.

When Japan is a minor power, set it up with a second Merchant Fleet in the South China Sea.

Orders are conditional on the availability of funds, units, and markers. Orders will be carried out in the sequence specified. Orders may be made conditional on the actions of other players, but if conditional orders involve infinite moves they will be arbitrarily terminated.

If both (2-4) German Navy League Agitation and (2-5) German Colonial Agitation occur in the same game turn, Colonial Office income is quadrupled.

Money is not retained in the Treasury from game turn to game turn.

The only way a minor power gains units is when it garrisons possessions and there are no available units on the map. Other powers garrison possessions conquered during war during the next friendly movement phase.

Status markers removed or downgraded during Congress of Europe do increase tensions.

During forced expenditures ((1-2) Conservative Victory in Britain, (2-2) American "Yellow Press" Journalism, (2-3) French Anti-German Agitation, (2-4) German Navy League Agitation, (2-6) Pan-Slav Agitation in Russia, (3-1) Italian Irredentist Agitation, and (4-1) Japanese War Party Gains Prestige), if there is insufficient income, the priority is maintain appropriate units, maintain holdings, build new units.

During Congress of Europe, a codominion may be granted in a disputed area free of cost.

Events (1-4) Serbia Defies Austria-Hungary, (2-1) War in South America, and (3-6) Boer Oppression of Uitlanders allow the respective powers to purchase control markers, move in armies, and engage in Colonial Combat.

If both (1-5) Upheaval in Russia and (2-6) Pan-Slav Agitation occur in the same game turn, the Russian player has forced expenditure even though he has no Colonial Office income.

If a minor power loses an Influence or control due to unrest, great powers can intervene on later turns. If a minor power places a control marker, great powers may not intervene to place Influence or control markers on the same turn. If two minor powers are active in the same area, they will establish a codominion if possible.

The free grant of codominion status during a Congress of Europe does not require the consent of all the powers with influence in the area, but does not end the casus belli without those consents.

When a half-exchange is rolled and both powers have the same strength, the defender is treated as the smaller force.

I have 4 positions to fill, maybe. I say maybe because there are quasi-incumbents in 3 positions, and the 4th is a vacant deputyship to a position which is quite controversial. The positions are:

MILLER NUMBER CUSTODIAN UNDER THE COVENANT
DIRECTOR OF ORPHAN GAMES
EDITOR, THE 1987 NYGB/KGO/OGP ZINE DIRECTORY
DEPUTY REGISTRAR OF PROJECTS

All the positions require ethical stature, judgement, competence, and rapid response to business.

"Karel Alaric", the incumbent MNC under the Covenant, has informed me that he will only serve 1 year, and if I want the position I can have it; as a past MNC, I really don't need those headaches again. The variant banks maintain their own pretend custodian; if he was willing to abide by the Covenant he would be the preferred candidate. The MNC assigns Miller Numbers, determines the Miller Number designators, and serves as an advocate for the variant hobby; he has to maintain the independence of his office, principally from Diplomacy World and the variant banks. (I am conducting this search as the Associate MNC, with his consent and approval.)

James Burgess, who I thought was Director of Orphan Games, has been conducting his office under the title of the "US Orphan Service" which was abolished by merger a number of years ago. Recently he has abandoned the guidelines of the Orphan Games Project, which require that a game be a bona fide orphan to be placed, and publicly suggested that NYGB funds for support of the OGP be diverted to a prohibited purpose: the NAVB's pretend custodian. Fundamentally, he does not admit he is Director of Orphan Games under the guidelines. The Director determines whether games have been orphaned, and places orphaned games with new gamemasters and/or publishers. Burgess is the preferred candidate, followed by almost any of the past Directors; if necessary I will do the job myself. (I am conducting this search as the Chairman of the Orphan Games Project.)

Simon Billenness of the Zine Register was franchised to conduct it as the 1986 NYGB/KGO/OGP Zine Directory. He thereupon snubbed all three sponsors, obtained a subsidy from the NYGB, obtained a franchise from Diplomacy World to run projects in competition with KGO and share expenses which is prohibited: NYGB funds cannot be applied to Diplomacy World projects. The appointment is for a year at a time. The Editor gathers voluntary information and prepares the Zine Directory at least twice a year, and provides gathered information to the OGP. The incumbent would be the preferred candidate if he wasn't pushing for an irremedial breach; if necessary I will do the job again. (I am conducting this search as Registrar of Known Game Openings.)

The Registrar of Projects advises the New York Game Board (a funding agency) and other interested parties as to bona fide hobby projects and their holders, and maintains a registry of office holders and charters. The Deputy is a designated successor, handles cases the Registrar is a party to, and provides advice on policy and new projects at the request of the Registrar and the NYGB. (I am conducting this search as Registrar of Projects.)
